THE KICKOFF: Georgia State (3-8, 2-5 Sun Belt) looks to end the 2016 season on a positive note as the Panthers travel to bowl-eligible Idaho (7-4, 5-2 Sun Belt) for Saturday's season finale at 5 p.m. ET at the Kibbie Dome in Moscow.

The Panthers were off last Saturday following their 30-24 victory over Georgia Southern on Nov. 19. Idaho has won three straight, including a 38-31 win over South Alabama Saturday.

Georgia State and Idaho are meeting for the first time. The trip to Idaho is the latest cross-country trek for the Panthers, who played at Air Force earlier this season and have also played at Washington, Oregon and New Mexico State in the last three seasons.

LAST ONE STANDING: Georgia State is the ONLY FBS TEAM that has not allowed an offensive play (rushing or passing) of 50 yards or longer all season. The longest pass play allowed by the Panthers covered 37 yards, while the longest run was 46 yards.

MORE ON THE DEFENSE: Georgia State features the top passing defense in the Sun Belt. The Panthers rank sixth in the FBS in pass efficiency defense and ninth in passing yards allowed (177.2) while leading the Sun Belt in both categories.

The Georgia State defense leads Sun Belt with an average of 4.9 yards per play allowed.

IDAHO CONNECTIONS: Georgia State's season finale at Idaho means interim head coach Tim Lappano will be coaching against his alma mater. A native of Spokane, Wash., Lappano is a 1983 graduate of Idaho, and he began his coaching career as the Vandals' running backs coach (1982-85) under Dennis Erickson.

Lappano has spent much of his coaching career in the Northwest. He served as offensive coordinator at Oregon State (1999-02), assistant coach and offensive coordinator at Washington State (1987-92), offensive coordinator at Washington (2005-08) and running backs coach for the Seattle Seahawks (1998).

In his five-year stint as tight ends and wide receivers coach with the Detroit Lions (2009-13), Lappano coached on the same offensive staff with Scott Linehan, the father of Idaho quarterback Matt Linehan.

Senior offensive analyst/tight ends coach John McDonell is another Spokane native and was an NAIA All-American at Carroll College, also the alma mater of Idaho head coach Paul Petrino, although they did not play together. McDonell spent 12 seasons (1989-2000) on the coaching staff at Washington State, including the 1997 Rose Bowl.

IDAHO MEMORIES: Although Georgia State will be playing a football game in Idaho for the first time, the Gem State was the site of one of the most memorable moments in the school's athletics history. Georgia State's 2001 men's basketball team earned a trip to Boise for the NCAA West Regional, where the Panthers, coached by Charles "Lefty" Driesell, knocked off No. 6 seed Wisconsin 50-49 before falling to eventual champion Maryland in the second round. The win over Wisconsin remained the only NCAA Tournament win in GSU history until R.J. Hunter's buzzer beater against Baylor in the 2015 NCAA Tournament.

SECOND STRAIGHT RIVALRY WIN OVER GEORGIA

SOUTHERN: Bragging rights reside in Atlanta for the second straight year as Georgia State earned a 30-24 win over in-state rival Georgia Southern on Nov. 19.

Conner Manning passed for 318 yards and accounted for three touchdowns, and Glenn Smith scored touchdowns rushing and receiving. Manning completed eight of his first 10 passes as Georgia State scored touchdowns on its first three possessions to take a 20-0 lead eight minutes into the game, and the Panthers never trailed.

Smith finished with seven catches for 65 yards and five rushes for 37 yards. His 29-yard run gave the Panthers an early 7-0 lead and his 15-yard TD reception put GSU ahead 27-17 in the third quarter.

Tight end Keith Rucker led the Panthers with eight catches for

145 yards for his second career 100-yard effort. Rucker is the fifth different Panther to have a 100-yard receiving game this season and fourth in the last two games.

The team awarded the game ball to interim head coach Tim Lappano in his first game.

SENIOR SEND-OFF: Twenty-one Georgia State seniors are playing their final game for the Panthers.

The senior class includes three starters on offense (WR Robert Davis, TE Keith Rucker and G Michael Ivory), five on defense (DE Shawanye Lawrence, LB Andrew Everett, LB Alonzo McGee, S Bobby Baker and S Bryan Williams) and PK Rogier ten Lohuis.

LAPPANO NAMED INTERIM HEAD

COACH: Receivers coach Tim Lappano is serving as Georgia State's interim head coach for the final two games of the 2016 season. He joined the GSU staff in 2014 after five seasons with the Detroit Lions, where he coached tight ends and then wide receivers, including NFL All-Pro Calvin Johnson. He also coached with the San Francisco 49ers (2003-04) and Seattle Seahawks (1998) under Dennis Erickson.

Lappano's previous college experience includes stops at Power 5 programs Washington (offensive coordinator, 2005-08), Oregon State (offensive coordinator, 1999-02), California (assistant head coach/running backs, 1992-95), Washington State (offensive coordinator, 1987-92) and Purdue (co-offensive coordinator, 1992).

At Georgia State, he coached six allconference receivers in his first two seasons.

GEORGIA STATE STADIUM ON THE

HORIZON: Georgia State's win over Georgia Southern on Nov. 19 marked the final Panther football game in the Georgia Dome, which is scheduled to be demolished next spring.

The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia has approved Georgia State University's purchase of Turner Field, and the former baseball venue and Olympic Stadium will be repurposed into a home for Georgia State football.

DAVIS CAPS RECORD-SETTING

CAREER: Senior wide receiver Robert Davis will leave Georgia State as one of the most prolific and decorated players in school history. The Panthers' career leader in receptions and receiving yards enters his final game with 213 receptions for 3,279 yards. He surpassed his former teammate and current Kansas City Chief Albert Wilson (175 receptions, 3,190 yards, 23 TD) in both categories, and he ranks second to Wilson with 17 career touchdowns.

More on the Davis record book:

> Davis now ranks second in Sun Belt Conference history in career receiving yards, trailing only T.Y. Hilton of FIU (3,531). Davis is fifth in receptions in Sun Belt annals.

- > Among active FBS players, Davis ranks eighth in receiving yards and 14th in receptions.
- > Davis has caught at least one pass in 48 straight games, every game he has played and the longest active streak in FBS.
- > His 17 career touchdown receptions have covered an average of 39.5 yards.
- > Davis and teammate Jalen Lawrence have played in a Georgia State-record 48 games.

CENTURY TRIO: For the first time in Georgia State history, three different receivers topped the 100-yard mark against UL Monroe.

Glenn Smith led the way with 123 yards on just four catches. He had a 31-yard touchdown and a 78-yard reception down to the 13-yard line.

Robert Davis had five catches for 114 yards, highlighted by a 58-yard TD. Freshman Jawan Nobles had a 61-yard touchdown en route to a 103-yard effort on five catches.

That is the second-highest figure in school history, bettered only by Nick Arbuckle's GSU record of 471 yards.

Wide receiver Todd Boyd and tight end Keith Rucker have also had 100-yard games this season. Missouri is the only FBS team in the nation with more different 100-yard receivers (6) than Georgia State's five.

