THE KICKOFF: Earning their second bowl berth in three years, Georgia State will face Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl on Saturday, Dec. 16 at 2:30 p.m. at Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Fla.

> Under first-year head coach Shawn Elliott, the Panthers (6-5, 5-3 Sun Belt Conference) became bowl eligible with their Nov. 11 win at Texas State (despite losing a game to Hurricane Irma) and finished fourth in the Sun Belt.

> Georgia State's eight-year-old football program is playing in its second bowl game in three seasons.

> The Panthers first bowl appearance was also in the AutoNation Cure Bowl as the Panthers fell 27-16 to San Jose State in the inaugural game in 2015. *See page 6 for more details on that game.*

> Five of Georgia State's six victories this season have come on the road.

> Sophomore receiver Penny Hart is the Sun Belt's leading receiver with a school-record 73 catches for 1,094 yards and eight touchdowns. He is eighth in the nation in receiving yards (99.5) per game and 12th in receptions per game (6.6).

> Senior quarterback Conner Manning is averaging 260.9 yards passing per game (third in the Sun Belt) with 13 touchdowns. He leads the league in completion percentage at 63.7 percent.

> Senior cornerback and Senior Bowl invitee Chandon Sullivan was one of 13 national finalists at all levels for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments® for the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame. The trophy recognizes the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

> Sullivan was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District® team for the third straight year. He is joined on this year's team by junior offensive lineman Gabe Mobley and senior noseguard Julien Laurent. All three are now eligible for the CoSIDA Academic All-America® team.

HART HEADLINES NINE ON ALL-SUN BELT TEAM:

Penny Hart, the leading receiver in the Sun Belt Conference and a first-team all-conference selection for the second time, headlines nine Panthers named to the All-Sun Belt Conference teams.

> Hart is just the second Panther to earn first-team All-Sun Belt honors twice, following receiver Robert Davis in 2015 and 2016.

> Joining Hart on the All-Sun Belt team are a quartet of third-team honorees in cornerback Chandon Sullivan, linebacker Michael Shaw, defensive lineman Marterious Allen and running back-receiver Glenn Smith, who was chosen as an all-purpose player.

> Quarterback Conner Manning, safety Bryan Williams, defensive lineman Julien Laurent and offensive guard Shamarius Gilmore were named honorable mention All-Sun Belt.

PENNY FOR YOUR THOUGHTS:

Sophomore Penny Hart is enjoying a record-setting season and career for the Panthers:

> Hart is the Sun Belt's leading receiver with 73 receptions for 1,094 yards and eight touchdowns.

> He ranks eighth in FBS in receiving yards (99.5 per game) and 12th in receptions (6.6 per game).

> He has already set a new GSU season record with 73 catches.

> With 1,094 yards this season, Hart is the first Panther to record two 1,000-yard seasons. He is 83 yards behind Albert Wilson's GSU season record of 1,177 yards.

> After just 26 career games, Hart has amassed 152 receptions for 2,254 yards and 17 touchdowns. He ranks third in school history in all three categories, and the two receivers in front of him, Albert Wilson and Robert Davis, are in the NFL.

> Hart ranks fourth among all active FBS receivers with a career average of 5.96 receptions and fifth with 87.3 receiving yards per game.

> The 2015 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year and Freshman All-American played sparingly in just two games before his 2016 season

was ended by a broken foot. As a rookie in 2015, Hart led the Sun Belt with 5.5 receptions and 84.5 receiving yards per game, and he set the Sun Belt freshman record for receiving yards (1,099).

ELLIOTT IN THE POSTSEASON:

Although he is in his first bowl game as a head coach, Shawn Elliott is no stranger to bowl games and postseason success.

Formerly the co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at South Carolina, Elliott helped the Gamecocks reach six bowl games in his seven seasons there (2010-16). That includes a pair of victories in Orlando's Capital One Bowl (vs. Nebraska in the 2012 game and Wisconsin in the 2014 game), as well as wins in the 2013 Outback Bowl (vs. Michigan) and 2014 Independence Bowl (vs. Miami).

Before South Carolina, Elliott spent 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State, his alma mater. He helped the Mountaineers to 10 appearances in the NCAA FCS playoffs, highlighted by three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07, along with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals.

PANTHERS vs. WKU: Georgia State and Western Kentucky have met once before, a 44-28 victory for the Hilltoppers on Nov. 2, 2013 at the Georgia Dome. The Panthers were playing their first season of FBS and Sun Belt football, while WKU was in its final season in the Sun Belt.

> The only current Panther who played in that game was defensive end Mackendy Cheridor, who had three tackles as a true freshman.

> Five other current Panthers were on the roster: Kyler Neal, Bryan Williams, Trey Payne, Sebastian Willer and Daniel Zeigler.

> The teams have played one common opponent this season. GSU shut out Charlotte 28-0, while WKU downed the 49ers 45-14.



THE 2017 SEASON marks the inaugural year of "Pete" Petit (pronounced puh-TEET) Field at Georgia State Stadium, the former Turner Field and venue for the Atlanta Braves that has been converted into the new home of Panther football.

Georgia State Stadium features 25,000 seats, a FieldTurf playing surface, the Panthers' 7,500-square foot locker room, and a 5,600-square foot video board that is the eighth-largest in college football.

The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the baseball outfield.

Georgia State Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

Future phases of the redevelopment of this iconic property will include a new Georgia State baseball stadium, to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities will be developed by Carter and Associates.

SULLY SHINES ON AND OFF THE FIELD: Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan has collected accolades for his performance on the field and in the classroom:

> Sullivan is one of one of 13 national finalists at all levels for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments® for the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame. The trophy recognizes the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

> Majoring in journalism with a 3.84 grade point average, he was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District® team for the third straight year. He has also been named to the Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's List for three straight years.

> Sullivan recently earned an invitation to the Reese's Senior Bowl, the first Panther to be invited.

> He is a four-year starter, three-time All-Sun Belt Conference selection and Georgia State's career leader in interceptions (7) and passes defended (25).

SELECT COMPANY FOR SMITH: Senior Glenn Smith is one of just three active FBS players with at least 1,000 yards rushing, 1,000 yards receiving and 1,000 return yards in their careers. The others are Phillip Lindsay of Colorado and Arkeel Newsome from Connecticut.

> Smith earned third-team All-Sun Belt honors as an all-purpose player. He ranks fourth in the league with 115.5 all-purpose yards per game. He is the Panthers' leading rusher, No. 2 receiver and kickoff return specialist.

> Alternating between receiver and running back during his career, Smith ranks third in GSU history with 3,303 career all-purpose yards. He is fifth in rushing yards (1,030), fifth in receptions (107), seventh in receiving yards (1,087) and second in kickoff return yards (1,186).

> Smith, who has had career-high 205 all-purpose yards in the win at Texas State. He rushed for a career-high 98 yards, caught five passes for 45 yards and returned three kickoffs for 62 yards.

> In his first game this season at running back at Charlotte, he rushed for 90 yards and two touchdowns on a school-record 31 carries. He also caught four passes for 39 yards in the victory.

> In the win at Coastal Carolina, Smith returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown, led the rushing attack with 74 yards on 23 carries and caught three passes for 13 yards for a career-high 201 all-purpose yards.

