THE KICKOFF: After opening Sun Belt Conference play with a record-setting 46-14 victory over ULM, Georgia State faces a quick turnaround with a nationally-televised game at Troy Thursday at 7:30 p.m. ET.

> This is the 100th game in Georgia State football history, which began with a 41-7 victory over Shorter on Sept. 2, 2010.

> Troy, coming off a 45-21 Sun Belt win over Coastal Carolina, gained notoriety earlier this season with their 24-19 victory at Nebraska.

> The Trojans lead the series, 4-1, including a 34-10 win last season in Atlanta. Georgia State's only victory in the series was a 31-21 decision in 2015 at the Georgia Dome.

> In the win over ULM, the Panthers rushed for a school-record 308 yards, including 145 by freshman Seth Paige, while the GSU defense allowed just 262 yards, the third-fewest in school history, and forced four turnovers.

> Georgia State's first-year starting quarterback Dan Ellington is fourth in the Sun Belt in total offense, averaging 232.6 yards per game while accounting for eight touchdowns. He is completing 65 percent with 952 yards passing and 211 net rushing yards, leading the team in both categories as well as scoring (24 points).

> Ellington set a school record vs. ULM by completing 83.3 percent of his passes (15-18).

> The Panthers feature one of the nation's top receivers in junior Penny Hart, a Preseason All-American who led the Sun Belt Conference in 2017 with a school-record 74 receptions for 1,121 yards and eight touchdowns.

> Among all active FBS receivers, Hart ranks second in career receiving yards (2,548) and yards per game (79.6), third in receptions per game (5.53), fifth in receptions (177) and eighth in touchdown receptions (18).

> Also a dynamic weapon on special teams, Hart returned a punt 49 yards for a touchdown vs. ULM, the first punt return for touchdown in Georgia State history.

> Brandon Wright is second in the nation

with an average of 52.3 yards per punt, which helps Georgia State stand second nationally (to Texas A&M) in net punting at 44.95.

ALL THREE PHASES CONTRIBUTE TO RECORD-SETTING WIN: Georgia State set records and milestones on offense, defense and special teams in its 46-14 win over ULM.

> The 46 points are Georgia State's second-most vs. FBS opponent and third-most overall, and the 32-point margin is the Panthers' largest margin of victory vs. FBS opponent.

> The Panthers rushed for a school-record 308 yards, including 145 by freshman Seth Paige, whose 82-yard TD is the longest run from scrimmage in GSU history.

> QB Dan Ellington completed a school-record 83.3 percent (15-18) of his passes.

> GSU set a school record with 38:12 of possession time.

> The Panthers held ULM to 262 yards of total offense, the third-best defensive performance in school history.

> GSU allowed just 43 total yards and one first down in the second half.

> Linebacker Victor Heyward had two of GSU's four takeaways with an interception and a fumble recovery, both setting up scores.

> Penny Hart had the first punt return for a touchdown in Georgia State history with his 49-yard return in the fourth quarter.

ADDING A "PAIGE" TO THE RECORD BOOK: True freshman Seth Paige rushed for 145 yards and two touchdowns on just nine carries in the Panthers' 46-14 win over ULM.

> Paige's day was highlighted by an 82-yard touchdown that is the longest run and third-longest play from scrimmage in school history.

> His 145 yards are the most for a Panther since Donald Russell in 2012 and the fourth-most ever.

> Paige is just the second GSU freshman to top the 100-yard mark.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE: Sixteen true freshmen have seen action thus far. Twelve of them are seeing regular action: running backs Seth Paige and Destin Coates, receivers Cornelius McCoy and Sam Pinckney, cornerback Quavian White, noseguard Akeem Smith, linebackers Blake Carroll and Jontrey Hunter, defensive end Tre Moore, cornerback Tyler Gore, safety Jacorey Crawford and special teams player Tucker Gregg. Four more played for the first time vs. ULM in running back Dawson Hill, tight end Herman McCray, outside linebacker T.J. Smith and safety Courtney Williams.

> Four true freshmen have started games: WR McCoy, RB Coates, CB White, S Crawford.

> The Panthers No. 2 and No. 3 leading rushers are Paige (188 yards, 3 TD, 8.2 ypc) and Coates (137 yards, 1 TD, 4.3 ypc).

> McCoy is a starting receiver who is second on the team with 14 catches for 153 yards.

