# **GEORGIA STATE (5-3, 4-1) at TEXAS STATE (2-7, 1-4)**

Saturday, Nov. 11 | 4 p.m. ET | ESPN3 Bobcat Stadium | San Marcos, Texas

**THE KICKOFF:** Entering its final road game of the season Saturday at Texas State, Georgia State (5-3, 4-1 Sun Belt) has won five of its last six games and now sits in second place in the Sun Belt, trailing only unbeaten Arkansas State. Four of Georgia State's five victories have come on the road, including Saturday's 23-17 come-from-behind victory at Georgia Southern, the Panthers' third straight win over their in-state rival.

- > Penny Hart's 9-yard touchdown catch from Conner Manning with 2:31 to play capped the comeback for the Panthers, who trailed 17-7 late in the third quarter.
- > The winning touchdown was set up by the defense as DeAndre Applin caused a fumble that James Traylor recovered at the Georgia Southern 31-yard line.
- > Hart, the Sun Belt's leading receiver, ranks fifth in the nation in receiving yards (109.5 per game), sixth in receptions (7.6 per game) and 10th in touchdowns (8).
- > Manning, the senior quarterback, is averaging 253.8 yards passing per game with 11 touchdowns while completing 64 percent of his passes.
- > Sixth-year senior safety Bryan Williams is the Panthers' top tackler (41) and leads the Sun Belt with four interceptions.
- > The Panther defense ranks in the top three in the Sun Belt in scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense.
- > Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan is one of 13 national finalists at all levels for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments® for the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame. The trophy recognizes the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** In winning five of its last six games, Georgia State has won four straight road contests with victories at Charlotte, Coastal Carolina, ULM and Georgia Southern.

> GSU is the only FBS school this season to play four straight road games and the only one to win three straight road games with no home games in between. > Due to the Memphis cancellation, the Panthers went 51 days between home games (from Aug. 31 to Oct. 21). Now, after playing two home games in six days, Georgia State has another four weeks away from home before finishing the season with two straight games at Georgia State Stadium.

**SERIES VS. TEXAS STATE:** Georgia State has won the last two meetings against Texas State to even the series at 2-2.

- > Last season at the Georgia Dome, Conner Manning passed for 340 yards and two touchdowns in GSU's 41-21 victory. Kyler Neal led the rushing attack with a careerhigh 89 yards and a touchdown. The Panthers fell behind 14-0 before scoring 24 straight points in the second quarter and then the first 10 points of the third quarter to take a 34-14 lead. Jerome Smith and Chandon Sullivan had interceptions.
- > In 2015 at Texas State, Nick Arbuckle set the GSU record with 471 yards passing and four touchdowns on just 23 completions as the Panthers rolled up 643 yards of offense in their 41-19 victory. Penny Hart had six catches for 113 yards and a touchdown. That win began a four-game winning streak that earned Georgia State its first bowl berth.

**PENNY FOR YOUR THOUGHTS:** Sophomore Penny Hart is a member of the Watch List for the Biletnikoff Award, presented to the outstanding receiver in college football.

- > The Sun Belt's leading receiver, Hart ranks fifth in FBS in receiving yards (109.5 per game), sixth in receptions (7.6 per game) and 10th in touchdowns (8).
- > He has accounted for 36 percent of the Panthers' receptions (61) and 41 percent of their receiving yards (876) this season while catching eight of the team's 12 TD passes.
- > After just 23 career games, Hart has amassed 140 receptions for 2,036 yards and 17 touchdowns. He ranks third in school history in all three categories, and the two receivers in front of him, Albert Wilson and Robert Davis, are in the NFL.
- > Hart ranks fourth among all active FBS receivers with career averages of 6.07 receptions and 88.5 receiving yards per game.

> The 2015 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year and Freshman All-American played sparingly in just two games before his 2016 season was ended by a broken foot. As a rookie in 2015, Hart led the Sun Belt with 5.5 receptions and 84.5 receiving yards per game, and he set the Sun Belt freshman record for receiving yards (1,099).

**TWO BIG PLAYS FOR TRAYLOR:** Senior outside linebacker James Traylor had a hand in two game-changing turnovers as Georgia State won for the fifth time in six games with a 21-17 come-from-behind victory at Georgia Southern.

> Traylor's fourth-quarter fumble recovery set up the Panthers' winning touchdown. With Georgia State trailing 17-14 in the final six minutes, Traylor recovered a fumble to give the Panthers possession at the Georgia Southern 31-yard line. That set up Penny Hart's go-ahead touchdown catch with 2:31 to play.

> On the game's first play from scrimmage, Traylor caused a fumble that teammate Chandon Sullivan scooped up and returned 28 yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 Georgia State lead.