ROAD WARRIORS: Georgia State has won five straight road contests this season with victories at Charlotte, Coastal Carolina, ULM, Georgia Southern and Texas State.

> GSU is the only FBS school this season

to play four straight road games and the only one to win three straight road games (Charlotte, CCU, ULM) with no home games in between.

> GSU is tied for second nationally (with Oklahoma, San Diego State, Southern Miss, UCF, Central Michigan and Troy) with five road victories this season. Only Oklahoma State (6) has more.

> Due to the Memphis cancellation, the Panthers went 51 days between home games (from Aug. 31 to Oct. 21). Then, after playing two home games in six days, Georgia State had another four weeks away from home before finishing the season with two straight games at Georgia State Stadium.

IRON MEN ON O-LINE: Three of the five starters on the Georgia State offensive line have played every single offensive snap this season (781 offensive plays plus penalties). Sophomore left tackle Hunter Atkinson, redshirt freshman left guard Shamarius Gilmore and junior Gabe Mobley, who has split time between center and right guard, have not come out of any game this season.

SENIOR SENDOFF: Twenty-four Georgia State Panthers were honored on Senior Day vs. Idaho.

> The senior class includes the first sixth-year senior in Georgia State history in Bryan Williams, who arrived at Georgia State way back in 2012, and five fifth-year seniors. Others arrived as freshmen in 2014, and more joined the program as transfers.

> They have led the Panthers to a bowl game in two of the last three years and earned three straight victories over in-state rival Georgia Southern.

> With this class, Georgia State will graduate 11 starters and numerous key backups and special teams contributors.

FOURTH-QUARTER COMEBACKS: Georgia State executed fourth-quarter comebacks in back-to-back road victories at Georgia Southern and Texas State.

> Georgia State trailed 17-14 at Georgia Southern when James Traylor recovered a fumble at the Eagles' 31-yard line with five minutes left. On 3rd-and-goal, Conner Manning hit Penny Hart in the corner of the end zone for the game-winning, 9-yard touchdown with 2:31 to play.

> After Texas State took a 30-26 lead with 8:37 left, the Panthers responded immediately with a 7-play, 75-yard drive, capped by Kyler Neal's 22-yard touchdown run with 6:01 to play. The defense then stopped two Texas State drives, forcing a three-and-out and then stopping the Bobcats on downs with 1:37 left.

RECORDS FOR WRIGHT: Sophomore Brandon Wright set school records with four field goals and 15 points by kicking in the Panthers' 33-30 win at Texas State. He made two 48-yard field goals--his career long--and

also hit from 29 and 22 yards. In addition, Wright had six touchbacks on eight kickoffs and punted three times for a 46.3-yard average, including a 66-yarder.

One game later vs. Appalachian State, he bettered his career-long with a 50-yard field goal, equaling the second-longest kick in school history.

FUQUA NOMINATED FOR BROYLES

AWARD: Defensive coordinator and outside linebackers coach Nate Fuqua was nominated for the 2017 Broyles Award, which goes to the top assistant coach in the nation. More on Fuqua's defense:

> The Georgia State defense earned the first shutout in school history in the Panthers' 28-0 win at Charlotte, holding the 49ers to 273 total yards.

> The Panthers set another school record by holding South Alabama to a net of 41 yards rushing in a 21-13 victory.

> In wins over South Alabama, Georgia Southern and Texas State, the defense had to make a last stand to preserve the victory.

> The Panthers have held three teams under 100 yards rushing.

> Georgia State was the last FBS team in the nation to allow a 100-yard rusher (Game 10).

TWO BIG PLAYS FOR TRAYLOR: Senior outside linebacker James Traylor had a hand in two game-changing turnovers as Georgia State won for the fifth time in six games with a 21-17 come-from-behind victory at Georgia Southern.

> Traylor's fourth-quarter fumble recovery set up the Panthers' winning touchdown. With Georgia State trailing 17-14 in the final six minutes, Traylor recovered a fumble to give the Panthers possession at the Georgia Southern 31-yard line. That set up Penny Hart's go-ahead touchdown catch with 2:31 to play.

> On the game's first play from scrimmage, Traylor caused a fumble that teammate Chandon Sullivan scooped up and returned 28 yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 Georgia State lead.

A CASE FOR THE DEFENSE:

The Georgia State defense set a school record by holding South Alabama to a net of 41 yards rushing in the Panthers' 21-13 victory. South Alabama running back Xavier Johnson is the Jags' career rushing leader and entered the game averaging 6.0 yards per carry and 64 yards per game, but GSU held him to minus-3 yards.

The Panthers limited South Alabama to 338 total yards, 70 of them on USA's late touchdown. In addition to interceptions by Bryan Williams and Cedric Stone, GSU broke up seven passes, including two each by Jerome Smith and B.J. Clay, and made six tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

MAKING HISTORY: Safety Bryan Williams owns a share of the Georgia State records for interceptions in a game (2) and

season (4) while ranking second in career picks (6).

> Williams grabbed his fourth interception of the season and the sixth of his career on the second play of the game against South Alabama and returned it to the 8-yard line to set up a touchdown. He tied both the GSU season and career marks with that pick.

> That was the second straight game in which he intercepted a pass on the game's opening possession to set up a score; he also had a pick on Troy's first drive.

> He tied the GSU single-game record by grabbing two interceptions, both in the end zone, in the 28-0 shutout at Charlotte.

> Williams also made history this season as the first Panther to play a sixth season. The Miami, Fla., native began his GSU career in 2012 under head coach Bill Curry. He was granted a sixth season of eligibility after missing almost two full seasons (2013 and 2014) with a back injury.

> Williams' older brother, Arthur, was a tight end for the Panthers in their first two seasons (2010-11), meaning that Georgia State has never played a football game without one of the Williams brothers on the roster.

A RECORD FOR RECORDS:

The Panthers enjoyed the most prolific offensive day in GSU history and also reached milestones on defense and special teams in their 47-37 win at ULM (Oct. 14):

> School-record 670 yards of total offense and 47 points, the most ever for GSU against an FBS opponent.

> Conner Manning completed 26 of 35 passes for 446 yards, the second-highest single-game total in GSU history and the most for any Sun Belt quarterback this season. His four touchdown passes tied the GSU record. **He was named a Manning Award Star of the Week, a Davey O'Brien Award "Great 8" and a nominee for FBS Football HERO of the Week.**

> With his third straight 100-yard game, Penny Hart set the Georgia State record with 190 yards receiving and tied his own school record with 11 catches. He caught touchdowns of 50, 25 and 22 yards. **He was named Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Week and was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.**

> The Georgia State defense set a school record with seven sacks.

> Defensive end Marterious Allen collected three sacks to tie the GSU single-game record. He also recovered a fumble and was named **Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week.**

> Michael Shaw had 1.5 sacks in the game. That gives him 22.5 career tackles behind the line of scrimmage, making him Georgia State's career leader.

> Sophomore Devin Gentry scored his first two career touchdowns. First he took a short pass from Conner Manning and turned it

into a 69-yard touchdown for the Panthers' longest pass play of the season. Then he scored a 15-yard rushing touchdown on a reverse.