> White, starting at cornerback, grabbed an interception at NC State and against ULM, he caused and recovered a fumble near the goal line to prevent a touchdown.

> Twenty-one players on the first and second units are true freshmen or redshirt freshmen.

> Eight of GSU's 13 offensive linemen are true (3) or redshirt (5) freshmen.

WEEKDAY GAMES: The game at Troy is one of four non-Saturday games for the Panthers this season. In its history, Georgia State is 6-8 in all non-Saturday games, including 3-4 on Thursdays after the 24-20 Thursday night victory over Kennesaw State in this year's season opener.

Georgia State is playing in the Sun Belt Conference's Thursday night national television package for the third time. The Panthers defeated South Alabama 21-13 in last year's appearance at Georgia State Stadium.

GSU will return to ESPN2 for another Thursday night contest in two weeks (Oct. 18), when the Panthers play at Arkansas State.



THE 2017 SEASON marked the inaugural year of "Pete" Petit (pronounced puh-TEET) Field at Georgia State Stadium, the former Turner Field and venue for the Atlanta Braves that was converted into the home of Panther football.

Georgia State Stadium features 25,000 seats, a FieldTurf playing surface, the Panthers' 7,500-square foot locker room, and a 5,600-square foot video board that is the eighth-largest in college football.

The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the baseball outfield.

Georgia State Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

Future phases of the redevelopment of this iconic property will include a new Georgia State baseball stadium, to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

WRIGHT STUFF: Junior Brandon Wright, member of the Ray Guy Award Watch List, is second in the nation with an average of 52.3 yards per punt. Georgia State ranks second nationally with a net of 44.95, trailing Texas A&M (45.0).

> A member of the Ray Guy Award Watch List, Wright has averaged over 50 yards in each game, with a high of 56.2 yards on four punts vs. NC State.

> Fourteen of his 20 punts have travelled 50-plus yards, and nine have been downed inside the 20.

> Wright's career punting average currently stands at 43.28, just ahead of the school record of 42.84, held by current New Orleans Saints placekicker Wil Lutz.

> Wright's career average ranks eighth among all active FBS punters.

> He ranks second in GSU history to Matt Hubbard in career punts and punting yards.

COMEBACK VICTORY: Georgia State scored a 24-20 comeback victory over Kennesaw State in his season opener as QB Dan Ellington hit Diondre Champaigne for an 8-yard touchdown pass with just 41 seconds left. Ellington drove the Panthers 73 yards on nine plays with no timeouts in the final two minutes, completing 5-of-8 passes for 55 yards to give the Panthers their first lead in the game.

Ellington also rallied GSU from a 14-0 deficit with two touchdowns passes in the final minute of the first half. First he connected with Penny Hart for a 3-yard touchdown 50 seconds left in the half, capping an 11-play, 68-yard drive.

After an interception gave GSU another possession, Ellington moved the Panthers 37 yards in 37 seconds, hitting Christian Owens with a 6-yard TD in the right corner of the end zone to tie the game.

The GSU defense made several key plays in the win. DeAndre Applin's interception and return to the KSU 37 set up the tying touchdown with three seconds left in the first half. In the second half, the defense held the Owls to two field goals after first downs at the GSU 19 and GSU 7, recovered a fumble at the GSU 15 and came up with a fourth down stop to give the Panthers the ball at the GSU 27 with 2:01 left to set up the winning score.

COUNSELOR MOBLEY: Senior offensive lineman Gabe Mobley is a second-year student in the highly-regarded Georgia State College of Law.

Mobley earned his undergraduate degree in history just three years and began law school in the fall of 2017.

On the field, Mobley is in his fourth year as a starter on the offensive line. After two years at center, he moved to right guard in 2017.

Head coach Shawn Elliott jokingly refers to Mobley, who hails from Moultrie, Ga., as Matlock after the television character.

THROWN FOR A LOSS: Senior outside linebacker Michael Shaw is Georgia State's career leader in tackles for loss with 25.5 while ranking third in career sacks.

Shaw is also climbing the Panthers' career tackling chart, currently in seventh place.

PANTHER PROS: Despite Georgia State's brief history, four Panther alumni are active NFL veterans, and three members of last year's team are trying to make 2018 rosters. A total of five former Panthers have played at least one game in the NFL.

> A member of Georgia State's inaugural team in 2010, receiver Albert Wilson is in his fifth NFL season and first with the Miami Dolphins. He was an undrafted free agent in 2014, originally signing with Kansas City.