INJURIES TAKE THEIR TOLL: Georgia State has endured a rash of key injuries that have ravaged the offensive skills positions:

- > Penny Hart, the 2015 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year and a Freshman All-American, played sparingly in just two games before his season was ended by a broken foot. Hart LED IN THE SUN BELT with 5.5 receptions and 84.5 receiving yards per game, and he set the Sun Belt freshman record for receiving yards (1,099).
- > Hart's injury caused the Panthers to move starting running back Glenn Smith to slot receiver, thinning the backfield.
- > Starting QB Conner Manning was injured in the Thursday practice before Game 7 vs. UT Martin. He missed that game and the next but came back vs. Arkansas State when his replacement, Aaron Winchester, injured his ankle. Winchester then missed the next two games.
- > Todd Boyd, the Panthers' secondleading receiver (33-352-1) suffered a season-ending knee injury vs. Arkansas State.
- > RB Kyler Neal, the Panthers' leading rusher, missed three full games and most of two others with an ankle injury.
- > Standout TE Keith Rucker missed two games with a rib injury and is still hampered.
- > RB Kendrick Dorn suffered a seasonending ankle injury vs. Arkansas State.
- > Running back Taz Bateman suffered a season-ending knee injury on the first day of preseason practice.

IT'S ACADEMIC: Georgia State defensive backs Chandon Sullivan and Bobby Baker were named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 football team by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Sullivan, a junior cornerback from Winder, Ga., was selected for the second straight year, the first repeat honoree in GSU football history. The journalism major is a three-year starter in the secondary who earned All-Sun Belt Conference accolades in 2015. He is GSU's career leader with six interceptions, including three this season.

Baker is a senior safety from Sherman Oaks, Calif., majoring in speech. Named to the Sun Belt All-Newcomer team in 2015, he is a two-time Sun Belt Defensive Student-Athlete of the Week, including this year's game against Wisconsin. He is second on the team in tackles with 55 and has a GSU-record five career fumble recoveries and four interceptions. Baker was tabbed to preseason watch lists for the Senior Bowl and Jim Thorpe Award and was a semifinalist

for the National Football Foundation William V. Campbell Trophy.

WREAKING HAVOC: Sophomore line-backer Michael Shaw tied the GSU record with four tackles for loss vs. ULM. Over the last three games, he has seven tackles for loss, including three sacks, 23 tackles and a forced fumble.

Shaw leads the team with 12 tackles for loss and three sacks on the season. One more TFL would break the Georgia State season record of 12.5, set last season by Alonzo McGee.

Shaw also ranks fifth in GSU history with 19 career TFL and sixth with 5.5 career sacks.

Defensive end Mackendy Cheridor has been similarly disruptive when healthy but he has missed four games to injury.

Cheridor was named Sun Belt Conference Defensive Student-Athlete of the Week (Oct. 10) after leading a strong defensive effort in the 41-21 victory over Texas State, collecting seven tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble.

After the Panthers' third straight turnover gave Texas State the ball at the GSU 31 early in the fourth quarter, Cheridor forced a fumble on a sack, and Tevin Jones recovered for GSU. Cheridor had another sack and a shared sack in the fourth quarter, and he also had a tackle for loss on 3rd-and-1 in the second quarter.

Cheridor is second in GSU history with 7.5 career sacks, just 1.5 behind Christo Bilukidi's school record of 9.0, and third place with 21 tackles for loss, one behind Joseph Peterson's school record of 22.

"NEXT MAN UP" IN GUTTY WIN:

Georgia State earned a 31-6 win over UT Martin despite numerous key injuries:

> After starting QB Conner Manning was injured in Thursday's practice, redshirt freshman Aaron Winchester completed eight passes for 119 yards and one touchdown while rushing for a game-high 75 yards on 16 carries in his first start.

- > The Panthers were already without starting TE Keith Rucker and top RB Kyler Neal, plus WRs Robert Davis and Glenn Smith played through injury. True freshman RB Darius Stubbs rushed for 69 yards on 12 carries with a 35-yard touchdown run.
- > Replacing standout Jerome Smith at CB, B.J. Clay had two interceptions and three pass breakups, including a 38-yard pick-six.
- > Marterious Allen, who moved from DE to NG two games earlier when starter Julien Laurent was injured, came through with a 23-yard fumble return for a touchdown to put GSU ahead 17-3.
- > Even the special teams were affected as both GSU long-snappers were out. LB Trey Payne had six tackles and an interception while also handling long-snapping and fielding a pooch kickoff.

DEFENSE GETS IT DONE: Playing without its starting quarterback and several other key offensive starters, the Georgia State defense took over with a record-setting performance in the Panthers' 31-6 win over UT Martin.

The GSU defense scored twice in the game--a first for the program--on consecutive plays while holding the Skyhawks to just two field goals. The Panthers set a school record for fewest points allowed and did not give up touchdown for the first time in GSU history.

With GSU holding a 10-3 lead late in the third quarter, defensive end Mackendy Cheridor caused a fumble in the backfield, and noseguard Marterious Allen scooped and scored on a 23-yard return. On UTM's next offensive play, cornerback B.J. Clay returned an interception 38 yards for a score.

Georgia State forced four turnovers, including three straight UTM possessions in the second half.

"CORNERING" THE MARKET: Junior cornerback Chandon Sullivan is Georgia State's career leader with six interceptions, including three this season. He broke the GSU record with a pick at Troy.

Sullivan is one of three Georgia State cornerbacks with three interceptions this season, along with Jerome Smith and B.J. Clay.

RUCKER RECOGNIZED AMONG TOP

TIGHT ENDS: Tight end Keith Rucker was tabbed to the Midseason Watch List for the John Mackey Award, given annually to the most outstanding collegiate tight end.

Rucker, a senior from Cincinnati, Ohio, is a preseason conference selection after earning second-team All-Sun Belt honors in 2015. He has 31 receptions for 345 yards and two touchdowns.

He ranks in the top six in Georgia State history with 89 career receptions for 1,131 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Off the field, Rucker serves as the Sun Belt Conference representative on the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

Rucker is the second Georgia State tight end in three seasons to be recognized as a Mackey Award candidate, following Joel Ruiz in 2014. Since the beginning of the 2014 season (30 games), Georgia State tight ends have combined for 116 receptions for 1,402 yards and 12 touchdowns.

CLOSE CALL AT WISCONSIN: Playing at No. 9 Wisconsin, Georgia State took a 17-13 lead with 11 minutes to play before falling 23-17.

- > Trailing 13-3 in the third quarter, Georgia State moved closer on Robert Davis' 13-yard touchdown catch with 19 seconds left in the third quarter that capped a 75-yard drive. Then Chandon Sullivan's interception regained possession for the Panthers, who needed just three plays to score the go-ahead touchdown. Glenn Smith's 60-yard catch-and-run down to the 9-yard line, followed by Kyler Neal's 9-yard TD run, put Georgia State in front.
- > In the first half, Georgia State's defense held the Badgers to two field goals, a missed field goal, a fumble and a punt on five possessions. The defense kept the Panthers close despite playing without three starting defensive linemen.
- > The game at Wisconsin was Georgia State's eighth contest against a Power Five opponent in seven seasons of football. Four of the eight Power Five opponents have been ranked: Wisconsin, 2016 (9/12), Alabama, 2010 (10/12), Alabama 2013 (1/1) and Oregon, 2015 (12/13), while two others (Washington and Clemson in 2014) were just outside the Top 25.