> Sophomore Brandon Wright kicked a 46-yard field goal and nailed a 71-yard punt that was downed at the 8-yard line for the third-longest punt in GSU history.

> GSU rushed for 224 yards, the fifth-best rushing effort in school history and best since 2012.

> The Panthers sealed the victory with a fourth-quarter touchdown drive that covered 15 plays and 95 yards while eating up nearly eight minutes on the clock.

PANTHERS PITCH FIRST SHUTOUT:

Georgia State's 28-0 victory over Charlotte featured the first ever shutout in school history. GSU held the 49ers 273 total yards and 3-of-15 on third downs, including five three-and-outs.

MOBLEY ON THE MOVE: Junior Gabe Mobley has made 34 career starts on the offensive line, including 33 straight games at either center or guard.

After 24 career starts at center, Mobley moved to guard for the first time this season in Game 2 at Penn State following a last-minute injury. He remained there until the Texas State game, when he started at center due to an injury to Jamal Paxton.

If anyone can learn another new position quickly, it should be Mobley, who earned his degree in just three years and is now pursuing a law degree.

LINEMAN'S DREAM: The win at Charlotte featured one of the craziest plays in Georgia State history when Brandon Wright's 25-yard field goal attempt was tipped at the line of scrimmage. A Charlotte player attempted to field the ball in the end zone but fumbled it, and GSU offensive lineman Shamariious Gilmore recovered it in the end zone for the touchdown. The redshirt freshman guard is the first Panther lineman to score a touchdown.

MEMPHIS CANCELS GAME AT

GSU: Georgia State was scheduled to host Memphis on Sept. 30, but the game was cancelled after Memphis and the American Athletic Conference elected to reschedule

the Tigers' game vs. UCF that was postponed by Hurricane Irma. With the cancellation, Georgia State played four straight road games and went 50 days between home games.

THROWN FOR A LOSS: Junior outside linebacker Michael Shaw is Georgia State's career leader in tackles for loss with 25, while teammate Mackendy Cheridor is right behind him at 23.

Cheridor, the senior defensive end, ranks second in career sacks, and Shaw is tied for third in.

Cheridor's last sack came last game vs. Idaho, and on it, he caused the quarterback to fumble, his GSU-record fifth career forced fumble.

2015 AUTONATION CURE BOWL

San Jose State 27, Georgia State 16

Dec. 19, 2015 • 7 p.m. (CBSSN)

Citrus Bowl Stadium • Orlando, Fla.

A late rally fell short and Georgia State fell to San Jose State 27-16 in the inaugural AutoNation Cure Bowl on Saturday night. In just their sixth year of existence, the Panthers were making their first bowl appearance in school history.

Sun Belt Player of the Year Nick Arbuckle was held to just 14-of-29 passing for 208 yards and two touchdowns but still finished the season with a Sun Belt Conference single-season record of 4,368 yards.

Georgia State (6-7) saw its four-game winning streak snapped, while San Jose State improved to 6-7.

With Georgia State trailing 13-7 early in the fourth quarter, Wil Lutz uncorked a 70-yard punt that rolled inside the SJSU 5, and the Panther defense forced a three-and-out. On the Spartans punt from the end zone, a poor snap gave Georgia State a safety, pulling the Panthers within 13-9 with 12:44 left.

After the free kick and a 24-yard return by Donovan Harden, the Panthers took over at the SJSU 36. Arbuckle hit freshman tight end Ari Werts for a first down at the 20, and two plays later Todd Boyd caught a short pass and raced 19 yards for the score. That gave Georgia State its first lead at 16-13 with 10:46 left.

But San Jose State regained the lead with a quick touchdown on a 42-yard touchdown run by quarterback Kenny Potter, moving the Spartans back in front, 20-16, with nine minutes to go.

Georgia State moved to midfield but failed to convert a 3rd-and-one with eight minutes left. The Panthers went for it on fourth down, and freshman receiver Penny Hart got behind the defense, but Arbuckle's pass was just out of his reach.

The Spartans took over and held the ball for more than five minutes before scoring the clinching touchdown for the final margin.

San Jose State running back Tyler Ervin rushed for 132 yards on 30 carries and had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown in the first half.

Trailing 10-0 in the second quarter, Georgia State got on the board with a 5-play, 87-yard drive. After Arbuckle opened the drive with a 20-yard completion to freshman tight end Ari Werts, a 29-yard pass to Werts gave the Panthers a first down at the SJSU 38. On the next play, Arbuckle found Harden down the right sideline for a 38-yard touchdown, pulling GSU within 10-7 with seven minutes left in the first half.

On that play, Arbuckle surpassed the Sun Belt season record for passing yards, formerly held by Troy's Levi Brown (4,254 yards in 2009).

San Jose State struck first on a 19-yard field goal by Austin Lopez after the GSU defense came up with a big third-down stop at the 2-yard line to force the field goal.

But on their ensuing possession, the Panthers came up just short on third down and punted the ball to Ervin, who returned the punt 85 yards for the score and a 10-0 Spartan lead.

Playing for injured all-conference tight end Keith Rucker, Werts finished with three receptions for 63 yards after he had just two catches all season.

And one year later, Elliott has the Panthers in their second bowl game with a trip to the AutoNation Cure Bowl.

Elliott took over a Georgia State program that is in just its eighth season of football but is positioned for growth with the move into Georgia State Stadium, coupled with the university's continued rise in size and stature.

Before he even coached his first game at Georgia State, Elliott's impact on the program was immediately felt. On the recruiting trail, he and his staff quickly assembled an impressive 2017 recruiting class that was the most highly-regarded group of GSU signees yet. And in the classroom, his Panthers achieved an all-time high with a 3.03 grade-point average for the spring semester.

Elliott worked the last seven seasons at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott served 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State. He was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

In 20 seasons as a Division I assistant coach, Elliott has been a part of 19 winning seasons and helped coach 16 teams to the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up

a school-record 452.3 yards per game, including 198.5 yards on the ground and 253.8 through the air.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State. Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three

appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from a car accident in 2000.

As a player, Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

ELLIOTT BRINGS NEW ENERGY TO GEORGIA STATE FOOTBALL

Listen, people, and you will hear a few tectonic truths of football and the coaching thereof.

Right here at Georgia State, of all places, where the game has resided in relative seclusion throughout its brief existence.

“To use your strength and your abilities to move a man against his will is a pretty special thing. That’s why I played (football). That’s why I continue to coach it the way I’ve coached it.”

That’s but one thought emerging from the dialogues of Shawn Elliott, football fundamentalist. For being fairly new at this head coaching thing, he still has managed a firm grasp on the language of intense, unblinking leadership. He’ll speak in football absolutes as well as any 20-year head coach out there.

Elliott has emerged from the trenches to take over coaching the GSU Panthers at the dawn of their relocation to a new stadium. It’s his turn now to sink his spurs into the flanks of a program that hasn’t yet been able to keep pace with its own ambitions.

An offensive line coach for the bulk of his career, he has not followed a well-worn path to his first permanent head coaching job. “You typically see those guys stay in the background – they coach the O-line for a lot of years and end up retiring,” Elliott said. “It is something I always wanted to do, I wanted to be a head football coach. I wanted to be able to touch the defensive side of the game, to be in contact with the tight ends, the O-line, the running backs, our coaches.”

