ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

MARY McELROY



U.S. Naval Academy, 1987
Georgia Institute of Technology, 2000
Third Year at Georgia State



Hired in July of 2005 by President Carl Patton, Mary McElroy is leading the Panther program to unprecedented heights in every area by transforming the department, guiding the University in its move to the Colonial Athletic Association, and perhaps most importantly, raising the expectations for Georgia State athletics.

Now in her third year as Director of Athletics, Mary McElroy has brought tremendous optimism, organization and leadership as well as a tireless work ethic to Georgia State University athletics.

Hired in July of 2005 by President Carl Patton, McElroy is leading the Panther program to unprecedented heights in every area by transforming the department, guiding the University in its move to the Colonial Athletic Association, and perhaps most importantly, raising the expectations for Georgia State athletics.

Her accomplishments in just two short years include dramatic increases in athletics fundraising, the hiring of former National Coach of the Year Rod Barnes as men's basketball coach, the completion of a feasibility study for the addition of football and the subsequent launch of a fundraising campaign for the sport, numerous facilities upgrades, strong academic performance by Panther student-athletes, and a smooth transition to the higher level of competition in the CAA.

The former Marine Corps Captain, 1987 graduate of the Naval Academy and 2000 graduate of Georgia Tech's MBA program has been recognized by her peers. In August 2006, the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators (NACWAA) named McElroy as the NCAA Division I-AAA Administrator of the Year.

McElroy's vision for Georgia State to be "the student-athlete's first choice" is being realized as the program grows in stature within the CAA and on the national level.

Building the Program

McElroy has reshaped and re-energized the athletic department and now has it poised for progress and consistent achievements. One of her first major accomplishments was to develop and implement the Strategic Plan that established the athletic department's vision and defined the pathways to those objectives.

McElroy further mandated the development of the department's Policies and Procedures Manual, which outlines operational procedures to keep the department functioning efficiently. Every unit within the department knows its methods to carry out the plan. Every team within the program understands what is expected and has a plan to meet the intended goals. Every student-athlete understands the expectations and support systems available to achieve success.

Her first year saw record development for financial support. Just under one million dollars was raised and earmarked for scholarship endowments, while support was maintained for the operating budget that increased due to broader travel requirements in the CAA. Under McElroy's leadership, the department added assistant coaches and support staff to better serve the student-athletes.

McElroy has created new revenue streams with a new partnership with ISP Sports that immediately resulted in a 200 percent increase in sponsorship revenues. She also inked a department-wide apparel

agreement with adidas. A new partnership with XOS Technologies, Inc. has enhanced the athletics' department website and improved the services provided to Georgia State fans.

As evidence of her high expectations for the future of Georgia State athletics, McElroy lured Barnes, the 2001 Naismith National Coach of the Year, to Atlanta to rebuild the Georgia State basketball program.

While improving every existing sports program, McElroy has also focused on the potential addition of a Division I football program for Georgia State.



ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

In response to a directive from President Patton and as a result of interest expressed by alumni, staff and students, a feasibility study was completed in 2006 to effectively gauge the interest and financial obligations of adding football. An unprecedented fundraising campaign is now underway as Georgia State football moves closer to becoming a reality.

Growing Facilities

Nowhere has McElroy's vision been more evident than in Georgia State's growing and improving facilities as she seeks to provide first-class venues that will benefit student-athletes and fans alike.

A two-year, \$5-million plan for the development of the Panthersville Athletics Complex is nearing completion and will ultimately result in a new soccer venue, tennis courts and locker room facilities. Phase I was completed in Fall 2006 and Phase II will be complete in 2008. Upgrades are ongoing for the softball and baseball facilities already located at Panthersville, which will become the home for all of Georgia State's outdoor athletic teams except track and field.

At the Georgia State Sports Arena, a videoboard has been added, along with numerous other amenities and a renewed emphasis on customer service to enhance the gameday experience for Panther fans.