#### A CASE FOR THE DEFENSE: The

Georgia State defense set a school record by holding South Alabama to a net of 41 yards rushing in the Panthers' 21-13 victory. South Alabama running back Xavier Johnson is the Jags' career rushing leader and entered the game averaging 6.0 yards per carry and 64 yards per game, but GSU held him to minus-3 yards. T

The Panthers limited South Alabama to 338 total yards, 70 of them coming on USA's late touchdown. In addition to interceptions by Bryan Williams and Cedric Stone, the Panthers broke up seven passes, including two each by Jerome Smith and B.J. Clay, and collected six tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

**MAKING HISTORY:** Safety Bryan Williams now owns a share of the Georgia State records for interceptions in a game (2),

THE 2017 SEASON marks the inaugural year of "Pete" Petit (pronounced puh-TEET) Field at Georgia State Stadium, the former Turner Field and venue for the Atlanta Braves that has been converted into the new home of Panther football.

Georgia State Stadium features 25,000 seats, a FieldTurf playing surface, the Panthers' 7,500-square foot locker room, and a 5,600-square foot video board that is the eighth-largest in college football.

The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the baseball outfield.

Georgia State Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017

Future phases of the redevelopment of this iconic property will include a new Georgia State baseball stadium, to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities will be developed by Carter and Associates.

> Williams grabbed his fourth interception of the season and the sixth of his career on the second play of the game against South Alabama and returned it to the 8-yard line to

- set up a touchdown. He tied both the GSU season and career marks with that pick.
- > That was the second straight game in which he intercepted a pass on the game's opening possession to set up a score; he also had a pick on Troy's first drive.
- > He tied the GSU single-game record by grabbing two interceptions, both in the end zone, in the 28-0 shutout at Charlotte.
- > Williams also made history this season as the first Panther to play a sixth season. The Miami, Fla., native began his GSU career in 2012 under head coach Bill Curry. He was granted a sixth season of eligibility after missing almost two full seasons (2013 and 2014) with a back injury.
- > Williams' older brother, Arthur, was a tight end for the Panthers in their first two seasons (2010-11), meaning that Georgia State has never played a football game without one of the Williams brothers on the roster.

#### A RECORD FOR RECORDS: The

Panthers enjoyed the most prolific offensive day in GSU history and also reached milestones on defense and special teams in their 47-37 win at ULM (Oct. 14):

- > School-record 670 yards of total offense and 47 points, the most ever for GSU against an FBS opponent.
- > Conner Manning completed 26 of 35 passes for 446 yards, the second-highest single-game total in GSU history and the most for any Sun Belt quarterback this season. His four touchdown passes tied the GSU record. He was named a Manning Award Star of the Week, a Davey O'Brien Award "Great 8" and a nominee for FBS Football HERO of the Week.
- > With his third straight 100-yard game, Penny Hart set the Georgia State record with 190 yards receiving and tied his own school record with 11 catches. He caught touchdowns of 50, 25 and 22 yards. He was named Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Week and was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.
- > The Georgia State defense set a school record with seven sacks.
- > Defensive end Marterious Allen collected three sacks to tie the GSU single-game record. He also recovered a fumble and was named Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week.
- > Michael Shaw had 1.5 sacks in the game. That gives him 22.5 career tackles behind the line of scrimmage, making him Georgia State's career leader.
- > Sophomore Devin Gentry scored his first two career touchdowns. First he took a short pass from Conner Manning and turned it into a 69-yard touchdown for the Panthers' longest pass play of the season. Then he scored a 15-yard rushing touchdown on a reverse.
- > Sophomore Brandon Wright kicked a career-long 46-yard field goal and nailed

- a 71-yard punt that was downed at the 8-yard line for the third-longest punt in GSU history.
- > Georgia State rushed for 224 yards, the fifth-best rushing effort in school history and best since 2012.
- > Senior Kyler Neal led the Panthers with 65 yards rushing as he topped the 1,000-yard mark for his career.
- > The Panthers sealed the victory with a fourth-quarter touchdown drive that covered 15 plays and 95 yards while eating up nearly eight minutes on the clock.

**ELLIOTT TAKES THE REINS:** Formerly the co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at South Carolina, Georgia State's first-year head coach Shawn Elliott is a coaching veteran with 20 years of experience in winning programs. He spent the last seven seasons with the Gamecocks after 13 years at Appalachian State, his alma mater.

In 20 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 19 winnings seasons, 16 teams that reached a bowl game or the NCAA playoffs and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

#### **GLENN SMITH SHOWS VERSATILITY:**

Senior Glenn Smith ranks third in GSU history with 2,726 career all-purpose yards, including 771 yards rushing, 929 yards receiving on 85 catches and 1026 yards on 44 kickoff returns. He is the first GSU player to reach 500 yards in both rushing and receiving yards.

After working primarily at receiver this season, Smith moved to running back at Charlotte and rushed for 90 yards and two touchdowns on a school-record 31 carries. He also caught four passes for 39 yards in the victory.

In the win at Coastal Carolina, Smith returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown, led the rushing attack with 74 yards on 23 carries and caught three passes for 13 yards for a career-high 201 all-purpose yards.

#### PANTHERS PITCH FIRST SHUTOUT:

Georgia State's 28-0 victory over Charlotte featured the first ever shutout in school history. GSU held the 49ers 273 total yards and 3-of-15 on third downs, including five three-and-outs.

