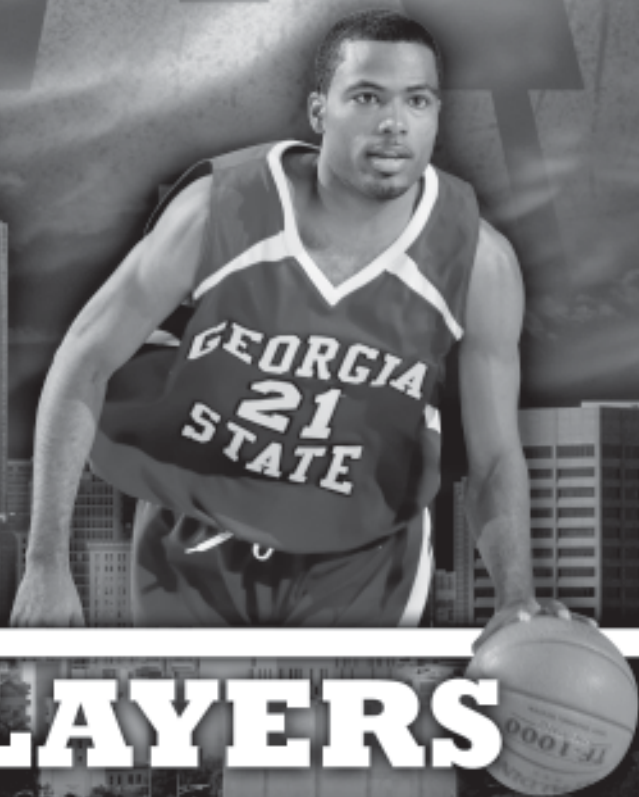

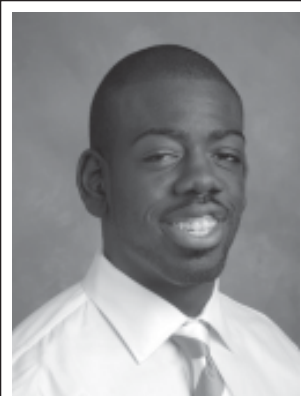

### AT GEORGIA STATE:

Big man who has started 25 games in his first three seasons . . . Good rebounder and defender who is improving offensively . . . Can run the floor and be very active defensively . . . Will also be looked upon for leadership.

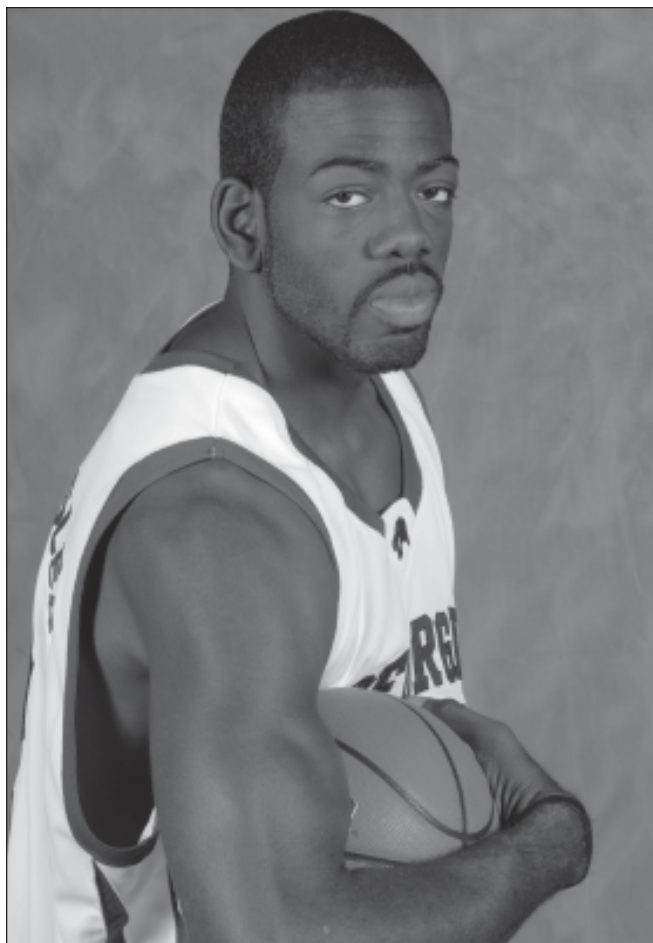
Has played in 74 games in three years, averaging 4.1 points and 2.2 rebounds in 15.1 minutes per game . . . Also has 31 blocked shots . . . Career field goal percentage of 48.6 percent (126-for-259) . . . Has nine double-figure scoring games and one double-figure rebounding effort in his career . . . Most productive season was his sophomore year, when he averaged 7.6 points and 2.5 rebounds.

