Played in 80 total games in three seasons at GSU with 23 starting assignments...Has scored 372 points (4.7), grabbed 236 rebounds, made 71 steals along with 58 assists...Has scored in double figures in 13 games...Has nine games with seven or more rebounds, with a personal-best of nine.

2011-12

Saw action in all 30 games as a junior with seven starts... Averaged 5.3 points per game with a personal-best of 14 points in a win over Northeastern (2-2-12).

Was fourth on the team in rebounding (101, 3.4), fifth in points (158, 5.3), seventh in steals (28) and seventh in minutes played (462).

Her four season double-figure games included 12 against Bethune-Cookman (1-2-12), 11 vs. Arizona in the season opener (11-13-11) and 10 at Hofstra (1-12-12)... Just missed double figures with nine points at ODU (1-4-12) and eight points three more times.

Shot 5-of-8 from the field in both Arizona and Northeastern games with a season-best 5-of-7 vs. Bethune-Cookman.





The Monarchs of Coach Sue Phillips won three CCS titles, one NorCal championship and one state championship.