Academics Always First

Working within the framework of NCAA guidelines, Georgia State student-athletes are challenged to excel in the classroom and are provided with a support system to meet the challenges of balancing academics and athletics.

The Panthers have responded with their highest cumulative grade point average ever. The student-athlete population, which numbers nearly 250, achieved a grade point average of 2.87 for the Spring 2007 semester to boost its combined cumulative mark to 2.93. Both figures exceed the corresponding marks for the overall student body.

Under the Academic Progress Rate established by the NCAA, Georgia State has had no teams penalized, two teams with perfect scores, and four teams with APR scores in the top 10 percent in the nation. Eight teams had scores higher than the Division I average in their respective sport for 2005-06.

On the field of competition, the stu-

dent-athletes have responded against the tougher level of play as well, achieving solid winning percentages across the 16 teams. Athletics highlights in the first two years include CAA team titles in men's and women's golf, and men's tennis.

Previously Worked At Navy, Georgia Tech

McElroy's athletic management career began in 1992 where she worked her way up to assistant athletic director at the Naval Academy. She was Senior Woman Administrator and oversaw compliance for 29 sports. She also served a stint as Director of Alumni Services at Navy.

From June 1999, until her appointment at Georgia State, McElroy served on the athletic management team at Georgia Tech. After first serving as Director of Compliance, she left Georgia Tech as Senior Associate Director of Athletics and Senior Woman Administrator. She was the primary administrator for men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis and softball, while overseeing the compliance staff, supervising game operations for basketball and assisting with football game management.

McElroy was appointed to the NCAA Management Council in April 2005, and was a member of the NCAA Volleyball Committee. For the Atlantic Coast Conference, McElroy served on several committees, including the Softball Committee, of which she was the chair, as well as the Women's Basketball Committee, the Head Trainer's Committee, the Senior Woman Administrators' Committee, and an Ad Hoc Committee on student-athlete welfare.

As a member of the CAA, McElroy was reappointed to the NCAA Management Council in October 2006 and was elected in to serve on the Board of Directors for the NACWAA, also in October 2006. She chairs the CAA Awards Committee and serves on the CAA Executive Committee.

McElroy has been called upon to be a guest speaker at various events, including the Mercer University Adult Education program, the NCAA Institute for Ethnic Minority Females, the Atlanta Sports Hall of Fame, the NCAA Gender Equity and Issues Forum, and most recently, the 2007 convention of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA).


When the NCAA Women's Final Four was played in Atlanta in 2003, McElroy played a key role in planning and staging the event as the tournament manager. She was also on the Atlanta Local Organizing Committee for the NCAA Men's Final Four in Atlanta in 2002 and again in 2007.

As a student at the Naval Academy, McElroy played varsity basketball in the Colonial Athletic Association. She was a captain of the club softball team and now stays active athletically in local softball leagues.

A native of Great Mills, Md., she is married to a fellow Naval Academy graduate, Terry ('86), and they have two sons, Darrin (17) and Austin (13).

With his expertise as an academic leader and urban planner, Carl Patton has helped Georgia State become a vital part of the downtown Atlanta community.

Carl Patton became president of Georgia State University on July 1, 1992. With more than 27,000 students in 2007-08, Georgia State is one of the nation's largest urban research universities.

With his expertise as an academic leader and urban planner, Patton has helped Georgia State become a vital part of the downtown Atlanta community. He launched a university-wide planning effort that produced the Main Street Master Plan. With phase one of the plan complete and the \$1-billion phase two underway, this innovative strategy continues to increase the university's footprint in the downtown community and shape the university's future growth. Key components of the plan include:

- Establishing a campus identity based on a central campus corridor
- Investing in key research areas to advance knowledge and discovery
- Increasing the university's involvement with the downtown community
- Securing private funding sources to supplement state allocations for building projects

Patton's focus on recruitment of world-class faculty, strengthened academic programs and improved campus infrastructure continues to increase recognition for Georgia State through national rankings, peer journals and media reports.