> Wil Lutz, GSU's placekicker from 2012-15, is now the kicker for the New Orleans Saints. Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens, he was picked up by the Saints just before the 2016 season opener.

> Fifth-year offensive tackle Ulrick John moved this year to the New England Patriots, his fifth NFL team, but was injured in the final preseason game and was placed on injured reserve. John was selected in the seventh round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts.

> After a record-setting career at Georgia State, wide receiver Robert Davis was selected by the Washington Redskins in the sixth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. He is on injured reserve for 2018.

> Three 2017 seniors--cornerback Chandon Sullivan (Philadelphia Eagles), defensive end Mackendy Cheridor (Atlanta Falcons) and cornerback B.J. Clay (Los Angeles Chargers)--were in NFL camps as undrafted free agents. Sullivan made the Eagles' practice squad.

> GSU's first draft pick and first to appear in an NFL game was defensive tackle Christo Bilukidi in 2013. He played three seasons (2013-15) in the NFL with Oakland, Cincinnati and Baltimore.

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In 21 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 20 winning seasons and helped coach 17 teams to the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game.

Formerly the co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at South Carolina and a coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by President Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016.

And one year later, Elliott had not only guided Georgia State to its second bowl game with a trip to the AutoNation Cure Bowl, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky. That win gave the program a school-record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

Under Elliott's watch, the Panthers achieved benchmark performances on both sides of the ball. The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points per game allowed (24.75), and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4) and per attempt (4.13). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history while setting single-game records for fewest rushing yards allowed (minus-2) and most sacks.

On offense, the Panthers established new marks for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Georgia State's individual efforts were also recognized as nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors, led by first-team selection Penny Hart. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Elliott took over a Georgia State program entering its eighth season of football but positioned for growth with the move into Georgia State Stadium, coupled with the university's continued rise in size and stature.

Before he even coached his first game at Georgia State, Elliott's impact on the program was immediately felt. On the recruiting trail, he and his staff quickly assembled an impressive 2017 recruiting class that was the most highly-regarded group of GSU signees to date. And in the classroom, his Panthers achieved an all-time high with a 3.03 grade-point average for the spring semester.

Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In

addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott served 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State. He was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

In 21 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been a part of 20 winning seasons and helped coach 17 teams to the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game, including 198.5 yards on the ground and 253.8 through the air.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokeyvious Watkins.

Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State. Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients. Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10

NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from a car accident in 2000.

As a player, Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

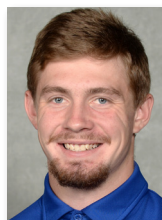

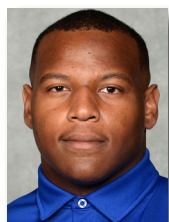

GEORGIA STATE 24, KENNESAW STATE 20

Georgia State kicked off the 2018 season in dramatic fashion, defeating Kennesaw State 24-20 on Dan Ellington's 8-yard touchdown pass to Diondre Champaigne with 41 seconds left in front of 23,088 fans Thursday night at "Pete" Petit Field at Georgia State Stadium.

"I looked up there with two minutes to go and there were a lot of people that left that stadium and missed on heck of a finish," GSU head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Going into this contest I knew it'd be a fight, I knew it'd be everything it was. I knew it was going to be a dog fight."

"All I know is we stand here 1-0, and that's a lot better than where we were a year ago."

Ellington, the junior college transfer playing his first game for the Panthers, hit on 20-for-28 passes for 187 yards and three touchdowns while also running for 77 yards on 18 attempts. Christian Owens had six catches for 70 yards and a touchdown and Penny Hart caught five for 46 yards and a score.

The Panthers (1-0) rallied from a 14-0 first-half deficit with two touchdowns in the final minute of the first half and then had to rally again in the fourth quarter after falling behind 20-14.

The GSU defense set up the winning touchdown with a fourth-down stop that gave the Panthers the ball at their own 27 with 2:01 left.

Ellington hit Hart twice to start the drive before hitting Owens for an 18-yard pass up the right sideline and down to the KSU 21. After a pass interference penalty gave GSU a first down at the 11, Ellington ran three yards on first down and then found Champaigne, another junior college transfer, on a fade to the back corner of the end zone to give the Panthers their first lead.