Georgia State athletic director Charlie Cobb became acquainted with this fiery fellow when coach and administrator both were at Appalachian State. It was hard not to pay some attention to Elliott, whose reputation as an emotional defensive lineman at App State was further enhanced by his coaching habit of smashing into his players, pinballing from one to another, as a pregame motivational ritual.

“Someone once said I played in control of being out of control. That’s probably the way I coach,” Elliott said.

“If our kids will play with focus and determination and toughness that he has, we’re going to win a lot of football games,” Cobb said.

Granted, subtlety is not in his playbook, and never has been through 13 seasons in Boone, N.C., and another seven at South Carolina, which included a six-game stint as interim head coach in 2015 when Steve Spurrier took his visor and went home.

The full-contact psych-up routine has tended to lessen through the years and may continue to fall off now that Elliott wears the title of head coach. But that was, in its day, some epic moshing before kickoff.

“At South Carolina it was just a little bumping and shoving. At App State we were fighting. It became a sight to see. There were days I’d wake up and my whole left side of my body would be bruised up. It was fun. As you get older you can’t do it as much,” Elliott said.

That leads to another basic of Elliott’s Coaching Philosophy 101:

“Those guys (players) got to see that you want it as badly as they want it,” Elliott said. “Everybody’s got a different way they coach. I’m not the stoic guy who stands on the sideline. As soon as I walk on the field, I break into a sweat. My heart’s racing. I’m ready to go.”

He is the Panthers’ third head coach in their eight years of existence. And each step of the way from Bill Curry to Trent Miles and now to the 44-year-old Elliott, they have gone younger. And younger means being able to get more physically involved, more eye-to-eye with players, on the practice field.

Thus, when the team went on a recent conditioning run at Stone Mountain, Elliott and his coaches joined them. During spring practice, the head coach probably could have used a helmet as well as a whistle.

That approach certainly hastens the getting-to-know-you part of a coaching change.

“I love the intensity,” GSU receiver Penny Hart said. “It’s almost like he’s out there going to play the game with you, and that’s what you want to feel as a player. You want to feel like they’re out there with you every step of the way.”

Twenty years at two addresses – this guy was no job-hopper. The son of a South Carolina state trooper, the product of the small-town south (Camden, S.C.), Elliott had the kind of upbringing that led to an understanding with stability. He never was that coach always angling for a better position, with one foot in the present and the other pointed toward the next job interview. His wife and two children would not be required to keep their bags packed.

The fact that South Carolina turned to Elliott when Spurrier suddenly quit two seasons ago was another nod to his steadiness. The Gamecocks finished 1-5 under Elliott, the five losses by an average of seven points, including a five-point loss to top-ranked Clemson.

For years, Cobb had Elliott’s name in his mental Rolodex of possible head coaches.

“I always thought somewhere along the line he was going to make a great head coach because he has that unquantifiable ‘It Factor.’ He resonates enthusiasm. He resonates tenacity. He resonates being genuine,” the AD said.

When the two began talking about the Georgia State job, Elliott had to decide whether making the move from the SEC for a head-coaching job at a Sun Belt program still seeking an identity even in its own neighborhood was the right play.

Some deciding factors: His comfort level with Cobb. The ability to live and recruit in Atlanta. The challenge of trying to take a program into unexplored territory.

Ask Elliott what he, in turn, will pitch to a recruit to sell him on the idea of Georgia State, and be prepared to receive another electric jolt of insight.

“You have the ability to do a lot of firsts here. I use the term founding father. Just think how exciting it’s going to be to be that young man who has won that first bowl game for Georgia State or won that first Sun Belt championship. To be the first to do something is very special,” he said.

“So many times you go to places that have been built over time, and it just kind of runs on its own. But here it’s a chance to build it – not from scratch – but to come to a program and say I can be remembered.”

And now, to move a populace to rally around his team – almost against its will – that will be the sternest test of the Elliott approach to life and football.

TENNESSEE STATE 17, GEORGIA STATE 10**Game 1: Aug. 31, 2017 • 7 p.m. (ESPN3)****Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.**

Georgia State fell to Tennessee State 17-10 in the inaugural game at Georgia State Stadium, and the debut for GSU head coach Shawn Elliott.

A crowd of 24,333 filled the former Turner Field, which has been converted into a new home for Georgia State football, but the Panthers (0-1) struggled offensively, hurting themselves with four turnovers.

Tennessee State (1-0) quarterback Treon Harris, the Florida transfer, passed for 145 yards and rushed for 91, including a 12-yard touchdown in the third quarter that proved to be the difference.

"We appreciate everyone who came out here tonight, and we appreciate all the effort that went into this," Elliott said. "It was a great way to open this stadium except for the game itself. And that's tough."

"You look at our defense, I thought they played their tails off," Elliott continued. "They went out there and gave us the opportunity to compete, gave us the chance to tie the game. I thought they fought, but they stayed on the field a long, long time. And that's something that is unacceptable for us, offensively. You look at our stats, I think we rushed for 49 yards today. 49 yards. That's something that's hard to do. And four turnovers."

GSU quarterback Conner Manning completed 14 of 17 passes for 159 yards but left the game in the third quarter due to injury. Taz Bateman caught six passes for 74 yards and a touchdown and rushed 11 times for 31 yards.

After trailing 10-3 at the half, Georgia State appeared to be driving for the tying score early in the third quarter when Conner Manning's 59-yard pass to Ari Werts put GSU at the Tennessee State 13. But the Panthers came up short on 4th-and-goal at the 4-yard line by the slimmest of margins.

Georgia State was originally awarded the first down, but a review changed the spot to an inch shy of the marker.

Two plays later, Seth Rowland broke the through the middle for a 59-yard gain for the Tigers, setting up Harris' 12-yard touchdown run that put TSU ahead 17-3.

GSU backup quarterback Aaron Winchester found Bateman for a short gain in the flat, and the GSU running back turned it into a 39-yard touchdown, pulling GSU within 17-10 with 11 minutes left.

The Panthers' defense forced a three-and-out to give Georgia State possession at midfield with nine minutes to go, but GSU fumbled on the next play.

Georgia State had one final chance as the defense held late in the game to force a punt with 1:45 left. The Panthers took over at their own 44, but Winchester was intercepted and Tennessee State ran out the clock.

"We'll come back out and regroup," Elliott said. "We've got an open date and 17 days to prepare, and we'll go to work. One win or one loss does not make a season. It's going to be a tough loss to swallow for the next 17 days. We've got to find out what we're made of, and find out quickly."

PENN STATE 56, GEORGIA STATE 0**Game 2: Sept. 16, 2017 • 7:30 p.m. (BTN)****Beaver Stadium • University Park, Pa.**

Georgia State (0-2) fell at No. 5 Penn State 56-0 Saturday night at Beaver Stadium.

Penn State (3-0) quarterback Trace McSorley passed for 309 yards and four touchdowns. Running back Saquon Barkley rushed for just 47 yards on 10 carries, but caught four passes for 142 yards, including an 85-yard catch-and-run touchdown.

Taz Bateman rushed for a career-high 100 yards on 29 carries for Georgia State. The junior running back also caught three passes for 19 yards and returned one punt for a total of 120 all-purpose yards.