MOBLEY ON THE MOVE: After making 24 career starts at center, junior Gabe Mobley moved to right guard against Penn State (Game 2) following a last-minute injury and has been starting there since. With Mobley's move, junior Jamal Paxton has taken over as the starting center.

If anyone can learn a new position quickly, it should be Mobley, who earned his degree in just three years and is now pursuing a law degree.

LINEMAN'S DREAM: The win at Charlotte featured one of the craziest plays in Georgia State history when Brandon Wright's 25-yard field goal attempt was tipped at the line of scrimmage. A Charlotte player attempted to field the ball in the end zone but fumbled it, and GSU offensive lineman Shamarious Gilmore recovered it in the end zone for the touchdown. The redshirt freshman guard is the first Panther lineman to score a touchdown.

#### **MEMPHIS CANCELS GAME AT GSU:**

Georgia State was scheduled to host Memphis on Sept. 30, but the game was cancelled after Memphis and the American Athletic Conference elected to reschedule the Tigers game against UCF that was postponed by Hurricane Irma. With the cancellation, Georgia State must now play four straight road games, and the Panthers will go 50 days between home games.

A PERFECT 10: Georgia State ranks among the national leaders with 10 current team members who have already earned their undergraduate degrees.

Offensive lineman Gabe Mobley graduated in just three years and is now enrolled in law school at Georgia State.

Also among the Georgia State graduates are safety Bryan Williams, defensive end Mackendy Cheridor, cornerback B.J. Clay, running back Kyler Neal, defensive lineman Julien Laurent, linebacker Trey Payne, long snapper Daniel Zeigler

The group also includes a pair of graduate transfers, Conner Manning (Utah, 2015) and Christian Cumberlander (San Diego State, 2017), who earned their degrees at other institutions.

#### **SULLY SHINES ON AND OFF THE**

**FIELD:** Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan has collected accolades for his performance on the field and in the classroom. He is one of one of 13 national finalists at all levels for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments® for the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame. The trophy recognizes the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. Majoring in journalism with a 3.84 grade point average, he has been named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team the last two seasons and the Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's List for three straight years.

On the field, he is a four-year starter, two time All-Sun Belt Conference selection and Georgia State's career leader in interceptions and passes defended.

THROWN FOR A LOSS: Junior outside linebacker Michael Shaw added two more tackles behind the line of scrimmage against South Alabama, raising his Georgia State career record to 24.5 tackles for loss. He is just ahead of teammate Mackendy Cheridor and former linebacker Joseph Peterson.

Cheridor, the senior defensive end, also ranks second in career sacks and tied for first in fumbles forced (4), while Shaw is tied for third in sacks.

**IT'S ACADEMIC:** The Georgia State football team has performed extremely well in the classroom:

- > The team posted a record GPA of 3.03 for the spring 2017 semester.
- > Fourteen Panthers were named to the 2016-17 Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's List (GPA of 3.5 or higher), while another 24 were tabbed to the Sun Belt Honor Roll (GPA of 3.0-3.49).
- > Georgia State's overall athletic program was honored with the Sun Belt Conference Graduation Rate Award in 2016.
- > This year's team features two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection Chandon Sullivan.

**PANTHER PROS:** Despite Georgia State's brief history, four Panther alumni have played in the NFL, and four are currently on NFL rosters.

- > A member of Georgia State's inaugural team in 2010, receiver Albert Wilson is in his fourth season with the Kansas City Chiefs. He was an undrafted free agent in 2014.
- > Wil Lutz, GSU's placekicker from 2012-15, is now the kicker for the New Orleans Saints. Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens, he was picked up by the Saints just before the 2016 season opener. He was twice named NFL Special Teams Player of the Week in 2016.
- > Fourth-year offensive tackle Ulrick John recently joined the Green Bay Packers from the Arizona Cardinals, for whom he started three games in 2016. John was selected in the seventh round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts, then played in two games for the Miami Dolphins in 2015.
- > After a record-setting career at Georgia State, wide receiver Robert Davis was selected by the Washington Redskins in the sixth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. He is on the Redskins' practice squad.
- > GSU's first draft pick and first to appear in an NFL game was defensive tackle Christo Bilukidi in 2013. He played three seasons (2013-15) in the NFL with Oakland, Cincinnati and Baltimore.

**INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR:** Four key members of the Georgia State lineup hail from outside the United States:

- > Starting offensive tackle Sebastian Willer is a native of Germany who moved to the U.S. with his family while in high school.
- > Standout defensive end Mackendy Cheridor came to the U.S. from Haiti when he was five.
- > Starting noseguard Julien Laurent is from Toronto, Canada.
- > Punter Oliver Holdenson is from Melbourne, Australia and attended the famed ProKick Australia academy that has produced numerous college and NFL punters.

# **HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT**

Formerly the co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at South Carolina and a coaching veteran with 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by President Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016.

Elliott takes over a Georgia State program that has been playing football for just seven seasons but is positioned for growth with the move into Georgia State Stadium, coupled with the university's continued rise in size and stature.