### 2006-07:

Played in 19 games with three starts, averaging 12.1 minutes per game . . . Averaged 2.3 points and 2.5 rebounds per game . . . Added 13 assists, six steals and three blocked shots.

Missed the first 10 games of the season before becoming eligible for the Dec. 20 game at Iowa . . . Season ended prematurely after he broke a finger in practice prior to the CAA Tournament . . . Just before the injury, had a five-game stretch in which he averaged 4.8 points and 3.8 rebounds.

Season highlight was career-best 12 rebounds, including seven on the offensive glass, in the ESPN BracketBuster win over Elon . . . Saw his first action of the season at Iowa and scored his season-high of seven points . . . Had six rebounds and three assists in overtime win over UNC Wilmington, when he made one of his three starts . . . Season high for minutes was 30 in the win over Northeastern, when he contributed four points, six rebounds, two assists and a steal.

## PLAYER PROFILES

### 2005-06:

Started 22 of 29 games at center in Georgia State's first season in the CAA . . . Averaged 7.6 points and 2.9 rebounds per game . . . Led the team in field goal percentage (.529 on 90-of-170), was second in blocked shots (21), and fifth in scoring and rebounding.

Made his first career start in the season opener against Delaware, also the first CAA game in school history, and scored 16 points on 8-for-13 shooting while contributing four rebounds and three blocked shots . . . That remains his career best against CAA opponents and the second-best scoring output of his career . . . Had his career-high with 19 points in win over Savannah State, when he connected on 8-of-13 field goals and 5-of-6 free throws . . . Scored 14 points on three occasions, against non-league foes Charlotte (7-for-9 FG), Charleston (6-for-6 FG) and Alabama State . . . Added 13 points at Hofstra (5-of-8 FG).

Made better than 50 percent of his shots in 15 games . . . Had six games with five or more rebounds, including a season-best seven at Hofstra . . . Contributed 10 points and five rebounds in at James Madison and 14 points and five rebounds at Northeastern . . . Career-high four blocked shots at Alabama State, as well as three rejections against both Delaware and Hofstra . . . Blocked two shots in the CAA Tournament game against Final Four team George Mason.

### 2004-05:

As a freshman, saw action in 26 of the 29 games . . . Averaged 1.6 points and 1.3 rebounds . . . Also dished out 12 assists, blocked seven shots, and made four steals . . . Shot 50 percent from the field on the season

Recorded the first double-figure game of his college career with a 10-point day vs. conference rival Campbell . . . Scored eight points at Florida Atlantic and seven points at Troy . . . Top rebounding games were six boards vs. Lipscomb, five vs. Troy and four vs. Campbell . . . Had two blocked shots in games vs. Campbell and Florida Atlantic . . . Played a season-high 27 minutes against Troy, along with 26 minutes vs. Lipscomb and 22 vs. Florida Atlantic.

Gained experience by playing against five teams that went on to make the NCAA Tournament field (Kentucky, Texas Tech, Louisiana-Lafayette, Charlotte and Nevada) . . . Scored the first points of his college career against Kentucky at Rupp Arena on Nov. 26, 2004.

Named to the Atlantic Sun Conference All-Academic team for his excellence in the classroom.

All-region and all-state honorable mention in Class AAAA . . . Selected for the South squad in the Georgia North-South All-Star game . . . Averaged 19 points, 11 rebounds and five blocked shots per game for the 22-7 Lithia Springs team coached by Jason Slate, helping his team reach the state playoffs . . . Averaged 17 points and 10 rebounds as a junior . . . "Around the Peach" by Adidas listed him as No. 15 on the list of the Top 25 seniors in the state of Georgia and HoopScoopOnline.com rated him No. 26 overall in the state at any position.

Top high school scoring games were a 34-point night vs. Hiram as a junior and 29 points as a senior against Forest Park . . . Produced a unique triple-double game as a junior with 25 points, 14 rebounds and 11 blocks vs. rival Douglas County . . . Scored more than half of his team's total with a 23-point effort

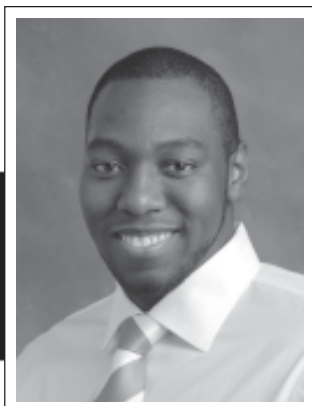
### PERSONAL:

### AT GEORGIA STATE:

Post player who is one of just three players in school history with 100 or more blocked shots in his career . . . Enters his senior season with 101 blocks, trailing only Zavian Smith (128) and Nate Williams (113) in the Panthers' record book . . . Recorded two of the top four season totals in Georgia State the last two years . . . Panthers' tallest player who must stay healthy after battling various injuries.