BAKER EARNS SECOND SUN BELT

AWARD: Safety Bobby Baker was named Sun Belt Conference Defensive Student-Athlete of the Week for the second time in his career after leading the Panthers' strong defensive effort at No. 9 Wisconsin. He also earned honorable mention recognition as Jim Thorpe Award Player of the Week.

The senior from Sherman Oaks, Calif., collected 11 tackles, a fumble recovery and a pass breakup to help the Panthers hold a 17-13 fourth-quarter lead before falling 23-17.

Baker's pass breakup came as the Badgers had third-and-four at the GSU 23-yard line on their first drive and forced Wisconsin to settle for a field goal.

His fumble recovery was on third-andgoal at the 1-yard line, with GSU holding a 6-0 lead in the second guarter.

Baker added another fumble recovery at South Alabama, giving him a GSU-record five for his career.

that saw Georgia State take a 17-13 lead with 11 minutes to play. Smith had catches three long receptions on the Panthers' two touchdown drives. He set up one score with catches of 40 and 20 yards, and then he had a 60-yard catch and run down to the 9-yard line to set up the go-ahead touchdown.

Smith began the season as Georgia State's starting running back, but moved to slot receiver with Penny Hart injured.

BIG SHOES TO FILL: Coming into the season, the Panthers' scholarship quarter-backs had combined to complete only two passes in a Division I game. the Panthers had to replace record-setting quarterback Nick Arbuckle, the 2015 Sun Belt Conference Student-Athlete of the Year who passed for more than 7,600 yards and 51 touchdowns in his two seasons. Graduate transfer Conner Manning earned the starting nod, edging redshirt freshman Aaron Winchester.

PROLIFIC PASS CATCHERS: Georgia State's pass-catching quintet of receivers Robert Davis, Penny Hart, Todd Boyd and Glenn Smith and tight end Keith Rucker all rank among the Panthers' career receiving leaders.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON: The Georgia State coaching staff features a father-son combination on the defensive side. Jesse Minter is in his fourth season as the Panthers' defensive coordinator. This year his father, Rick Minter, joined the staff as defensive line coach.

Rick is a former FBS head coach (Cincinnati, 1994-03) and long-time defensive coordinator at Notre Dame, Ball State, South Carolina, Marshall and Kentucky. He spent the last three years as linebackers coach for the Philadelphia Eagles.

The Minters first worked together in 2006 at Notre Dame, where Rick was the defensive coordinator and Jesse was an intern. Then in 2010, Rick and Jesse both served on Trent Miles' defensive staff at Indiana State.

NFL FLAVOR: The Georgia State coaching staff features significant coaching experience in the National Football League. Interim head coach/wide receivers coach Tim Lappano joined the GSU staff after five years with the Detroit Lions, where he coached All-Pro Calvin Johnson in 2013. Lappano previously coached on Dennis Erickson's staff with San Francisco (2003-04) and Seattle (1998).

Secondary coach Eric Lewis spent two seasons in the NFL as a quality control coach with Green Bay. He is the son of long-time NFL coach Sherman Lewis.

Defensive line coach Rick Minter spent the last three years as the linebackers coach for Chip Kelly with the Philadelphia Eagles.

ACADEMIC HONORS: The Georgia State football team has performed extremely well in the classroom:

- > The team posted a record GPA of 2.91 for the spring 2015 semester and has maintained a GPA of 2.8 or better since then.
- > Nine Panthers were named to the 2015-16 Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's List (GPA of 3.5 or higher), while another 36 were tabbed to the Sun Belt Honor Roll (GPA of 3.0-3.49).
- > Georgia State's overall athletic program was honored with the Sun Belt Conference Graduation Rate Award in 2016.

> This year's team features two CoSIDA Academic All-District selections in Chandon Sullivan and Bobby Baker.

PANTHER PROS: Despite Georgia State's brief history, four Panther alumni have played in the NFL, including three who are currently active:

- > A member of Georgia State's inaugural team in 2010, receiver Albert Wilson is in his third season with the Kansas City Chiefs. He was an undrafted free agent in 2014.
- > Wil Lutz, GSU's placekicker the last four years, is now the kicker for the New Orleans Saints. Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens in the spring, he was picked up by the Saints just before the season opener. He has twice been named NFL Special Teams Player of the Week.
- > Offensive tackle Ulrick John was selected in the seventh round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts. He played in two games for the Miami Dolphins in 2015. This year, he was just signed by the Arizona Cardinals off the Dolphins' practice squad.
- > GSU's first draft pick was defensive tackle Christo Bilukidi in 2013. He played three seasons (2013-15) in the NFL with Oakland, Cincinnati and Baltimore.
- > Quarterback Nick Arbuckle, the 2015 Sun Belt Student-Athlete of the Year, was signed to the practice squad for the CFL's Calgary Stampeders.

NFL FACILITIES: Georgia State is one of six FBS programs to play all its home games in the same facility as an NFL team. The others are Miami, Pittsburgh, San Diego State, Temple and USF. UMass plays some of its home games at Gillette Stadium.

Ball State downed Georgia State 31-21 in the season opener Friday night at the Georgia Dome.

Georgia State sophomore cornerback Jerome Smith led the Panthers with two interceptions in the game, returning one 48 yards for a touchdown for the Panthers' first score of the 2016 season.

Led by James Gilbert with 160 yards and two touchdowns, Ball State (1-0) rushed for 325 yards, including 267 in the second half.

"We turned the ball over in the first quarter and we could not sustain any drives. We did not do anything on offense to help move the ball and protect our defense," Georgia State head coach Trent Miles said. "Ball State ran the ball and did things better in the second half offensively, they did a much better job than we did, so congratulations to Ball State."

Smith's return, just the second "pick six" in GSU history, came on the first possession of the game and gave the Panthers a 7-0 lead less than two minutes into the game.

On the next possession, Smith came up with another interception, this at the Ball State 34-yard line after the ball was tipped at the line of scrimmage by Shawanye Lawrence. But the Panthers were unable to convert the short field.

With the game tied at 7-7, junior quarterback Conner Manning, the graduate transfer from Utah making his first start for the Panthers, hit Penny Hart for a 14-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second quarter.

Manning completed 21 of 32 passes for 163 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

Georgia State held a 14-7 lead until Ball State tied the game on Gilbert's 1-yard, fourth-down plunge with just 10 seconds left in the half.

The Cardinals took their first lead on their first possession of the second half, driving for Morgan Hagee's 44-yard field goal and a 17-14 advantage with 8:25 to play in the third quarter.

After forcing a Georgia State punt, Ball State moved deep in Panther territory to a first-and-goal at the GSU 5. But the Panther defense held on three straight running plays, and then on fourth-and-goal at the 1-yard line, Bobby Baker broke up Neal's pass in the end zone.