Kennesaw State (0-1) jumped a 14-0 lead before Georgia State got on the scoreboard. After forcing a punt down 14-0 late in the second quarter, Ellington hit Hart over the middle for 18 yards to the GSU 46 before finding Owens on the sideline for nine yards and a first down at the KSU 43. On second down, Ellington just barely avoided a sack before breaking a 19-yard run, including a nifty spin move, giving the Panthers a first down at the KSU 20.

On second-and-goal at the three, Hart took a shovel pass from Ellington on a jet sweep and raced around the right end for a touchdown, cutting the KSU lead to 14-7 with just 50 seconds remaining in the half.

For Hart, the Preseason All-American, he pulled in career touchdown catch number 18, moving him into sole possession of second place in GSU history. The junior from Roswell, Ga., has caught at least one pass in 28 straight games.

On KSU's first play after the touchdown, safety DeAndre Applin picked off Chandler Burks over the middle and returned it to the KSU 37. Ellington completed passes to Owens and Taz Bateman before a pass interference penalty put the ball at the 16. After a short pass over the middle to Bateman, the Panthers faced second-and-goal at the six with just eight seconds left on the clock. Ellington found Owens, the South Carolina transfer, in the corner of the end zone to tie the game at 14 heading into the half.

The Panthers' bend-but-don't-break defense forced two field goals after consecutive long drives by the Owls to keep the game within reach heading into the fourth quarter trailing 20-14.

Georgia State pulled to within three after a 35-yard field goal Brandon Wright set up by a KSU fumble caused by Terry Thomas and recovered by

Jordan Strachan.

"I can't say enough about the way our football team finished," Elliott said. "To have an opportunity to go down there and take the lead and win that football game with that last-second pass, it was really a testament of how they fought and how they never give up."

Georgia State fell 41-7 at NC State at Carter-Finley Stadium.

GSU (1-1) quarterback Dan Ellington passed for 194 yards on 15 completions, and freshman Destin Coates rushed for 43 and a touchdown to lead the Panthers.

NC State (2-0) quarterback Ryan Finley was

outstanding, going 30-for-38 for 370 yards and two touchdowns. Georgia State held the Wolfpack to 115 yards rushing, but NC State managed three touchdowns on the ground.

The Panthers jumped in front with a touchdown on their first possession and trailed 20-7 at the half. Georgia State had opportunities to pull closer but failed to capitalize due to two missed field goals and a touchdown that was nullified by an offensive pass interference penalty.

"You go into the halftime down 13, but it could have easily been a doggone seven-point ballgame," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Then in the fourth quarter, the game got a little bit away from us. They've got a little more depth at some positions."

"We saw a lot good things, we saw a lot of bad things. We've got an important game next week against Memphis, so we've got to go regroup."

Junior Devin Gentry was the Panthers' leading receiver in the game with five receptions for 83 yards. Penny Hart added three catches for 53 yards, extending his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 29, every game he has played.

Ellington gained 41 yards rushing but three sacks brought his net down to 30 yards

Defensively, one of the bright spots for Georgia State was true freshman cornerback Quavian White, who intercepted Finley at the goal line in the fourth quarter. Redshirt freshmen safeties Jaylon Jones and Chris Bacon each forced fumbles, while senior Chase Middleton finished with a game-high 12 tackles.

"Quavian White has a lot of promise, and so do a lot of those young freshmen who are out there playing for us," Elliott said.

"To tell you the truth, we played sound run defense, but we've got to get better pass rush and better coverage," he continued. "We've got to get better in all phases of it. This is the typical time when you are going to start getting better."

Georgia State marched down the field on its opening possession as Ellington drove the Panthers 75 yards on six plays for a touchdown. He connected with Devin Gentry for a 46-yard completion down the right sideline to the 8. Two plays later, freshman Destin Coates took a pitch from Ellington and scampered into the end zone for the 8-yard touchdown and a 7-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

The Wolfpack answered with a 57-yard touchdown drive, capped by Finley's 5-yard touchdown to Thayer Thomas that tied the game at 7-all with 9:32 to play in the first quarter.

NC State added a 25-yard field goal by Christopher Dunn on its next possession and then took a 17-7 lead with an 80-yard touchdown drive with 10:41 left in the second quarter.

The Panthers had an opportunity to cut into the lead but missed a 44-yard field with 46 seconds left in the first half. That proved to be a six-point swing because NC State managed to move in position for a 28-yard field goal on the final play of the half to take a 20-7 lead into the locker room.