Lefthander who has averaged 4.6 points and 4.1 rebounds in 79 career games, including 35 starts . . . Also averaged 1.3 blocks per game . . . Career field goal percentage of .484 (154-318) . . . Has produced 10 double-figure scoring games in his career, as well as eight contests with nine or more rebounds, and 16 games with three or more blocked shots . . . Career highs of 20 points (Northeastern, 2005-06, Old Dominion, 2006-07), 13 rebounds (Hofstra, 2005-06) and five blocked shots (James Madison, 2005-06).

### 2006-07:

Started 15 games at center . . . Ranked fifth in the CAA with 1.68 blocked shots per game . . . Season total of 47 blocks is third-best in school history . . . Averaged 4.6 points and 4.1 rebounds per game . . . Shot 47.9 percent (58-121) from the field.

In CAA games, he averaged 5.7 points and 4.7 rebounds with 31 blocked shots in 17 league games.

Contributed four double-figure scoring games, highlighted by 20 points at William and Mary to equal his career best . . . Hit 8-of-10 field goals against the Tribe and also contributed seven rebounds.

Turned in two of his best performances late in the season against NCAA Tournament-participant VCU . . . Had 14 points, seven rebounds and three blocks while playing a season-high 36 minutes

in the regular-season finale against the Rams . . . Then finished the season a double-double against VCU in the CAA Tournament as he scored 13 points and pulled down 10 rebounds . . . Added 10 points in the first meeting with VCU to average 12.3 ppg against the Rams.

Also reached double figures with 10 points at Hofstra, then grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds against Hofstra at home . . . Season-best four blocked shots at George Mason and against Savannah State.

### 2005-06:

Averaged 6.3 points while leading the team in rebounds at 5.1 per game and blocked shots with 1.59 per game . . . Ranked fourth in the CAA in blocks and 18th in rebounds . . . Season total of 46 blocks was at the time the third best total in school history and now ranks fourth . . . Shot 48 percent from the field on the season (76-of-158) . . . Played in 29 games, starting 20 . . . Slowed by a knee injury early in the season.

Notched a double-double against Northeastern with a career-high 20 points and 12 rebounds . . . Added three blocks and connected on 10 of 15 attempts from the field while playing against one of the nation's leading shot blockers in Shawn James.

Also had a double-double against VCU with 11 points and 11 boards . . . Grabbed season-high 13 rebounds at Hofstra while grabbing nine against Towson . . . Added 10 points and nine rebounds against George Mason . . .

Career-high five blocked shots in win at James Madison . . . Swatted four against Louisiana Lafayette, Towson, and George Mason.

Scored 14 points against Delaware in his first college game, when he hit 7-of-10 shots, along with seven rebounds and two blocks

Finished strong at the CAA Tournament, played in his hometown of Richmond, Va. . . Chipped in 10 points, seven rebounds and four blocks in tournament-opening win over Towson . . . In the quarterfinals vs. eventual NCAA Final Four George Mason, contributed eight points (4-of-6 FG), seven rebounds three offensive), and four blocked shots before fouling out.

### 2004-05:

Earned All-Academic recognition from the A-Sun Conference . . . Played in 22 games off the bench, averaging nearly 10 minutes per game . . . Averaged 2.0 points and 2.1 rebounds while blocking eight shots . . . Shot better than 50 percent from the field, hitting 20 of 39 attempts (.513).

### HIGH SCHOOL:

Honorable mention all-state selection at Henrico High School . . . Capital District Player of the Year as well as first-team all-district and all-region . . . Also an all-academic honoree for his district and region.

Averaged 15 points, 13 rebounds and five blocks per game as a senior, helping his team to a 22-8 record.

Recorded a triple-double in his final high school game with 20 points, 19 rebounds and 10 blocks as his team fell, 73-72, on a last-second shot to No. 4 Huguenot in the Central Region tournament.

Reached double figures in rebounds every game in his senior season on the 22-8 team . . . Top scoring game was a 24-point night



against Atlee . . . Played one year at Highland Springs High and then final three years at Henrico.

Deven Jerel Dickerson was born August 8, 1986 in Richmond, Va., as the oldest son of Lonnie and Eunice Dickerson . . . Has a younger brother, Desmone . . . Both parents played college basketball . . . Lonnie Dickerson, 6-7, played at J.F. Kennedy High and Virginia Union . . . Mother, Eunice, who is 6-2, played at Buckingham High before earning All-CIAA honors at Virginia Union. . . . Majoring in economics at Georgia State. . . .