With GSU taking over at its own 1, redshirt freshman Aaron Winchester entered the game for the first time and moved the Panthers out to midfield before GSU had to punt.

Ball State then drove for another touchdown, keyed by quarterback Riley Neal's 46-yard run down to the GSU 15. Then Teddy Williamson's 15-yard scoring run put the Cardinals ahead 24-14.

After the Cardinals scored again on their next possession, Winchester tried to rally the Panthers, directing a 8-play, 79-yard scoring drive, capped by the quarterback's 13-yard run. That pulled Georgia State within 31-21 with 2:24 to play, but the Panthers could not recover the onside kick and Ball State ran out the clock

Winchester finished with 59 yards rushing on eight carries while completing four passes for 32 yards.

Senior wide receiver Robert Davis led the Panthers with eight receptions for 61 yards as he caught a pass in his 38th consecutive game.

Smith's interception return for touchdown is just the second "pick six" in GSU history. The first was last year by Chandon Sullivan at Arkansas State. He is the fifth Panther to grab two interceptions in a game and third in the last two seasons (Bobby Baker vs. Charlotte and Tarris Batiste vs. Georgia Southern).

AIR FORCE 48, GEORGIA STATE 14

Georgia State fell at Air Force 48-14 at Falcon Stadium.

Georgia State (0-2) got off to a strong start with a touchdown on its opening drive, and the Panthers trailed 20-14 late in the second quarter, but Air Force (2-0) scored on its final possession of the first half and first two of the second half to take a 41-14 lead midway through the third quarter.

While the Panthers struggled offensively, Air Force rushed for 464 yards, led by quarterback Nate Romine with 124 yards, to win its 14th consecutive home game.

On Georgia State's first possession, quarterback

Conner Manning moved the Panthers down the field with a 34-yard completion to Robert Davis and a 17-yard third-down conversion to Glenn Smith before hitting Ari Werts with a 22-yard scoring pass. Werts' first career touchdown gave the Panthers a 7-0 lead three minutes into the game.

But Air Force answered immediately as Tim McVey returned the ensuing kickoff 99 yards for the tying touchdown.

The Falcons put together two time-consuming drives, but both times the Georgia State defense forced Air Force to settle for field goals, the second one giving the Falcons a 13-7 lead early in the second quarter.

After Air Force converted a short field into a touchdown to take a 20-7 lead, Glenn Smith delivered an 88-yard kickoff return to set up the Panthers. Smith bounced off a tackler on the right side of the field, cut back to his left and raced down the sideline before he was finally brought down at the 6-yard line. With Aaron Winchester at quarterback, GSU needed just two plays to get into the end zone with Kendrick Dorn taking it in from the 2 for his first career touchdown. That brought the Panthers within 20-14 with nine minutes to play in the first half.

After an exchange of punts, Air Force quarterback Nate Romine completed consecutive passes of 14 and 32 yards to set up the Falcons' final score of the first half, a 10-yard run by Tyler Williams that put the Falcons ahead 27-14.

Late in the half, Manning hit Davis for 40 yards down to the Air Force 28, but after three straight incompletions, GSU missed a 45-yard field goal attempt.

After Air Force scored on the first possession of the second half, the Falcons executed an onsides kick to regain possession at the 50-yard line to set up another touchdown and a 41-14 advantage with nine minutes to play in the third quarter.

"We couldn't keep our offense on the field .We've got to find our who we are and find a way to run the ball because we just can't keep leaving our defense out there," head coach Trent Miles said. "We've got a lot of things we've got to fix. Our kicking game is struggling right now, and we've got to do a better job of coaching it and executing it.

"We had some opportunities that we couldn't take advantage of. Instead go three-and-out and put the defense back on the field, and they wear you down. Give credit to Air Force; we got beat by a better football team today."

Davis finished with three catches for 79 yards, and the GSU senior is now nine receptions behind the Panthers' career record of 175 by Albert Wilson (2010-13). Davis also topped the 2,500 mark for receiving yards.

Sophomore linebacker Chase Middleton made 15 tackles, equalling the fourth-highest singlegame total in school history and just two fewer than the GSU record.

Georgia State played without standout receiver Penny Hart and starting defensive end Mackendy Cheridor due to injury.

Georgia State led No. 9 Wisconsin 17-13 in the fourth quarter before the Badgers scored the go-ahead touchdown with seven minutes to play and held on for a 23-17 victory at Camp Randall Stadium.

Kyler Neal's 9-yard touchdown run gave Georgia State (0-3) its first lead at 17-13 with 11:36 left in the fourth quarter.

Neal's scamper was set up by Chandon Sullivan's interception and Glenn Smith's 60-yard reception. Sullivan, the junior cornerback, intercepted Alex Hornibrook on a tipped ball to give the Panthers possession at the GSU 32. On second-and-11, Conner Manning found Smith, who took a short pass over the middle and cut down the right sideline until he was brought down at the 9-yard line. Neal found the end zone on the next play.

But Wisconsin answered on the ensuing possession, which began at the Badgers' 41-yard line after Dare Ogunbowale's 41-yard kickoff return. Hornibrook, who relieved starter Bart Houston in the third quarter, completed passes of 11 yards to Wheelwright and then Kyle Penniston for 29 yards down to the GSU 17. The Panthers defense forced a third-and-goal at the 1-yard line, but Hornibrook

found Penniston for the touchdown pass. That put the Badgers (3-0) ahead 20-17 with 7:25 left.

Georgia State had two more possessions, both starting deep in their own territory, with a chance to take the lead, but the Panthers could not rally. Wisconsin added a field goal with 3:36 left for the final margin.

Manning finished 20-for-29 for 269 yards and one touchdown. Smith, the Panthers' starting running back who moved to the slot in place of injured Penny Hart, had five catches for a careerhigh 131 yards.

Senior receiver Robert Davis, who scored the Panthers' first touchdown on a 13-yard reception, had eight catches for 93 yards. That raised his career total to 174 receptions, one shy of Albert Wilson's Georgia State career record.

But the story was a Georgia State defense that managed to keep the powerful Badgers in check for most of the game, especially in the first half. On five Wisconsin possessions in the first half, the the Panthers forced a fumble, two field goals, a missed field goal and a punt. The Badgers were 2-for-7 on third downs.

For the game, Georgia State forced two turnovers while committing none.

Georgia State trailed just 6-0 at the half. Using its patented power running game, Wisconsin put together long drives on its first two possessions, but both times, the GSU defense held the Badgers to field goals, the second one giving Wisconsin a 6-0 lead with 51 seconds left in the first quarter.

The Badgers looked like the might get into the end zone early in the second quarter after a fumbled snap on a punt gave them the ball at the GSU 23. But one third-and-goal at the 1-yard line, linebacker Alonzo McGee forced a fumble by Bradrick Shaw, which safety Bobby Baker recovered at the 6.

That led to the Panthers' best scoring chance of the first half as Manning hit Davis for 20 yard and then found tight end Keith Rucker for 15 yard for a first down at the Wisconsin 31. But three plays netted just three yards, and the Panthers' field goal try was blocked.