Georgia State fell 59-22 at Memphis in a Friday night game at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Playing without four starters in the secondary, the Panthers struggled defensively as Memphis quarterback Brady White threw five touchdown passes and Darrell Henderson rushed for 233 yards and two scores.

Georgia State (1-2) quarterback Dan Ellington, from nearby Olive Branch, Miss., passed for 107 yards and scored his first rushing touchdown on a 1-yard run early in the second quarter. That capped a 12-play, 70-yard drive and pulled the Panthers within 21-10, but Memphis (2-1) responded with two touchdowns and a field goal to take a 38-10 halftime lead.

True freshmen running backs Destin Coates and Seth Paige combined for 103 yards on 19 carries, including Paige's 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. Backup quarterback Aaron Winchester added 37 yards rushing.

Redshirt freshman Jaylon Jones grabbed his first interception near the goal line and returned it for a 1-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Another freshman, Cornelius McCoy, was the Panthers' leading receiver with five catches for 43 yards, while Penny Hart had four receptions for 35 yards.

Starting safeties DeAndre Applin and Remy Lazarus both missed the game due to injuries, as did junior cornerback Cedric Stone, and senior Jerome Smith was injured early in the game. With the defense depleted by injuries, the Panthers played seven true freshmen and four redshirt

freshmen for a significant number of snaps on that side of the ball.

"Three of the four playing in the secondary are freshmen, but it is what it is," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "They've got to grow up in a hurry."

"It's our job to get them better, and that's what we're going to do."

Barry Brown, filling in at placekicker for injured Brandon Wright, was good on his first career field attempt, booting a 40-yarder in the first quarter for the Panthers' first points.

WESTERN MICHIGAN 34, GEORGIA STATE 15

Georgia State lost 34-15 to Western Michigan at Georgia State Stadium.

Dan Ellington led the way for GSU (1-3), going 19-for-29 for 285 yards while also throwing an interception. He added 35 yards and two touchdowns on the ground, his second and third of the season.

Western Michigan (2-2) was anchored by its rushing attack, led by Jamauri Bogan and LeVante Bellamy. Bogan rushed for 126 yards, including a 71-yard touchdown run, and Bellamy ran for 121 yards. Quarterback Jon Wassnik went 20-for-25, for 234 yards and 3 touchdowns.

The stifling defense of Western Michigan forced three fumbles and picked off Ellington once, while the offense racked up a combined 528 yards on a shorthanded Georgia State defense.

After holding Western Michigan to a field goal on its opening drive, the Panthers answered quickly. Ellington scrambled for nine yards setting up an 11-yard pass over the middle to tight end Camrin Knight, leading to a 36-yard field goal by Barry Brown, tying the game 3-3.

The Panthers defense held strong for much of the second quarter, until Wassnik found Brett Borske over the middle for a 17-yard touchdown to cap a nine-play, 61-yard drive, putting Western Michigan back up 10-3.

Down 13-3 with just under three minutes remaining in the half after another WMU field goal, Ellington floated a pass to true freshman Destin Coates, who ran the ball 50 yards to the WMU 10. Ellington took it in himself on the next play, cutting the lead to 13-9 after a missed extra point.

But from there, the Broncos would go on to put up 21 unanswered points, beginning with a touchdown pass to Keishawn Watson in the closing seconds of the first half and capped off by back-to-back third quarter scores on a 40-yard pass to Jayden Reed and run by Bogan.

The Panthers would put points on the board one more time in the third quarter, on a drive kicked off by a 23-yard pass from Ellington to Penny Hart, who finished the day leading the team with five catches for 91 yards. He hit Hart again to bring the ball down to the WMU 33. After a short run by Ellington, he hit true freshman Cornelius McCoy for 13 yards down to the WMU 16. A 6-yard rush by Ellington and 8-yard rush from Coates put the ball in position for Ellington to punch it in himself.

McCoy finished with five catches for 80 yards, and Coates caught three passes for 62 yards while only carrying the ball four times for the Panthers.

"As you can see it was certainly not the day we had expected," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "When you come out and you have a loss 34-15 to Western Michigan and probably in every phase and every aspect of the game we had multiple issues as far as sloppiness – coming from our kicking game into our offense and to our defense it was kind of a day of 'what ifs.'"