Before he even coaches his first game at Georgia State, Elliott's impact on the program has been immediately felt. On the recruiting trail, he and his staff quickly assembled an impressive 2017 recruiting class that was the most highly-regarded group of GSU signees yet. And in the classroom, his Panthers achieved an all-time high with a 3.03 grade-point average for the spring semester.

Elliott worked the last seven seasons at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott served 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State. He was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

In 20 seasons as a Division I assistant coach, Elliott has been a part of 19 winning seasons and helped coach 16 teams to the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up

a school-record 452.3 yards per game, including 198.5 yards on the ground and 253.8 through the air.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State. Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from a car accident in 2000.

As a player, Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

#### TENNESSEE STATE 17, GEORGIA STATE 10

Game 1: Aug. 31, 2017 • 7 p.m. (ESPN3) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State fell to Tennessee State 17-10 in the inaugural game at Georgia State Stadium, and the debut for GSU head coach Shawn Elliott.

A crowd of 24,333 filled the former Turner Field, which has been converted into a new home for Georgia State football, but the Panthers (0-1) struggled offensively, hurting themselves with four turnovers.

Tennessee State (1-0) quarterback Treon Harris, the Florida transfer, passed for 145 yards and rushed for 91, including a 12-yard touchdown in the third quarter that proved to be the difference.

"We appreciate everyone who came out here tonight, and we appreciate all the effort that went into this," Elliott said. "It was a great way to open this stadium except for the game itself. And that's tough.

"You look at our defense, I thought they played their tails off," Elliott continued. "They went out there and gave us the opportunity to compete, gave us the chance to tie the game. I thought they fought, but they stayed on the field a long, long time. And that's something that is unacceptable for us, offensively. You look at our stats, I think we rushed for 49 yards today. 49 yards. That's something that's hard to do. And four turnovers."

GSU quarterback Conner Manning completed 14 of 17 passes for 159 yards but left the game in the third quarter due to injury. Taz Bateman caught six passes for 74 yards and a touchdown an rushed 11 times for 31 yards.

After trailing 10-3 at the half, Georgia State appeared to be driving for the tying score early in the third quarter when Conner Manning's 59-yard pass to Ari Werts put GSU at the Tennessee State 13. But the Panthers came up short on 4th-andgoal at the 4-yard line by the slimmest of margins. Georgia State was originally awarded the first down, but a review changed the spot to an inch shy of the marker.

Two plays later, Seth Rowland broke the through the middle for a 59-yard gain for the Tigers, setting up Harris' 12-yard touchdown run that put TSU ahead 17-3.

GSU backup quarterback Aaron Winchester found Bateman for a short gain in the flat, and the GSU running back turned it into a 39-yard touchdown, pulling GSU within 17-10 with 11 minutes left.

The Panthers' defense forced a three-and-out to give Georgia State possession at midfield with nine minutes to go, but GSU fumbled on the next play.

Georgia State had one final chance as the defense held late in the game to force a punt with 1:45 left. The Panthers took over at their own 44, but Winchester was intercepted and Tennessee State ran out the clock.

"We'll come back out and regroup," Elliott said. "We've got an open date and 17 days to prepare, and we'll go to work. One win or one loss does not make a season. It's going to be a tough loss to swallow for the next 17 days. We've got to find out what we're made of, and find out quickly."

#### PENN STATE 56, GEORGIA STATE 0

Game 2: Sept. 16, 2017 • 7:30 p.m. (BTN) Beaver Stadium • University Park, Pa.

Georgia State (0-2) fell at No. 5 Penn State 56-0 Saturday night at Beaver Stadium.

Penn State (3-0) quarterback Trace McSorley passed for 309 yards and four touchdowns. Running back Saquon Barkley rushed for just 47 yards on 10 carries, but caught four passes for 142 yards, including an 85-yard catch-and-run touchdown.

Taz Bateman rushed for a career-high 100 yards on 29 carries. The junior running back also caught three passes for 19 yards and returned one punt for a total of 120 all-purpose yards.

Backup quarterback Aaron Winchester added 39 yards rushing, and receiver Penny Hart caught seven passes for 56 yards.

Georgia State quarterback Conner Manning passed for 133 yards on 16 completions but committed four turnovers with three interceptions and a fumble. Penn State converted each miscue into a touchdown.

"We fought hard," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "You look up at that score and say, 'What can you be proud of your football for?' but I saw a lot of positives and a lot of players who took a step

forward. We certainly have to a lot of work to do, and we have to get better. You can't give up cheap points. The turnovers can't happen. But our team will learn from this one, I promise you that.

"We gave so many cheap points away, and you just can't do that," Elliott continued. "I would have liked to make them earn it a little bit more. Penn State is a good football team. Hats off to Coach [James] Franklin and his staff."

Georgia State plays its second straight road game next Saturday at Charlotte with a 6 p.m. kickoff at Jerry Richardson Stadium.

#### NOTES:

Taz Bateman's 100-yard game is the first for the Panthers since 2014. His 29 carries in the game are the school record.

At No. 5, Penn State is the second-highest ranked team that Georgia State has faced in its eight seasons of football, and the highest since the Panthers played at No. 1 Alabama in 2013.