The Panthers got on the board in the third quarter on a 45-yard field goal by Rogier ten Lohuis. That is the first field goal in a football game at any level for the former soccer player from the Netherlands. The drive was highlighted by Davis' 38-yard reception and Kyler Neal's fourth-down run for a first down.

After Wisconsin scored its first touchdown on Ogunbawle's 2-yard scoring run, the Panthers answered. Manning connected with Smith for 40 yards to the Wisconsin 34 and then hit him again for 20 yards and first down at the 13. On the next play, Manning found Davis, who crossed the goal line just inside the pilon for his 13th career touchdown, pulling the Panthers within 13-10 with 19 seconds left in the third quarter.

APPALACHIAN STATE 17, GEORGIA STATE 3

Game 4: Oct. 1, 2016 • 12 p.m. ET (ASN) Kidd Brewer Stadium • Boone, N.C.

Despite a strong performance by the Georgia State defense, the Panthers fell 17-3 at Appalachian State in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams Saturday at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Georgia State (0-4, 0-1 Sun Belt) senior receiver Robert Davis became the Panthers' all-time leading receiver on his second catch of the game. Davis had five catches for 56 yards on the day, raising his career total to 179 receptions and surpassing his former teammate Albert Wilson (175, 2010-13).

The GSU defense kept Appalachian State (3-2, 1-0 Sun Belt) off the scoreboard until the third quarter and kept the Panthers close until a Mountaineer touchdown with three minutes left.

The teams played a scoreless first half as the GSU defense came up with a couple of big plays. Linebacker Michael Shaw came up with his first career interception first career interception on a tipped ball near the sideline, and cornerback Jerome Smith's sack on third down that forced App State to settle for a 52-yard field goal attempt that was no good.

Appalachian State scored the game's first points on Jalin Moore's 45-yard touchdown run on the opening possession of the second half.

"Defensively, I thought we had a great plan and the guys did a good job," head coach Trent Miles said. "We gave up the one long run and then the jump ball there at the end to ice it, but for the most part, I thought our defense was sound all day."

Georgia State answered with a 43-yard field goal by Rogier ten Lohuis with nine minutes left in the third quarter, but that was all the Panthers could manage. Moore led the Mountaineers with 159 yards rushing on 29 carries.

Penny Hart, the Panthers' standout receiver, started after missing the last two games with a hamstring injury, but the sophomore sustained a foot injury early in the game and now is likely out for the season.

"It was very difficult losing Penny Hart so early in the game," Miles said, "but our kids battled. Offensively, we just struggled. We ran the ball better in the beginning, but then they started loading the box and we were ineffective throwing the ball down the field. We've got to coach better and get them ready for Texas State."

Georgia State quarterback Conner Manning got off to a hot start, completing eight of his first 10 passes, but he finished 19-for-44 for 153 yards with four interceptions (including a hail mary on the final play of the game).

Manning's first-quarter interception ended his string of 82 straight passes without a pick and was the Panthers' first turnover of any kind since the first quarter of the season opener vs. Ball State.

Kyler Neal rushed for 46 yards on 12 carries, and true freshman Darius Stubbs added 28 yards on seven attempts.

Linebacker Alonzo McGee had a game-high 11 tackles to lead the defense.

Redshirt freshman punter Brandon Wright was a bright spot with seven punts for a 46.6-yard average.

GEORGIA STATE 41, TEXAS STATE 21

Game 5: Oct. 8, 2016 • 3:30 p.m. ET (ESPN3) Georgia Dome • Atlanta, Ga.

Conner Manning passed for a career-high 340 yards and two touchdowns, including nine passes for 149 yards to Robert Davis, as the Panthers defeated Texas State 41-21 Saturday at the Georgia Dome. The 41 points equal the Panthers' high under head coach Trent Miles; Georgia State also scored 41 at Texas State last year.

The Panthers posted season highs for passing yards (340), rushing yards (196) and total offense (536). Kyler Neal led the rushing attack with a career-best 89 yards on 13 carries, including one touchdown.

Davis, the senior standout, tied his career-high with nine catches for 149 yards, highlighted by a 55-yard touchdown catch. He recorded his seventh career 100-yard game, and the touchdown was his eighth career reception of 50-plus yards.

After allowing touchdowns on Texas State's first two possessions, the Georgia State defense was outstanding, forcing three turnovers and collecting four sacks. The Bobcats were 5-for-6 on third downs on their first two drives, but GSU held them to 1-for-13 for the rest of the game.

"I thought our guys did, especially on defense, an outstanding job of overcoming adversity after the first two series of the game," head coach Trent Miles said. "When they went up 14-0, our defense made some excellent adjustments on the sideline and basically only gave up seven points the rest of the game. We were backed up numerous times because of offensive miscues and gave up no points, so I thought it was an outstanding effort by our defense."

After falling behind, Georgia State rallied with 24 straight points in the second quarter to take a 24-14 advantage into the locker room and then scored the first 10 points of the second half to take control with a 34-14 lead.

"Offensively, it was our best performance yet," Miles said. "We've got to take care of the ball in the fourth quarter, too many turnovers that allowed them to be right there, but we got bailed out by the defense. We ran the ball better than we have all year, I think we had almost 200 yards rushing.

"I thought Conner Manning played extremely well, got the ball to the big dog, Robert Davis, and he made some excellent plays. I'm thrilled with the way our offensive line was able to establish the line of scrimmage and move the ball and keep them from getting a lot of pressure on him (Manning)."

The 24 points in the second quarter are the most Georgia State has ever scored in a single quarter.

Trailing 14-0, the Panthers forced a punt and took over at their own 9-yard line, and Manning directed a 91-yard drive, highlighted by an 18-yard pass to Davis, a 26-yard completion to Ari Werts. Manning picked up a key first down at midfield with a 2-yard scramble and then capped the march with a 1-yard plunge for the score, pulling the Panthers within 14-7 early in the second quarter.

Then the Panthers' defense stepped up as cornerback Jerome Smith intercepted Jones' next pass--Smith's third pick of the seaso--to give Georgia State possession at the Texas State 46. That led to Manning's 8-yard touchdown pass to tight end Keith Rucker. True freshman Tra Barnett started the drive with a 13-yard run, and Manning hit Davis for 22-yards to the 11 to set up the score and tie the game at 14-14.

After a three-and-out by the Bobcats, Georgia State put together another long drive, this time marching 82 yards. Manning's 21-yard completion to Rucker put the Panthers at the Texas State 32, where Georgia State pulled out a trick play. Barnett took a handoff and then flipped to Glenn Smith on a reverse, and Smith raced around the right side for the 32-yard score. That gave the Panthers their first lead at 21-14 with six minutes to play in the first half

On the first play of the second half, Manning hit Davis for a 55-yard touchdown pass and a 31-14 lead for the Panthers.

"The offensive line gave us time to throw the ball, my quarterback gave me a perfect pass, and I did my simple job of catching the ball and getting it into the endzone," Davis said.