Backup quarterback Aaron Winchester added 39 yards rushing, and receiver Penny Hart caught seven passes for 56 yards.

GSU starter Conner Manning passed for 133 yards on 16 completions but committed four turnovers with three interceptions and a fumble. Penn State converted each miscue into a touchdown.

"We fought hard," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "You look up at that score and say, 'What can you be proud of your football for?' but I saw a lot of positives and a lot of players who took a step forward. We certainly have to a lot of work to do, and we have to get better. You can't give up cheap points. The turnovers can't happen. But our team will learn from this one, I promise you that."

"We gave so many cheap points away, and you just can't do that," Elliott continued. "I would have liked to make them earn it a little bit more. Penn

State is a good football team. Hats off to Coach [James] Franklin and his staff."

NOTES:

Taz Bateman's 100-yard game is the first for the Panthers since 2014. His 29 carries in the game are the school record.

At No. 5, Penn State is the second-highest ranked team that Georgia State has faced in its eight seasons of football, and the highest since the Panthers played at No. 1 Alabama in 2013.

True freshman noseguard Dontae Wilson had a sack and a caused fumble.

The crowd of 102,746 is the largest that Georgia State has ever played before. The previous high was 101,621 at Alabama in 2010.

A last-minute injury to starting right guard Pat Bartlett forced the Panthers to juggle their offensive line. Gabe Mobley, who had started 23 straight games at center, moved to right guard, and Jamal Paxton made his first career start at center.

Glenn Smith rushed for a career-high 90 yards and two touchdowns, and the Panther defense pitched the first shutout in school history as GSU won at Charlotte 28-0.

The win is the first for the Panthers (1-2) under first-year head coach Shawn Elliott.

Penny Hart tied the school record with 11 receptions for 141 yards, including a 32-yard touchdown catch. Quarterback Conner Manning passed for 250 yards on 26 completions, directing a balanced offense that did not commit a turnover.

Sixth-year senior safety Bryan Williams had two interceptions, both in the end zone, to lead the strong effort by the Georgia State defense, which held Charlotte (0-4) to 273 yards of offense. Williams' two picks tied a GSU record held by several players.

"What a great way to get our first win of the year," Elliott said. "Defensively we played well all night. We never gave them anything cheap. We had numerous true freshmen out there making plays. I am just proud because it was a great team effort."

The game featured one of the craziest plays in Georgia State history. With the Panthers leading 14-0 in the fourth quarter, Brandon Wright's 25-yard field goal attempt was tipped at the line of scrimmage. A Charlotte player attempted to field the ball in the end zone but fumbled it, and GSU offensive lineman Shamarius Gilmore recovered it in the end zone for the touchdown. That gave the Panthers a 21-0 lead with 14 minutes to play.

After a scoreless first quarter, Georgia State got on the board early in the second on Smith's 3-yard touchdown run that capped a 10-play, 66-yard drive. Manning hit five straight passes on the drive with three completions for 25 yards to Hart and two to Smith for 26 yards. Smith covered the other 15 yards on the ground, and his first touchdown of the season gave GSU a 7-0 lead with 12:29 to play in the first half.

That was still the score when Charlotte missed a 54-yard field attempt, giving the Panthers the ball at their 36 with three minutes to go in the half. On third-and-13, Manning hit Hart for 20 yards and a first down. After consecutive short completions to freshman Tamir Jones, Manning found Hart down the right side line, and Hart made a nice spin move and then dragged his defender into the end zone for a 32-yard touchdown. That gave Georgia State a 14-0 lead with 44 seconds on the clock.

Charlotte quarterback Hasaan Klugh hooked up with Mark Quattlebaum for a 52-yard completion and a 49ers first down at the GSU 12 with 16 seconds left in the half, but the Georgia State defense held as Williams intercepted Klugh in the end zone. That sent the Panthers into the locker room with a 14-0 advantage.

Smith took over as the primary ball-carrier after starter Taz Bateman left with an injury early in the game and Kyler Neal already out for the game. Smith carried the ball a school-record 31 times and nearly matched Bateman's 100-yard effort from last

week at Penn State. Smith, who also caught four passes for 39 yards for a total of 129 all-purpose yards, finished the scoring with a 1-yard touchdown run with 22 seconds to play.

"There's nothing easy about getting wins," Elliott said. "A lot of adversity happened to us tonight, but our guys continued to strive and believe and build off one another – the offense off the defense and the defense off the offense. It's a special feeling when you see guys go out there and work toward a common goal and achieve it."

GEORGIA STATE 27, COASTAL CAROLINA 21

Penny Hart caught eight passes for 132 yards and a touchdown, and Glenn Smith returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to lead Georgia State to a 27-21 victory in its Sun Belt Conference opener at Coastal Carolina.

Georgia State (2-2, 1-0 Sun Belt) quarterback Conner Manning passed for 273 yards and one touchdown, and Kyler Neal and DeMarcus

Kirk scored rushing touchdowns. Kirk's 4-yard touchdown put the Panthers ahead 27-14 with three minutes left, and then GSU held on for the victory.

"It wasn't pretty, but I don't care. That's a win!" head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We're 1-0 in the conference. They played their tails off."

Smith took the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to give the Panthers the early 7-0 lead. The senior running back fielded the ball near the right hash and appeared to be bottled up at the 20-yard line. But he broke out of the pile and around the left side to daylight, breaking a tackle at the GSU 20 to reach the end zone.

That is the sixth kickoff return for touchdown in GSU history and the second on the opening kickoff, following Darren McCray vs. Campbell in 2010.

Coastal Carolina (1-4, 0-2) took the ensuing kickoff and drove deep into Georgia State territory, but the Panther defense held on three straight plays inside the 6-yard line and then forced a missed field goal.

Georgia State converted the missed field goal into an 11-play, 80-yard touchdown drive. Manning completed four passes to Hart on the march, including a short shovel pass that Hart grabbed and raced around the left end for an 8-yard touchdown. That put GSU ahead 14-0 with three minutes left in the first quarter.

Coastal Carolina got on the board midway through the second quarter on Tyler Keane's 33-yard touchdown pass to Omar Black, but the Panthers answered right away with a 65-yard scoring drive. The drive was aided by three costly Chanticleer penalties, but Manning had two key third down conversions with a 17-yard completion to Tamir Jones on 3rd-and-six and an 11-yard rush down on 3rd-and-10 at the 14. That set up Kyler Neal's 1-yard scoring run and gave the Panthers a 21-7 lead with 2:20 left in the first half.

After the Chanticleers pulled within 21-14 with seven minutes left, Manning led the Panthers on a 91-yard scoring drive, keyed by a 52-yard completion to tight end Ari Werts, who was left wide open on a wheel route and raced down the sideline to the CCU 23. Kirk finished the drive with his 4-yard touchdown run. The Panthers missed the extra point but led 27-14 with three minutes left.

Coastal managed a quick touchdown, moving 80 yards on six plays in just over a minute to pull within 27-21 with 1:50 to play. But Georgia State recovered the onside kick and managed one first down to run out the clock.

Smith finished with 74 yards rushing on 23 carries, three receptions for 13 yards and two kickoff returns for 114 yards to total a career-high 201 all-purpose yards. Werts had four catches for 92 yards, and Jones added two receptions for 24 yards.