True freshman noseguard Dontae Wilson had a sack and a caused fumble.

The crowd of 102,746 is the largest that Georgia State has ever played before. The previous high was 101,621 at Alabama in 2010.

A last-minute injury to starting right guard Pat Bartlett forced the Panthers to juggle their offensive line. Gabe Mobley, who had started 23 straight games at center, moved to right guard, and Jamal Paxton made his first career start at center.

## **GEORGIA STATE 28, CHARLOTTE 0**

Game 3: Sept. 23, 2017 • 6 p.m. (WCCB/CUSA.tv) Jerry Richardson Stadium • Charlotte, N.C.

Glenn Smith rushed for a career-high 90 yards and two touchdowns, and the Panther defense pitched the first shutout in school history as GSU won at Charlotte 28-0.

The win is the first for the Panthers (1-2) under first-year head coach Shawn Elliott.

Penny Hart tied the school record with 11 receptions for 141 yards, including a 32-yard touchdown catch. Quarterback Conner Manning passed for 250 yards on 26 completions, directing a balanced offense that did not commit a turnover.

Sixth-year senior safety Bryan Williams had two interceptions, both in the end zone, to lead the strong effort by the Georgia State defense, which held Charlotte (0-4) to 273 yards of offense. Williams' two picks tied a GSU record held by several players.

"What a great way to get our first win of the year," Elliott said. "Defensively we played well all night. We never gave them anything cheap. We had numerous true freshmen out there making plays. I am just proud because it was a great team effort."

The game featured one of the craziest plays in Georgia State history. With the Panthers leading 14-0 in the fourth quarter, Brandon Wright's 25-yard field goal attempt was tipped at the line of scrimmage. A Charlotte player attempted to field the ball in the end zone but fumbled it, and GSU offensive lineman Shamarious Gilmore recovered it in the end zone for the touchdown. That gave the Panthers a 21-0 lead with 14 minutes to play.

After a scoreless first quarter, Georgia State got on the board early in the second on Smith's 3-yard touchdown run that capped a 10-play, 66-yard drive. Manning hit five straight passes on the drive with three completions for 25 yards to Hart and two to Smith for 26 yards. Smith covered the other 15 yards on the ground, and his first touchdown of the season gave GSU a 7-0 lead with 12:29 to play in the first half

That was still the score when Charlotte missed a 54-yard field attempt, giving the Panthers the ball at their 36 with three minutes to go in the half. On third-and-13, Manning hit Hart for 20 yards and a first down. After consecutive short completions to freshman Tamir Jones, Manning found Hart down the right side line, and Hart made a nice spin move and then dragged his defender into the end zone

for a 32-yard touchdown. That gave Georgia State a 14-0 lead with 44 seconds on the clock.

Charlotte quarterback Hasaan Klugh hooked up with Mark Quattlebaum for a 52-yard completion and a 49ers first down at the GSU 12 with 16 seconds left in the half, but the Georgia State defense held as Williams intercepted Klugh in the end zone. That sent the Panthers into the locker room with a 14-0 advantage.

Smith took over as the primary ball-carrier after starter Taz Bateman left with an injury early in the game and Kyler Neal already out for the game. Smith carried the ball a school-record 31 times and nearly matched Bateman's 100-yard effort from last week at Penn State. Smith, who also caught four passes for 39 yards for a total of 129 all-purpose yards, finished the scoring with a 1-yard touchdown run with 22 seconds to play.

"There's nothing easy about getting wins," Elliott said. "A lot of adversity happened to us tonight, but our guys continued to strive and believe and build off one another – the offense off the defense and the defense off the offense. It's a special feeling when you see guys go out there and work toward a common goal and achieve it."

#### GEORGIA STATE 27, COASTAL CAROLINA 21

Game 4: Oct. 7, 2017 • 6:30 p.m. (ESPN3) Brooks Stadium • Conway, S.C.

Penny Hart caught eight passes for 132 yards and a touchdown, and Glenn Smith returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to lead Georgia State to a 27-21 victory in its Sun Belt Conference opener at Coastal Carolina.

Georgia State (2-2, 1-0 Sun Belt) quarterback Conner Manning passed for 273 yards and one touchdown, and Kyler Neal and DeMarcus Kirk scored rushing touchdowns. Kirk's 4-yard touchdown put the Panthers ahead 27-14 with three minutes left, and then GSU held on for the victory.

"It wasn't pretty, but I don't care. That's a win!" head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We're 1-0 in the conference. They played their tails off."

Smith took the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to give the Panthers the early 7-0 lead. The senior running back fielded the ball near the right hash and appeared to be bottled up at the 20-yard line. But he broke out of the pile and around the left side to daylight, breaking a tackle at the GSU 20 to reach the end zone.

That is the sixth kickoff return for touchdown in GSU history and the second on the opening kickoff, following Darren McCray vs. Campbell in 2010.

Coastal Carolina (1-4, 0-2) took the ensuing kickoff and drove deep into Georgia State territory, but the Panther defense held on three straight plays inside the 6-yard line and then forced a missed field goal.