After Rogier ten Lohuis hit his second field goal of the day, Neal capped a 76-yard touchdown drive with a 3-yard scoring run for a 41-21 GSU lead with five minutes left in the third quarter.

Georgia State led 41-21 late in the third quarter when the Panthers turned the ball over in their own territory on three straight possessions. But each time, the GSU defense held. First, Chandon Sullivan blocked a field goal, and then the defense held on downs, forcing an incompletion on fourth down. Finally, Mackendy Cheridor forced a fumble while sacking Texas State quarterback Tyler Jones and Tevin Jones recovered for GSU.

Cheridor, the junior defensive end, finished with seven tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss including 2.5 sacks. and a forced fumble.

In addition to blocking the field goal, Sullivan had an interception, his second of the season, in the end zone. That gives him five career interceptions, tying three other players for the GSU career lead.

TROY 31, GEORGIA STATE 21

Game 6: Oct. 15, 2016 • 3:30 p.m. ET (ESPN3) Veterans Memorial Stadium • Troy, Ala.

With 100 yard receiving efforts from Robert Davis and Todd Boyd, Georgia State led Sun Belt Conference leader Troy 14-6 in the second half but the Panthers could not overcome key injuries and special teams plays in a 31-21 loss at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Boyd posted career highs with nine catches for 122 yards, including a 25-yard touchdown. Davis had his second straight 100-yard game with five receptions for 117 yards, but the senior standout was injured on his 55-yard touchdown catch in the third guarter.

"We hurt ourselves on special teams and we never really were able to run the football, but our kids kept battling and battling," head coach Trent Miles said. "We put our defense in some tough spots and they fought their butts off but just weren't able to do it."

Georgia State (1-5, 1-2 Sun Belt) took a 14-6 lead with touchdowns on its first two possessions of the second half.

The Panthers took the opening kickoff and drove 85 yards on nine plays, capped by Manning's 25-yard touchdown pass to Boyd. The junior receiver also had two other big plays on the drive with a 16-yard reception and then a 6-yard catch to convert on 4th-and-5 at the 27-yard line. Two plays late, he hauled in his touchdown over the middle to put the Panthers ahead 7-6.

After the GSU defense forced a punt, the Panthers faced 3rd-and-10 at their own 35 when Manning found Davis over the middle, and he raced to the end zone for the 65-yard touchdown. That put gave the Panthers a 14-6 lead with nine minutes to play in the third quarter.

That was Davis' ninth career reception of 50-plus yards, but he was injured on the play. Already without starting tight end Keith Rucker, the Panthers also lost top rusher Kyler Neal in the first quarter and were down to their third long-snapper.

"Of course those things hurts, but our kids are battlers." Miles said.

Troy (5-1, 3-0 Sun Belt) returned the ensuing kickoff 44 yards to GSU 42 and drove for a first-and-goal at the 2-yard line, but the Panthers' defense turned in a valiant goal-line stand, holding on first, second and third down. On fourth down inside the one, Troy had an apparent touchdown nullified by a holding penalty and was forced to settle for a field goal. After that seven-minute, 14-play drive,

Georgia State still led 14-9 with two minutes in the third quarter.

But Troy managed to recover a pooch kickoff to gain possession again at the GSU 35-yard line, setting up a 3-yard touchdown run by Jordan Chunn, who carried the ball 32 times for 91 yards on the day. The two-point conversion gave the Trojans the lead for good at 17-14 with a minute left in the third quarter.

The Trojans led 31-14 when Manning's 14-yard touchdown pass to Ari Werts pulled Georgia State within 31-21 with 7:33 still to play. After the GSU defense forced a three-and-out, Manning moved the Panthers out to midfield, but he was sacked and fumbled.

In a defensive battle in the first half, Troy took the opening kickoff and put together a 20-play drive that lasted more than nine minutes, but after two penalties in the red zone, the Trojans had to settle for Ryan Kay's 39-yard field goal.

It appeared that the teams would go into the locker room with that same 3-0 with Georgia State punting from midfield with less than a minute remaining in the half. But an errant snap on the punt gave Troy the ball at the GSU 38-yard line with 40 seconds to play, and the Trojans managed another field goal, a 27-yarder on the final play to go up 6-0 at the half.

Manning completed 28 of 52 passes for a careerhigh 381 yards and three touchdowns.

Georgia State had two 100-yard receivers in the same game for the seven time in school history and first time since last year's win over Texas State. Robert Davis has been involved in five of the seven.

Chandon Sullivan grabbed an interception in the second quarter, his third of the season the sixth of his career, a new Georgia State career record.

For Troy, Brandon Silvers passed for 235 yards and two touchdowns.

Playing without injured starting quarterback Conner Manning, Georgia State turned to its defense, which scored twice on a fumble return and an interception return in the Panthers' 31-6 victory over UT Martin on Homecoming at the Georgia Dome.

Junior cornerback B.J. Clay grabbed two interceptions, including a 38-yard pick six, and sophomore defensive tackle Marterious Allen returned a fumble 23 yards for a score as Georgia State recorded two defensive touchdowns in a game for the first time in school history.

The six points by UT Martin marked the fewest points allowed in a game in program history, and the Panthers did not allow a touchdown for the first time ever.

The Panthers (2-5, 1-2 Sun Belt) forced UT Martin (4-4, 3-1 OVC) into four total turnovers which led to 14 points.

Manning, who injured his throwing arm in practice Thursday, was replaced by redshirt freshman Aaron Winchester, who went 8-of-16 for 119 yards and a touchdown. Winchester also rushed for 75 yards on 16 attempts, including a long of 18 yards.

"I'm very proud of our football team," head coach Trent Miles said. "I'm proud of the way they performed today in what could have been a tough situation, losing your starting quarterback basically the day before the game. That's a good football team we beat. They almost won at Hawai'i, they went to Cincinnati and had a chance to win that game, and they're going to win a bunch of games in their conference"

Georgia State led 10-3 in the third quarter when the defense broke the game open with scores on consecutive plays. First Allen busted through the middle of the line, scooped up a fumble caused by Kaleb Ringer and headed for the end zone, dragging several defenders the final five yards for the 23-yard score. That was GSU's first fumble return for a touchdown since 2013.

On UT Martin's next play from scrimmage, Clay, playing for injured starter Jerome Smith, stepped in front of backup quarterback Gunnar Holcombe's pass and returned it 38 yards for the score. That put Georgia State ahead 24-3 with less than five minutes left in the third quarter.

Clay came up with another turnover on the Skyhawks' next possession with an interception in

the end zone. He tied a school record held by five other players with two picks in the game.

"The mark of a good football team is when the offense is struggling, the defense and special teams picks it up for them," Miles said. "We lost our starting quarterback on Thursday, but they played together as a team. The defense had some scores, the offense had some scores, and we won the game."

Winchester started the Panthers' first scoring drive with a 16-yard run down to the UT Martin 35. After he dumped off to running back Darius Stubbs for a 13-yard gain down to the 7, he hit Glenn Smith for a 7-yard touchdown pass to put the Panthers on the board with a minute remaining in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Winchester's 43-yard pass to Glenn Smith down the middle to the UT Martin 6-yard line set up Rogier ten Lohuis' 23-yard field goal, giving the Panthers a 10-0 lead with 6:33 to play in the half.