"We executed a lot of good pass plays. We've got to get a little better in the run game, but most of all, we've got to finish better," Hart said. "I'm probably being a little too hard on myself and my team, but that's what is going to propel us to be better. We've got to finish a lot better than that."

"There is definitely such a thing as an ugly win, but you never want to downgrade a win. You get in the film room and learn from it and get better," Hart added.

Led by Conner Manning and Penny Hart, Georgia State used a record-setting offensive performance to win its third straight road game and move to 2-0 atop the Sun Belt Conference with a 47-37 victory at ULM.

Manning directed an attack that piled up a school record 670 yards of total offense with Georgia State's most points ever against an FBS team. The senior quarterback completed 26 of 35 passes for a career-high 446 yards, the second-highest single-game total in school history, and tied the GSU record with four touchdown passes.

Much of Manning's yardage was to Hart, who set the Georgia State (3-2, 2-0 Sun Belt) record with 190 yards receiving on 11 catches, which ties his own school mark. Hart, who recorded his third straight 100-yard game, caught touchdowns of 50, 25 and 22 yards.

"I can tell you one thing, we're pleased to death with this win. We never take winning for granted," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I'm very proud of the effort - our guys fought hard. We made it interesting in the fourth quarter, but we're 2-0 in the conference, and someone has to come knock us off. We're going to continue to work to see how good we can be."

Georgia State also rushed for a season-high 224 yards, despite losing its top two backs to injury. Kyler Neal rushed for 65 yards on 14 carries, including a 1-yard touchdown, and the senior topped the 1,000-yard mark for his career. Demarcus Kirk had 56 yards rushing, and Taz Bateman gained 43 yards before leaving the game.

"Everybody took a turn at running back. Kyler Neal and DeMarcus Kirk came in and gave us a great effort," Elliott said. "Who knows who's going to show up at running back next week! Hats off the offensive line, they did a good job of moving their front."

Sophomore Devin Gentry scored the first two touchdowns of his career on a 69-yard reception and a 15-yard run.

The Panthers wasted no time getting on the scoreboard on their first possession as Hart got a step on his defender down the sideline and made a spectacular one-handed, overhead catch for a 50-yard touchdown, his third of the season.

ULM's Marcus Williams returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown to give the Warhawks a brief 7-6 lead, but the Panthers answered immediately. On 3rd-and-4 from the GSU 31, Gentry took a short pass and raced down the left sideline for a 69-yard touchdown, the first of his career and Georgia State's longest pass of the season. That put the Panthers up 13-7 less than six minutes into the game.

Gentry's second touchdown came on a reverse play as he took a flip from Bateman and ran around the left side into the end zone for a 15-yard rushing touchdown.

Brandon Wright added a career-long 46-yard field goal, his second of the day, on the final play of the first half to send the Panthers into the locker room with a 26-10 lead.

Hart scored caught two more touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the third quarter as Georgia State extended its lead to 40-17 with more minutes to play in the third quarter. Both were two more highlight-reel catches, covering 25 and 22 yards.

After a ULM touchdown, Georgia State sealed the victory with a 15-play, 95-yard drive that eight up nearly eight minutes on the clock. Neal capped the drive with a 1-yard scoring run, and the Panthers led 47-24 with eight minutes to play.

ULM (3-3, 3-1 Sun Belt) managed two touchdowns in the final three minutes for the final 47-31 margin.

"I wasn't too pleased with the points we spotted them on special teams, and the fourth quarter was a little disappointing, but our defense played well for the most part," Elliott said.

The Panthers collected a school-record seven sacks, including three by Marterious Allen, which ties the GSU record. Allen, the junior defensive end, also had a fumble recovery. Michael Shaw added 1.5 sacks to become the Panthers' career leader in tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

Georgia State had its three-game winning streak snapped with a 34-10 loss to Troy in Saturday's Homecoming game at Georgia State Stadium.

Playing their first home game in 51 days, the Panthers (3-3, 3-1 Sun Belt Belt) struggled to move the ball against the top defense in the Sun Belt. Conner Manning passed for 255 yards, including a touchdown pass to Penny Hart, but the GSU quarterback was sacked four times and the Panthers managed on 52 yards rushing.

Georgia State couldn't capitalize on the opportunities it did have with two missed field goals, a fourth down stop and an interception in the red zone.

"It was a very, very disappointing game for us, after playing pretty well the last three weeks," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "A lot had to do with a good Troy team. They came out and played exceptionally well. They controlled the line of

scrimmage on both sides.

"Our message to our team was that you have to bring everything you've got every single week," Elliott continued. "This is going to be a very valuable lesson for that our football team will learn about how we prepare after having some type of success. We've got to play to the best of our ability each and every week to have a chance to compete, and today we certainly didn't do that."

Glenn Smith led the Panthers with eight catches for 70 yards, while freshman Tamir Jones finished with 75 yards on five catches. Hart, among the top receivers in the country, caught a 3-yard touchdown, but was held to just five catches for 32 yards and a touchdown.

Georgia State got off to a good start as senior Bryan Williams intercepted Troy quarterback Brandon Silvers on the third play of the game, giving the Panthers the ball at the Troy 39-yard line, Brandon Williams booted a 30-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead. Williams' interception is his team-leading third of the season.

But Troy (5-2, 2-1 Sun Belt) answered quickly with Silver's 49-yard touchdown pass to John Johnson. The Trojans added two more touchdowns on back-to-back possessions early in the second half to move ahead 21-3.

The Panthers missed opportunities to pull closer. After a missed field goal, Manning drove the GSU to a first-and-goal at the Troy 5 in the final two minutes of the half, but the Panthers could not punch it in as Manning's fourth-down pass from the 4 was incomplete.

Silvers led Troy (5-2, 2-1 Sun Belt) with 335 yards and two touchdowns through the air on 25-of-35 passing.

Conner Manning threw touchdown passes to Glenn Smith and Penny Hart to back a strong effort by the Georgia State defense in the Panthers' 21-13 win over South Alabama Thursday night at Georgia State Stadium, giving GSU its first win in its new home.

The Panther defense set a school record by allowing just 41 yards rushing to lead Georgia State (4-3, 3-1 Sun Belt) to its fourth win the last five games.

Manning completed 17 passes for 195 yards. Hart finished with six catches for 98 yards, including an 8-yard touchdown catch. Smith totaled 175 all-purpose yards with 73 yard rushing, two catches for 36 yards with a 2-yard touchdown, and 66 kickoff return yards.

For the second straight game, safety Bryan Williams grabbed an interception on the opponent's opening possession to set up a Georgia State score.

Williams intercepted Dallas Davis at the USA 36 and returned it 30 yards to 6. On third-and-goal, Manning hit Glenn Smith for the 2-yard touchdown and the early 7-0 lead.

That was Williams' fourth interception of 2017, tying the Georgia State season record, and the sixth of his career, equaling the Panthers' career mark.

Georgia State added to its lead with a 95-yard drive late in the first half, with Smith doing much of the work. On first down at the GSU 37, Smith rushed for gain of six yards, then 16 yards to the USA 41. On the next play, he took a short pass over the middle and raced around left side down to the 7. Then Kyler Neal finished the drive with a 7-yard scoring run, putting GSU ahead 14-3 with 1:43 left in the half.