Georgia State converted the missed field goal into an 11-play, 80-yard touchdown drive. Manning completed four passes to Hart on the march, including a short shovel pass that Hart grabbed and raced around the left end for an 8-yard touchdown. That put GSU ahead 14-0 with three minutes left in the first quarter.

Coastal Carolina got on the board midway through the second quarter on Tyler Keane's 33-yard touchdown pass to Omar Black, but the Panthers answered right away with a 65-yard scoring drive. The drive was aided by three costly Chanticleer penalties, but Manning had two key third down conversions with a 17-yard completion to Tamir Jones on 3rd-and-six and an 11-yard rush down on 3rd-and-10 at the 14. That set up Kyler Neal's 1-yard scoring run and gave the Panthers a 21-7 lead with 2:20 left in the first half.

After the Chanticleers pulled within 21-14 with seven minutes left, Manning led the Panthers on a 91-yard scoring drive, keyed by a 52-yard completion to tight end Ari Werts, who was left wide open on a wheel route and raced down the sideline to the CCU 23. Kirk finished the drive with his 4-yard touchdown run. The Panthers missed the extra point but led 27-14 with three minutes left.

Coastal managed a quick touchdown, moving 80 yards on six plays in just over a minute to pull within 27-21 with 1:50 to play. But Georgia State recovered the onsides kick and managed one first down to run out the clock.

Smith finished with 74 yards rushing on 23 carries, three receptions for 13 yards and two kickoff returns for 114 yards to total a career-high 201 all-purpose yards. Werts had four catches for 92 yards, and Jones added two receptions for 24 yards.

"We executed a lot of good pass plays. We've got to get a little better in the run game, but most of all, we've got to finish better," Hart said. "I'm probably being a little too hard on myself and my team, but that's what is going to propel us to be better. We've got to finish a lot better than that.

"There is definitely such a thing as an ugly win,

but you never want to downgrade a win. You get in the film room and learn from it and get better," Hart added.

#### **GEORGIA STATE 47, UL MONROE 37**

Game 5: Oct. 14, 2017 • 5 p.m. (ESPN3) Malone Stadium • Monroe, La.

Led by Conner Manning and Penny Hart, Georgia State used a record-setting offensive performance to win its third straight road game and move to 2-0 atop the Sun Belt Conference with a 47-37 victory at ULM.

Manning directed an attack that piled up a school record 670 yards of total offense with Georgia State's most points ever against an FBS team. The senior quarterback completed 26 of 35 passes for a career-high 446 yards, the second-highest single-game total in school history, and

tied the GSU record with four touchdown passes.

Much of Manning's yardage was to Hart, who set the Georgia State (3-2, 2-0 Sun Belt) record with 190 yards receiving on 11 catches, which ties his own school mark. Hart, who recorded his third straight 100-yard game, caught touchdowns of 50, 25 and 22 yards.

"I can tell you one thing, we're pleased to death with this win. We never take winning for granted," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I'm very proud of the effort - our guys fought hard. We made it interesting in the fourth quarter, but we're 2-0 in the conference, and someone has to come knock us off. We're going to continue to work to see how good we can be."

Georgia State also rushed for a season-high 224 yards, despite losing its top two backs to injury. Kyler Neal rushed for 65 yards on 14 carries, including a 1-yard touchdown, and the senior topped the 1,000-yard mark for his career. Demarcus Kirk had 56 yards rushing, and Taz Bateman gained 43 yards before leaving the game.

"Everybody took a turn at running back. Kyler Neal and DeMarcus Kirk came in and gave us a great effort," Elliott said. "Who knows who's going to show up at running back next week! Hats off the offensive line, they did a good job of moving their front."

Sophomore Devin Gentry scored the first two touchdowns of his career on a 69-yard reception and a 15-yard run.

The Panthers wasted no time getting on the scoreboard on their first possession as Hart got a step on his defender down the sideline and made a spectacular one-handed, overhead catch for a 50-yard touchdown, his third of the season.

ULM's Marcus Williams returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown to give the Warhawks a brief 7-6 lead, but the Panthers answered immediately. On 3rd-and-4 from the GSU 31, Gentry took a short pass and raced down the left sideline for a 69-yard touchdown, the first of his career and Georgia State's longest pass of the season. That put the Panthers up 13-7 less than six minutes into the game.

Gentry's second touchdown came on a reverse play as he took a flip from Bateman and ran around the left side into the end zone for a 15-yard rushing touchdown.

Brandon Wright added a career-long 46-yard field goal, his second of the day, on the final play of the first half to send the Panthers into the locker room with a 26-10 lead.

Hart scored caught two more touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the third quarter as Georgia State extended its lead to 40-17 with more minutes to play in the third quarter. Both were two more highlight-reel catches, covering 25 and 22 vards.

After a ULM touchdown, Georgia State sealed the victory with a 15-play, 95-yard drive that eight up nearly eight minutes on the clock. Neal capped the drive with a 1-yard scoring run, and the Panthers led 47-24 with eight minutes to play.