The Skyhawks managed a 44-yard field goal late in the second quarter, but for the fourth time in the last five games, the Georgia State defense did not allow a touchdown in the first half.

True freshman Darius Stubbs closed out the scoring with a 35-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. Stubbs finished with 69 yards rushing on 12 carries.

"Offensively it was a little rough," Miles said. "For Aaron Winchester to find out he was the starter this morning, I thought there were some things he wishes he had back, but for his first time, he was able to move the ball around with his feet early in the game. And I was happy with the way Darius Stubbs ran the ball."

Georgia State was playing without several injured starters in addition Manning. On offense, running back Kyler Neal (ankle) and tight end Keith Rucker (ribs) were also out, and standout receiver Robert Davis was limited to one catch by a shoulder injury. On defense, cornerback Jerome Smith (hand) was out.

SOUTH ALABAMA 13, GEORGIA STATE 10

Gavin Patterson's 30-yard field goal with two seconds left gave South Alabama a 13-10 victory over Georgia State Saturday at Ladd-Peebles Stadium, spoiling another outstanding performance by the Panthers' defense.

Georgia State (2-6, 1-3 Sun Belt), playing its second straight game without starting quarterback Conner Manning, took a 10-3 lead late in the third quarter, but the Jaguars (4-4, 1-4 Sun Belt) tied the game with six minutes left.

With Manning injured, the GSU defense has been stellar the last two games, allowing just one touchdown and 19 points in the two contests, but the Panthers have struggled to move the ball on offense

With the score tied at 10-all late in the game, Georgia State took over at its own 9-yard line with 1:28 to play. But after the Panthers managed just one first down and South Alabama used its three timeouts, a poor punt gave the Jaguars possession at the GSU 31 with 44 seconds to play to set up the winning field goal.

The Georgia State defense came up with several big stops in the game.

In a 3-3 game in the third quarter, a fumble gave the Jaguars the ball at the GSU 27-yard line, but the defense held. On third-and-3 at the 20, Shawayne Lawrence tackled the ball carrier for a a 2-yard loss, forcing a field goal attempt. But the snap was bad, and the Panthers took over at the 29-yard line.

That stop allowed Georgia State to take a 10-3 lead with an 11-play, 71-yard drive. Quarterback Aaron Winchester hit Glenn Smith for 22-yard down to the USA 21 found Robert Davis for 20 yards to the 2. Then Demarcus Kirk took it in for the touchdown with 2:34 left in the third quarter.

Davis' catch gave him at least one reception in his 45th straight game, tied for the FBS active lead.

The defense turned in another big play on South Alabama's next possession as Bryan Williams caused a fumble and Bobby Baker recovered at the GSU 49. That is the fifth fumble recovery of Baker's career, adding to his GSU record.

Georgia State drove into South Alabama territory but a penalty thwarted the drive and forced a punt. South Alabama drove 92 yards on 14 plays and tied the game on Tyreis Thomas' 2-yard touchdown run. The big play was Dallas Davis' 14-yard completion to Gerald Everett on fourth-and-11 at the GSU 25. That knotted the score at 10-10 with six minutes left

"The defense did a great job of getting a turnover," head coach Trent Miles said. "We were up seven in their territory and we get no points out of it. We were not good enough on offense, we didn't step up on special teams when we had to, and we let them off the hook,"

"Our kids played really hard. The defense was playing great."

Georgia State took the opening kickoff and moved down the field for Rogier ten Lohuis' 30-yard field goal, giving the Panthers a 3-0 lead five minutes into the game.

For the fifth time in the last six games, the GSU defense did not allow a touchdown in the first half.

Junior cornerback B.J. Clay grabbed his third interception in the last three games, this one coming at the GSU 12-yard on the Jaguars' fake punt attempt.

Winchester, the redshirt freshman, completed 11 of 18 passes for 113 yards and rushed 21 times for a net of 64 yards, but he was sacked four times.

ARKANSAS STATE 31, GEORGIA STATE 16

Game 9: Thurs., Nov. 3, 2016 • 7:30 p.m. Georgia Dome • Atlanta, Ga. (ESPNU)

Georgia State fell 31-16 to Arkansas State despite another strong performance by the Panthers' defense in a Thursday night Sun Belt Conference game at the Georgia Dome.

Arkansas State (4-4, 4-0 Sun Belt), which won its 13th straight Sun Belt Conference game, scored two special teams touchdowns on a blocked field goal and a punt return, and the Red Wolves' first offensive touchdown came in the third quarter when they started at the GSU 19-yard line following an errant snap on a punt. Their two offensive touchdowns came on drives that covered a total of 24 yards.

"I'm very disappointed in the result of the game and the special teams performance tonight. I think the defense rose to the occasion and played well, but when you give up a blocked field goal to take the lead at the half for a touchdown, a punt return for a touchdown, a bad snap on a punt that led to a touchdown deep in our territory and a blocked extra point, we didn't give ourselves a chance to win the football game."

Georgia State (2-7, 1-4) continues to battle injuries on offense. Conner Manning returned to start at quarterback after missing the last two games but was still hampered with an arm injury. Backup Aaron Winchester, who filled in the last two games, was unavailable after suffering an ankle on the final play at South Alabama.

Manning completed 22 of 46 passes for 237 yards and one touchdown. Robert Davis tied his career high with nine receptions for 87 yards, topping the 200-catch milestone for his career, and Todd Boyd added seven catches for 87 yards.

"I thought Conner was gritty," Miles said. "Obviously, he threw two interceptions, but he was out there fighting and scrapping and doing the best that he could."

Trailing 10-3 at the half, Georgia State tied the game midway through the third quarter with an 8-play, 66-yard drive. Todd Boyd made a one-handed, 28-yard catch for a first down at the ASU 31 and then had a 19-yard catch down to the 11. Two plays later, Manning hit Keith Rucker over the middle for a 17-yard touchdown, the 10th career score for the GSU tight end.

On its next possession, Georgia State was punting from its own 40, but an errant snap gave the Red Wolves the ball at the GSU 19. The Panthers are down to their third long-snapper after injuries to the starter and his backup.

Arkansas State converted the short field into the go-ahead touchdown on Johnston White's 1-yard run. That put the Red Wolves up 17-10 with 36 seconds left in the third quarter.

Then the teams traded special teams scores as Blaise Taylor returned a punt 68 yards for a score, and then freshman Tra Barnett answered for the Panthers with a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. The GSU extra point was blocked, making the score 24-16 Arkansas State with 13 minutes to play.

Barnett's return is the fifth kickoff return for a touchdown in Georgia State's brief history. The Panthers' also had one last season at Arkansas State by freshman Marquan Greene.

Arkansas State added a late touchdown after Georgia State failed to convert a fourth down deep in its own territory with two minutes to play.

The GSU defense shut out the Red Wolves in the first quarter, forcing two field goals that were both missed, and the Panthers took a 3-0 lead on Rogier ten Lohuis' 42-yard field with three minutes in the

quarter.