Meanwhile the Georgia State defense held South Alabama (3-5, 2-2 Sun Belt) to just a field goal in the first half, sending the Panthers into the locker room with a 14-3 lead.

Another South Alabama field goal was the only scoring in the third quarter, cutting Georgia State's lead to 14-6. But the Panthers responded on their next possession with a 79-yard touchdown drive, keyed by Hart, who caught a 45-yard pass down to the South Alabama 20. After Smith covered the first 10 yards on the ground, the Panthers faced 3rd-and-goal at the 8 when Manning found Hart in the corner of the end zone for the touchdown. That put GSU ahead 21-6 with 13 minutes left.

South Alabama made things interesting late in the game as Davis hit Jamarius Way for a 75-yard touchdown to make it a one-score game with two minutes left.

The Jaguars recovered the onside kick but managed only one short completion before GSU

forced three straight incompletions to seal the win. Chandon Sullivan broke up Davis' fourth-down pass intended for Way.

"It's a great Thursday night here at Georgia State Stadium," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "First win in this stadium feels great, but we sure do make it interesting, don't we? Man, we really do.

"Let me just say our defense played a phenomenal football game, they really did," Elliott continued. "They had them on their heels all game long. Our secondary, our linebackers, our defensive front, just made plays all night. Hate to see that throw there at the end. And we can't let that happen."

The Georgia State defense held South Alabama to 338 yards, 70 of them coming on USA's late touchdown. The Panthers broke up seven passes and collected six tackles behind the line of scrimmage, holding the Jaguars to a net of 41 yards rushing.

"Offensively we did enough to go out there and put points on the board to make it stand and fought very hard," Elliott said. "South Alabama is a well-coached football team, and they came in knowing exactly what we did."

Georgia State now faces two straight road games, beginning next Saturday at Georgia Southern (3 p.m.). The Panthers' next home game is Nov. 25 vs. Appalachian State.

"I told our team in there, everything that we want to accomplish, everything that we've set as our goals—we haven't set a lot of goals—they're all obtainable," Elliott said. "We still get to move forward, we strive to be where we want to be, but we've got to clean a lot of stuff up."

Conner Manning found Penny Hart for a 9-yard touchdown with 2:31 to play to give Georgia State a 21-17 come-from-behind win over Georgia Southern Saturday afternoon at Paulson Stadium, the Panthers' third straight win over their in-state rival.

The Hart touchdown completed a six-play, 31-yard drive that started when Georgia Southern's Wesley Fields fumbled and Georgia State outside linebacker James Traylor recovered with just over five minutes to play.

But the story of the day was the Georgia State (5-3, 4-1 Sun Belt) defense, which kept the Panthers in the ballgame until the offense found its rhythm.

After the defense set up the go-ahead score, they still had to make one last stand as Georgia Southern (0-8, 0-4) drove to the GSU 15 in the closing seconds. But linebacker Trey Payne tackled quarterback Shai Werts to end the game.

"The way that game ended was exactly what that game should have come down to, with our defense having to make a great stop," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "They played unbelievable all day to give us an opportunity to win this football game. You can't mention one guy, not with the way they played and the way they continued to fight. It was an unbelievable team effort.

"I told the team at halftime, 'Listen, we're playing 30 more minutes, so let's do something we'll remember for the rest of our lives.' And I'm so proud of our guys. I'm proud of our University, I'm proud of our fans, I'm proud of our band. I've been down here a number of times as a coach ... And it always feels good win in Statesboro!"

Hart finished the game with eight catches for a school-record 191 yards, including a career-long 70-yard reception that set up the Panthers' second touchdown. He broke the record of 190 yards that he set three games ago at ULM.

Manning went 22-for-37 for 319 yards and two touchdowns with Glenn Smith on the receiving end of eight of those completions. Smith finished with 57 yards through the air while also adding 11 rushes for 49 yards.

Georgia State jumped in front quickly. On the game's first offensive play, cornerback Chandon Sullivan picked up a fumble near the sideline and raced 28 yards for the touchdown, giving the Panthers a 7-0 lead just 17 seconds into the game.

Sullivan is the first Panther to score two defensive touchdowns in his career; he also had the first "pick six" in GSU history vs. Arkansas State in 2015.

That marked the third consecutive contest in which the Georgia State defense forced a turnover on the game's first possession after safety Bryan Williams' back-to-back interceptions vs. Troy and

South Alabama.

But Georgia Southern answered with an 80-yard drive, capped by Myles Campbell's 12-yard touchdown reception, tying the game at 7-7 with seven minutes to play in the first quarter.

The score remained 7-7 until late in the first half. After a punt, the Eagles took over at midfield with 47 seconds left and managed to get in position for Tyler Bass' 48-yard field goal that gave Georgia Southern a 10-7 halftime lead.

Georgia State appeared to take the lead after driving down the field on the opening possession of the second half, but a touchdown was wiped out by a pass interference penalty and the Panthers missed a field goal.

After Georgia Southern took a 17-7 lead late in the third quarter, the Panthers responded immediately. Manning hit Hart over the middle for a 70-yard completion down to the 5-yard line. Two plays later, Manning found freshman tight end Roger Carter in the corner of the end zone for the 4-yard touchdown, and the Panthers were within 17-14 with 27 seconds left in the third quarter.

"Penny never ceases to amaze me," Elliott said. "He does these things every single day on the practice field, so it's not a surprise when he comes out here and makes these plays. We're thrilled to death to have him on our football team.

"But it took an army. He made the great catch, but it took the protection and a great throw. When you pull out a victory like this, it's hard to pinpoint one individual."

GEORGIA STATE 33, TEXAS STATE 30

Game 9: Nov. 11, 2017 • 4 p.m. ET(ESPN3)

Kyler Neal's 22-yard touchdown run with six minutes to play lifted Georgia State to a 33-30 victory at Texas State to make the Panthers bowl eligible for the second time in three years. The win was also GSU's school-record fifth straight road victory.

Devin Gentry caught two touchdown passes from Conner Manning, Glenn Smith rushed for a career-high 98 yards and Brandon Wright kicked a school-record four field goals as Georgia State (6-3, 5-1 Sun Belt) won for the sixth time in seven games. The Panthers are now tied atop the Sun Belt standings with Troy and Appalachian State at 5-1, and Arkansas State, which lost today at South Alabama, one-half game behind at 4-1.

"The way that we continue to win these games is a tribute to our players and their mentality and the way that they work, and our coaching staff," head coach Shawn Elliott. "We don't always play the very best, clean ballgame, but somehow we find a way to pull out these wins.

"We came out in the second half with a new mentality, having fun out there, and after a 33-30 win, you can say that was a fun night."

For the second straight week, the Panthers trailed in the final 10 minutes before scoring the winning touchdown. Neal's go-ahead score, on which he tied the GSU career record of 12 rushing touchdowns, came after Texas State scored a touchdown following a bad snap by the Panthers on a punt. That gave the Bobcats the ball at the 1-yard line, and Anthony Smith punched it in for a 30-26 Texas State lead with 8:37 to play.