ULM (3-3, 3-1 Sun Belt) managed two touchdowns in the final three minutes for the final 47-31 margin. "I wasn't too pleased with the points we spotted them on special teams, and the fourth quarter was a little disappointing, but our defense played well

The Panthers collected a school-record seven sacks, including three by Marterious Allen, which ties the GSU record. Allen, the junior defensive end, also had a fumble recovery. Michael Shaw added 1.5 sacks to become the Panthers' career leader in tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

#### TROY 34, GEORGIA STATE 10

Game 6: Oct. 21, 2017 • 2 p.m. (ESPN3) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State had its three-game winning streak snapped with a 34-10 loss to Troy in Saturday's Homecoming game at Georgia State Stadium.

Playing their first home game in 51 days, the Panthers (3-3, 3-1 Sun Belt Belt) struggled to move the ball against the top defense in the Sun Belt. Conner Manning passed for 255 yards, including a touchdown pass to Penny Hart, but the GSU quarterback was sacked four times and the Panthers managed on 52 yards rushing.

Georgia State couldn't capitalize on the opportunities it did have with two missed field goals, a fourth down stop and an interception in the red zone.

"It was a very, very disappointing game for us, after playing pretty well the last three weeks," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "A lot had to do with a good Troy team. They came out and played exceptionally well. They controlled the line of scrimmage on both sides.

"Our message to our team was that you have to bring everything you've got every single week," Elliott continued. "This is going to be a very valuable lesson for that our football team will learn about how we prepare after having some type of success. We've got to play to the best of our ability each and every week to have a chance to compete, and today we certainly didn't do that."

Glenn Smith led the Panthers with eight catches for 70 yards, while freshman Tamir Jones finished with 75 yards on five catches. Hart, among the top receivers in the country, caught a 3-yard touchdown, but was held to just five catches for 32 yards and a touchdown.

Georgia State got off to a good start as senior Bryan Williams intercepted Troy quarterback Brandon Silvers on the third play of the game, giving the Panthers the ball at the Troy 39-yard line, Brandon Williams booted a 30-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead. Williams' interception is his team-leading third of the season.

But Troy (5-2, 2-1 Sun Belt) answered quickly with Silver's 49-yard touchdown pass to John Johnson. The Trojans added two more touchdowns on back-to-back possessions early in the second half to move ahead 21-3.

The Panthers missed opportunities to pull closer. After a missed field goal, Manning drove the GSU to a first-and-goal at the Troy 5 in the final two minutes of the half, but the Panthers could not punch it in as Manning's fourth-down pass from the 4 was incomplete.

Silvers led Troy (5-2, 2-1 Sun Belt) with 335 yards and two touchdowns through the air on 25-of-35 passing.

## GEORGIA STATE 21, SOUTH ALABAMA 13

Game 7: Oct. 26, 2017 • 7:30 p.m. (ESPNU) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Conner Manning threw touchdown passes to Glenn Smith and Penny Hart to back a strong effort by the Georgia State defense in the Panthers' 21-13 win over South Alabama Thursday night at Georgia State Stadium, giving GSU its first win in its new home.

The Panther defense set a school record by allowing just 41 yards rushing to lead Georgia State (4-3, 3-1 Sun Belt) to its fourth win the last five games.

Manning completed 17 passes for 195 yards. Hart finished with six catches for 98 yards, including an 8-yard touchdown catch. Smith totaled 175 all-purpose yards with 73 yard rushing, two catches for 36 yards with a 2-yard touchdown, and 66 kickoff return yards.

For the second straight game, safety Bryan Williams grabbed an interception on the opponent's opening possession to set up a Georgia State score.

Williams intercepted Dallas Davis at the USA 36 and returned it 30 yards to 6. On third-and-goal, Manning hit Glenn Smith for the 2-yard touchdown and the early 7-0 lead.

That was Williams' fourth interception of 2017, tying the Georgia State season record, and the sixth of his career, equaling the Panthers' career mark.

Georgia State added to its lead with a 95-yard drive late in the first half, with Smith doing much of the work. On first down at the GSU 37, Smith rushed for gain of six yards, then 16 yards to the

USA 41. On the next play, he took a short pass over the middle and raced around left side down to the 7. Then Kyler Neal finished the drive with a 7-yard scoring run, putting GSU ahead 14-3 with 1:43 left in the half.

Meanwhile the Georgia State defense held South Alabama (3-5, 2-2 Sun Belt) to just a field goal in the first half, sending the Panthers into the locker room with a 14-3 lead.

Another South Alabama field goal was the only scoring in the third quarter, cutting Georgia State's lead to 14-6. But the Panthers responded on their next possession with a 79-yard touchdown drive, keyed by Hart, who caught a 45-yard pass down to the South Alabama 20. After Smith covered the first 10 yards on the ground, the Panthers faced 3rd-and-goal at the 8 when Manning found Hart in the corner of the end zone for the touchdown. That put GSU ahead 21-6 with 13 minutes left.

South Alabama made things interesting late in the game as Davis hit Jamarius Way for a 75-yard touchdown to make it a one-score game with two minutes left.