With the score tied at 3-3, the Panthers drove until Arkansas State territory late in the first half, but the drive stalled at the ASU 33. Ten Lohuis' 50-yard field goal attempt was blocked and returned for a touchdown by Chris Humes, giving the Red Wolves a 10-3 lead with 25 seconds left in the half.

For the sixth time in the last seven games, the Georgia State defense did not allow a first-half touchdown. In the second half, the Panthers allowed just 56 yards of offense.

The Panthers collected five sacks and eight pass breakups while holding Arkansas State to 305 yards on 76 plays, including 93 yards rushing.

Linebacker Michael Shaw sack ASU quarterback Justice Hansen twice for 16 yards and forced a fumble, along with seven tackles. Defensive end Shawanye Lawrence made a career-high seven tackles with a 10-yard sack and a pass breakup. Julien Laurent and Chase Middleton also had sacks.

Conner Manning passed for a career-high 422 yards and Georgia State had three 100-yard receivers for the first time in school history, but the Panthers fell to UL Monroe 37-23 at the Georgia Dome as the Warhawks' Thomas Koufie rushed for 201 yards and five touchdowns.

Manning was 19-for-30 passing with touchdown passes to Robert Davis, Glenn Smith and Jawan Nobles, who each topped the century mark. Manning's 422 yards passing are the second-most in school history, bettered only by Nick Arbuckle's school-record of 471.

Davis continued to cement his name in the Georgia State history book with five catches for 114 yards, including a 58-yard touchdown. Already GSU's career leader in receptions, he broke the Panthers' career record for receiving yards previously held by Albert Wilson. Davis now has 3,203 career yards, among the top 10 active leaders in FBS, on 209 catches.

Davis also caught a pass in his 47th straight game, the longest current streak among all active FBS players.

Smith caught four passes for a career-high 123 yards, including a 31-yard touchdown and a 78-yard reception down to the 13-yard line.

Nobles, a true freshman seeing his first significant action following a season-ending injury to Todd Boyd, hauled in a 61-yard scoring pass and finished with five catches for 103 yards.

Trailing 9-7 at the half, Georgia State took its first lead just three plays into the third quarter as Manning hit Davis down the left sideline for the 58-yard touchdown and a 13-9 lead.

But ULM returned the ensuing kickoff 60 yards to the GSU 39, setting up Koufie's 18-yard touchdown.

Manning did it again three plays later, this time connecting with Nobles down the right side for the 68-yard score and putting GSU ahead 20-13 less than five minutes into the third quarter.

After ULM (4-6, 3-3 Sun Belt) drove 82 yards for Kouffie's third touchdown to move ahead 23-20, it looked like Manning would make it three straight touchdowns as he hooked up Smith down the right sideline, but Smith was knocked out of bounds at the 13-yard line. However, the Panthers could not capitalize and had a 27-yard field goal blocked and returned to the ULM 38-yard line.

The Warhawks converted the short field to take control of the game with a 62-yard scoring drive, capped by Koufie's fourth touchdown.

Georgia State's (2-8, 1-5 Sun Belt) defense, which has been outstanding for most of this season, held ULM to 76 yards rushing on 19 attempts in the first half, but the Warhawks managed 188 yards on the ground in the second half.

Sophomore linebacker Michael Shaw had a career-high 12 tackles and tied the GSU record with four tackles for loss, including one sack, but all came in the first half

GEORGIA STATE 30, GEORGIA SOUTHERN 24

Game 11: Nov. 19, 2016 • 2 p.m. (ESPN3) Georgia Dome • Atlanta, Ga.

Bragging rights reside in Atlanta for the second straight year as Georgia State earned a 30-24 win over Georgia Southern at the Georgia Dome. The Panthers won their final home game of the season and last game in the Georgia Dome, which is scheduled to be demolished next spring.

Conner Manning passed for 318 yards and accounted for three touchdowns, and Glenn Smith scored touchdowns rushing and receiving as Georgia State improved to 3-8 and 2-5 in the Sun Belt Conference.

Manning completed eight of his first 10 passes as Georgia State scored touchdowns on its first three possessions to take a 20-0 lead eight minutes into the game. The Panthers never trailed.

Smith finished with seven catches for 65 yards and five rushes for a team-best 37 yards. His 29-yard run gave the Panthers an early 7-0 lead and his 15-yard TD reception put Georgia State ahead 27-17 midway through the third quarter.

Tight end Keith Rucker led the Panthers with eight catches for 145 yards for his second career 100-yard effort. Rucker is the fifth different Panther to have a 100-yard receiving game this season and fourth in the last two games.

The team awarded the game ball to interim head coach Tim Lappano in his first game.

"It was important for the coaches and me to send our seniors out with bragging rights in this series," Lappano said. "The young guys are going to get to have three or four more years, but the seniors aren't. Georgia Southern hammered us in the Georgia Dome two years ago. Then we went down to Statesboro and got after them. This was the rubber match, and I wanted to make sure we sent our seniors out the right way. This was the seniors' last time playing in the Georgia Dome."

Trailing 30-24, Georgia Southern (4-7, 3-4 Sun Belt) started its final drive at its own 4-yard line with 1:14 to play, but the Panthers' defense held. The Eagles managed one first down at the 17 before Favian Upshaw threw four straight incomplete passes.

Georgia State scored touchdowns on its first three possessions. The Panthers took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards. Manning opened the game with a 23-yard completion to Rucker and hit five other passes on the drive before Smith covered the final 29 yards for the score.

On Georgia Southern's second play from scrimmage, Shawanye Lawrence stripped Matt Breida and recovered at the Eagles' 26-yard line. On 3rd-and-11, Manning hit Ari Werts, who dove for the end zone but was ruled down just shy of the goal line. On the next play, Manning snuck over for the score and a 13-0 lead less than five minutes into the game.

After the Panthers' defense forced a punt, Manning found Davis for 36 yards down the left sideline, and then two plays later, the two connected over the middle for a 28-yard touchdown pass and a 20-0 lead with seven minutes to play in the first quarter.

Georgia Southern responded in the late in the first quarter, scoring the next 17 points to pull within 20-17 at the half.

The Panthers extended their lead on their first possession of the second half with an 11-play, 83-yard drive. Rucker had a 21-yard reception on the drive, and Smith had three catches, capped by his 15-yard touchdown to put Georgia State ahead 30-27 midway through the third quarter.

Brandon Wright, Georgia State's punter, kicked his first field goal with a 27-yard boot to increase the advantage to 30-17 late in the third quarter.

Georgia Southern pulled within 30-24 on L.A. Ramsby's 1-yard touchdown run with 4:42 to play. On its ensuing possession, the Panthers managed one key first down, forcing Georgia Southern to exhaust its timeouts, and then Wright nailed a 49-yard punt to pin the Eagles deep with just 1:14 to play.

Twenty-two Georgia State seniors were honored in pregame ceremonies. Two of them, wide receiver Robert Davis and noseguard Jalen Lawrence, played in their 48th game in a GSU uniform, more than any other player in school history.