"Defensively our strong suit, up until the last two weeks, has been to stop the run and have an ability to really shut down the running game," Elliott continued. "In the last two weeks there has been an inability to get a hat on the ball carrier, defend out

gaps, to make adjustments and go out and execute. And then we can't go out and fundamentally execute an extra point, then there's cause for serious concern.

"Ultimately here we are four games into it and the entire three phases need great improvement."

The Panthers continue to battle injuries, particularly in the defensive secondary, where Georgia State started two true freshmen in cornerback Quavian White and safety Jacorey Crawford, while redshirt freshman Jaylon Jones made his first start at cornerback.

Two more true freshmen saw their first action for Georgia State in receiver Sam Pinckney and special teams player Tucker Gregg, bringing to 12 the number of true freshmen to play in the first four games.

Punter Brandon Wright continues to be a bright spot for the Panthers; he averaged 52.0 yards on his three kicks.

GEORGIA STATE 46, ULM 14

Game 5: Sept. 29, 2018 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+)

Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

ATLANTA -- Georgia State defeated ULM 46-14 in a record-setting performance at as the Panthers recorded season highs for points and total offense (487 yards) while rushing for a school-record 308 yards in the their Sun Belt Conference opener.

Freshman Seth Paige led the way for GSU, rushing for 145 yards on just nine carries with two touchdowns, including an 82-yard touchdown run in the second quarter that is the longest run from scrimmage in school history. Paige, now just the second freshman in GSU history to rush for at least 100 yards in a game, ran for the most yards in a game by a GSU player since Donald Russell (201 vs. Rhode Island) in 2012 and the fourth-most overall.

Georgia State also set a new record for most team rushing yards with 308, with the help of eight different ball carriers. The previous record was 301 yards, set in 2011 vs. Campbell.

GSU's 46 points are the program's second-most points vs. an FBS opponent, just one point fewer than the Panthers' scored in last year's win at ULM, and third-most overall.

"We talk about doing things for the first time around here, and that what's great about this, we can do things for the very first time and be the change," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Most rushing yards in school history, longest run from scrimmage in school history, first punt return for a touchdown in school history. This was a very very good day for us. A very rewarding day."

Quarterback Dan Ellington was 15-for-18 with a completion percentage of .833, another school record. He threw the ball for 179 yards with a touchdown and rushed for 64 yards on 16 carries and a touchdown.

Georgia State's defense also turned in a strong performance, holding quarterback Caleb Evans, the Sun Belt's passing leader entering the day, to 136 yards and zero touchdowns. They also took the ball away four times, including two interceptions and two fumbles.

Sophomore outside linebacker Victor Heyward had an interception and a fumble recovery to lead a GSU defense that held the Warhawks to 262 yards of total offense, the fourth-lowest figure in school history. ULM managed just 43 total yards and one first down in the second half.

"It feels really good to come up here and have played the way we played in all three phases of our football game," Elliott continued. "It was a ULM team that had some momentum, they are really well coached, they have great skill players, a quarterback in Caleb Evans who is capable of doing something big."

The firsts continued on special teams as Penny Hart returned a punt for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, the first punt return for a touchdown in Georgia State's nine-year history.

Hart, with seven catches in the game, also passed Albert Wilson (175), for second in GSU history for career catches. Hart now has 177 career receptions, trailing only Robert Davis (222).

Paige's record-setting 82-yard run had also broke a record previously held by Wilson, an 80-yard touchdown run in 2013.

Georgia State scored touchdowns on its first four possessions of the game. The Panthers took the opening kickoff and drove 75 yards for a touchdown. On third-and-five at from the GSU 43, Ellington found true freshman Sam Pinckney for a 55-yard completion down the left sideline to the ULM 2. Two plays later, Ellington took it in from the 1-yard line for a 7-0 lead.

ULM's first possession ended with Heyward's interception at the GSU 40, and the Panthers

converted the turnover into a touchdown, this time a 23-yard scoring run by Tra Barnett, putting GSU up 14-0 midway through the first quarter.

After ULM got on the board on Evans' 21-yard touchdown run, the Panthers added two more touchdowns. First, tight end Roger Carter made a great one-handed catch, reaching behind to snag an underthrown pass and cross the goal line. After the defense forced a three-and-out, Paige's 82-yard touchdown came on the Panthers' next play and put GSU up 27-7 with 12 minutes to go in the second quarter.