The Jaguars recovered the onside kick but managed only one short completion before GSU forced three straight incompletions to seal the win. Chandon Sullivan broke up Davis' fourth-down pass intended for Way.

"It's a great Thursday night here at Georgia State Stadium," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "First win in this stadium feels great, but we sure do make it interesting, don't we? Man, we really do.

"Let me just say our defense played a phenomenal football game, they really did," Elliott continued. "They had them on their heels all game long. Our secondary, our linebackers, our defensive front, just made plays all night. Hate to see that throw there at the end. And we can't let that happen."

The Georgia State defense held South Alabama to 338 yards, 70 of them coming on USA's late touchdown. The Panthers broke up seven passes and collected six tackles behind the line of scrimmage, holding the Jaguars to a net of 41 yards rushing.

"Offensively we did enough to go out there and put points on the board to make it stand and fought very hard," Elliott said. "South Alabama is a well-coached football team, and they came in knowing exactly what we did."

Georgia State now faces two straight road games, beginning next Saturday at Georgia Southern (3 p.m.). The Panthers' next home game is Nov. 25 vs. Appalachian State.

"I told our team in there, everything that we want to accomplish, everything that we've set as our goals--we haven't set a lot of goals--they're all obtainable," Elliott said. "We still get to move forward, we strive to be where we want to be, but we've got to clean a lot of stuff up."

#### GEORGIA STATE 21, GEORGIA SOUTHERN 17

Game 8: Nov. 4, 2017 • 3 p.m. (ESPN3) Paulson Stadium • Statesboro, Ga.

Conner Manning found Penny Hart for a 9-yard touchdown with 2:31 to play to give Georgia State a 21-17 come-from-behind win over Georgia Southern Saturday afternoon at Paulson Stadium, the Panthers' third straight win over their in-state rival.

The Hart touchdown completed a six-play, 31-yard drive that started when Georgia Southern's Wesley Fields fumbled and Georgia State outside linebacker James Traylor recovered with just over five minutes to play.

But the story of the day was the Georgia State (5-3, 4-1 Sun Belt) defense, which kept the Panthers in the ballgame until the offense found its rhythm.

After the defense set up the go-ahead score, they still had to make one last stand as Georgia Southern (0-8, 0-4) drove to the GSU 15 in the closing seconds. But linebacker Trey Payne tackled quarterback Shai Werts to end the game.

"The way that game ended was exactly what that game should have come down do, with our defense having to make a great stop," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "They played unbelievable all day to give us an opportunity to win this football game. You can't mention one guy, not with the way they played and the way they continued to fight. It was an unbelievable team effort.

"I told the team at halftime, 'Listen, we're playing 30 more minutes, so let's do something we'll remember for the rest of our lives.' And I'm so proud of our guys. I'm proud of our University, I'm proud of our fans, I'm proud of our band. I've been down here a number of times as a coach ... And it always feels good win in Statesboro!"

Hart finished the game with eight catches for a school-record 191 yards, including a career-long 70-yard reception that set up the Panthers' second touchdown. He broke the record of 190 yards that he set three games ago at ULM.

Manning went 22-for-37 for 319 yards and two touchdowns with Glenn Smith on the receiving end of eight of those completions. Smith finished with 57 yards through the air while also adding 11 rushes for 49 yards.

Georgia State jumped in front quickly. On the game's first offensive play, cornerback Chandon Sullivan picked up a fumble near the sideline and raced 28 yards for the touchdown, giving the Panthers a 7-0 lead just 17 seconds into the game.

Sullivan is the first Panther to score two defensive touchdowns in his career; he also had the first "pick six" in GSU history vs. Arkansas State in 2015.

That marked the third consecutive contest in which the Georgia State defense forced a turnover on the game's first possession after safety Bryan Williams' back-to-back interceptions vs. Troy and South Alabama.

But Georgia Southern answered with an 80-yard drive, capped by Myles Campbell's 8-yard touchdown reception, tying the game at 7-7 with seven minutes to play in the first quarter.

The score remained 7-7 until late in the first half. After punt, the Eagles took over at midfield with 47 seconds left and managed to get in position for Tyler Bass' 48-yard field goal that gave Georgia Southern a 10-7 halftime lead.

Georgia State appeared to take the lead after driving down the field on the opening possession of the second half, but a touchdown was wiped out by a pass interference penalty and the Panthers missed a field goal.

After Georgia Southern took a 17-7 lead late in the third quarter, the Panthers responded immediately. Manning hit Hart over the middle for a 70-yard completion down to the 5-yard line. Two plays later, Manning found freshman tight end Roger Carter in the corner of the end zone for the 4-yard touchdown, and the Panthers were within 17-14 with 27 seconds left in the third quarter.

"Penny never ceases to amaze me," Elliott said. "He does these things every single day on the practice field, so it's not a surprise when he comes out here and makes these plays. We're thrilled to death to have him on our football team.

"But it took an army. He made the great catch, but it took the protection and a great throw. When you pull out a victory like this, it's hard to pinpoint one individual."