The Panthers took the ensuing kickoff and drove 80 yards. Manning started the drive with a 19-yard run, then hit passes to Smith for 10 yards and Jonathan Ifedi for 8 yards to the Texas State 38. Smith rushed for eight yards, Tamir Jones caught a 6-yard pass, and Neal gained two yards. On 3rd-and-2, Neal broke through the middle for the 22-yard touchdown.

Texas State drove for a touchdown on the game's opening possession, but the Panthers answered with Wright's career-long 48-yard field goal. The big play on the drive was a 34-yard reception by Todd Boyd.

On GSU's next possession, Manning hit Gentry for a short gain, and Gentry broke a tackle and raced for the end zone, completing a 34-yard scoring play that put the Panthers up 10-7 with six minutes to go in the first quarter.

After a Texas State touchdown early in the second quarter, Georgia State got in position for another 48-yard field goal by Wright, this one bringing the Panthers within 14-13 with 7:39 left in the second quarter.

Trailing 14-13, Georgia State opened the second half with a big play by Penny Hart, who caught a pass over the middle and raced down to the 10-yard line for a 61-yard gain. But on the next play, freshman Tamir Jones had the ball knocked loose as he tried to reach the goal line, and Texas State recovered. The Bobcats converted the turnover into a field goal to lead 17-13 with nine minutes in the third quarter.

From there, the lead changed hands five times. The Panthers inched closed on another Wright field goal to pull within 17-16 with eight minutes to play in the third quarter.

Then Gentry turned a short pass over the middle into a long touchdown, this time breaking a tackle and outracing the defense for a 71-yard scoring play that gave Georgia State a 23-17 advantage with 44 seconds in the third quarter.

Texas State scored on a pass that bounced off one receiver into the hands of another Bobcat, Elijah King, for a 34-yard touchdown pass. But Julien Laurent blocked the PAT, keeping the score tied at 23-all with 14 minutes to play.

Wright, the sophomore from Atlanta, kicked his school-record fourth field goal two minutes later, set up by a 44-yard run by Manning, and Georgia State led 26-23 with 12 minutes to go.

Wright set Georgia State single-game records with four field goals and 15 points by kicking. He also had six touchbacks on eight kickoffs, and averaged 46.3 yards on three punts, including a 66-yard boot.

Manning was 26-for-40 for 368 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for a career-high 60 yards, despite two sacks. His 71-yard TD pass to Gentry is his career-long completion.

Smith caught five passes for 45 yards to go along with his 98 yards rushing, and he also returned three kickoffs for 62 yards to total 205 all-purpose yards. Hart finished with four catches for 85 yards.

APPALACHIAN STATE 31, GEORGIA STATE 10

Game 11: Nov. 25, 2017 • 2 p.m. (ESPN3)

Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

In its first home game in a month, Georgia State fell to Appalachian State 31-10 at "Pete" Petit Field at Georgia State Stadium.

Jalin Moore led Appalachian State (7-4, 6-1 Sun Belt) with 239 yards rushing, the first 100-yard rusher allowed by the Panthers all season. Georgia State (6-4, 5-2 Sun Belt) was the last FBS team in the nation that had not allowed a 100-yard rusher in 2017.

Sophomore receiver Penny Hart led the Panthers with five catches for 61 yards. He is now just one reception shy of tying the GSU single-season record of 71, which Albert Wilson set in 2013 and then Hart tied in 2015. Hart also topped the 1,000-yard mark for the season; he now has 1,022 yards, making him the first Panther to record two 1,000-yard seasons.

Georgia State had its three-game winning streak snapped, but the Panthers have won six of their last eight games entering next Saturday's regular-season finale vs. Idaho. GSU is now one game behind Appalachian State, Troy and Arkansas State in the Sun Belt standings with one game to play.

GSU quarterback Conner Manning completed 22 of 35 passes for 201 yards and scored on a 2-yard run.

Brandon Wright booted a career-long 50-yard field goal for the Panthers, equaling the second-longest field goal in school history. Another bright spot was sophomore running back Tra Barnett with 42 yards rushing on just five carries.

"It certainly wasn't the outcome we had hoped for," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It was a little disappointing, a lot disappointing to tell you the truth. Hats off to an Appalachian State team that's been pretty good so far, as you can see."

"It would seem like there's a big gap between these two football programs, but there's not. Some of our foolish penalties and not having that competitive edge coming out in the beginning of the second half were very evident, and they took advantage of it."

In a scoreless game, the GSU defense had a tremendous goal-line stand at the end of the first quarter, holding on four straight plays after App State had a first-and-goal at the 5-yard line.

But App State scored the game's first points on its next possession on Moore's 3-yard run with 12 minutes to play in the second quarter.

The Panthers answered with Manning's 2-yard touchdown run, which capped a 5-play, 36-yard scoring drive set up by Antreal Allen's interception, his first of the season. Manning hit Hart for 19

yards and then found tight end Roger Carter over the middle down to the 2 before taking it in himself to tie the game at 7-all with seven minutes in the half.

Chandon Sullivan also had an interception for GSU, picking off App State quarterback Taylor Lamb on the Mountaineers' first offensive snap.

The Mountaineers added Chandler Staton's 42-yard field goal late in the first half to take a 10-7 lead into the locker room, and then App State broke the game open with two quick scores in the second half. On their first drive, Moore broke through the line for a 58-yard run down to the 6-yard line, and then Lamb threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to Collin Reed. Then A.J. Howard intercepted Manning and returned it 61 yards to the 2-yard line to set up another Lamb TD pass, this one to Ike Lewis, and the Mountaineers led 24-7 six minutes into the second half.

Lamb passed for just 107 yards but threw two touchdowns and rushed for a third score.

Despite outgaining Idaho through the air and on the ground, Georgia State dropped its regular-season finale 24-10 to Idaho Saturday at Georgia State Stadium.

Conner Manning passed for 271 yards and Glenn Smith rushed for 79 yards and a touchdown but the Panthers hurt themselves with four crucial turnovers.

Already bowl eligible, Georgia State (6-5, 5-3 Sun Belt) is expected to learn its bowl fate Sunday afternoon. Idaho finishes the season 4-8, including a 3-5 Sun Belt mark.

With his performance today, Smith topped the 1,000-yard rushing mark for his career with 1,030 yards. He is now one of just three active FBS players with 1,000 yards rushing, 1,000 yards receiving and 1,000 return yards.

The Panthers played without several starters for all or most of the game due to injury, including standout receiver Penny Hart, who had three catches, including a 48-yard reception, before leaving the game. That was enough for Hart to break the Georgia State record for catches with 73; he previously shared the record of 71 with Albert Wilson.

Manning finished 27-of-44, hitting both Smith and Tamir Jones six times. Jones finished with career highs of six catches and 82 yards, while Smith went for 39 yards receiving to total 139 all-purpose yards.

On defense, true freshman outside linebacker Victor Heyward had seven tackles with two sacks for 19 yards. Senior Mackendy Cheridor had a sack on which he caused the quarterback to fumble, Cheridor's school-record fifth career forced fumble.

Freshman quarterback Colton Richardson finished 16-of-30 for 228 yards and a touchdown for Idaho. Aaron Duckworth led the Vandals on the ground with 113 yards and a touchdown.