"The spirit of innovation thrives at Georgia State," says Patton. "Through teaching, research, scholarly activities, and service, Georgia State is a source of limitless potential for individual development and the improvement of our society."


The list of renovations and new construction completed since his appointment includes the Rialto Center for the Arts, Haas-Howell and Standard Buildings, J. Mack Robinson College of Business in the former C&S bank headquarters, the Bennett A. Brown Commerce Building, North Metro Center, Helen M. Aderhold Learning Center, Student Center, Student Recreation Center, the former Wachovia Bank Building that houses the Andrew Young School of Policy Studies, the 450-bed University Lofts, and the 2,000-bed University Commons that opened in August 2007. On the horizon are a new University Science Park, more student housing, a new Business and Law Professional Center and a new Humanities Building.

Patton is a graduate of the University of Cincinnati with a bachelor of science degree in community planning. He also holds doctoral and master's degrees in public policy from the University of California at Berkeley as well as master's degrees in urban planning and public administration from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Before coming to Georgia State, Patton previously served as Vice

President for academic affairs at the University of Toledo, and he held faculty and administrative positions at the University of Illinois and the University of Wisconsin.

Patton serves on the boards of many organizations dedicated to strengthening the downtown community. He and his wife, Gretchen, live in a downtown loft within walking distance of his campus office. They have two children and three grandchildren.

Georgia State's Dec. 5 home game against Georgia Tech will be nationally televised on ESPNU, and the Panthers will also appear on regional television at least six times during the 2007-08 season.

The Georgia State-Georgia Tech game will tip off at 9 p.m. at the Sports Arena on the Georgia State campus.

In addition to the ESPN exposure, Georgia State will also appear on regional television through the Colonial Athletic Association package, including the Panthers' games against VCU, Delaware, Old Dominion, Hofstra, and UNC Wilmington, which will air in the Atlanta area on Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS) as well as in markets throughout the CAA region. COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

From all-star athletes to Nobel Prize winning faculty, the CAA takes great pride in producing performers who stand out both on the playing field and in the classroom.

Coming off another record-setting season, the Colonial Athletic Association continues to enhance its reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences.

With a geographic footprint stretching from Boston to Atlanta, the CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 11 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Even more impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 21 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2006-07, the CAA had six *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-Americans and more than 1,600 of our 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (5), Washington, D.C. (8), Atlanta (9) and Baltimore (23). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 19 million.

The CAA sponsors 22 sports with the addition of a 12-team football league in 2007. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2006-07, a league-record 29 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with four teams advancing to post-season play for the past three years. Conference champion VCU pulled the most noted upset of the NCAA first round last season with its 79-77 victory over Duke, and Old Dominion became the second CAA team in as many years to receive an NCAA at-large bid. Hofstra returned to the NIT for the third straight season and Drexel made its fourth NIT appearance in the last five years.

In 2006, George Mason became the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, knocking off powerhouses Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut. The Patriots were ranked No. 8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, the highest ever for a CAA team.

In women's basketball, the CAA had three teams earn NCAA Tournament berths for the first time and four squads advanced to post-season play for the second straight year. Perennial power Old Dominion has captured three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and was national runner-up in 1997.

The conference also excels in many other sports. Delaware became the first CAA team to reach the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship in 2007. A league-record four men's soccer teams earned NCAA berths in 2006, with two advancing to the round of 16. Four teams also represented the conference in the NCAA Men's Tennis Championship, and William & Mary reached the round of 16 in women's tennis. CAA squads have won 10 field hockey national titles, the most of any Division I conference. In baseball, the league

had 17 players chosen in the 2007 Major League Baseball draft. There were 37 CAA student-athletes who received All-America honors.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 to expand their partnership to all aspects of university life. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason University, James Madison University, and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Charter members George Mason, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and William and Mary were joined by Old Dominion University in 1991 and by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.
