THE KICKOFF: Georgia State concludes the 2018 season by hosting in-state rival Georgia Southern on Senior Day at Georgia State Stadium, Saturday at 2 p.m.

- > The Panthers lead the series 3-1 and have won three in a row over Georgia Southern, including last year's 21-17 victory in Statesboro on Penny Hart's 9-yard touchdown catch with 2:31 to play.
- > Twelve Georgia State seniors will honored pregame before their final game for the Panthers.
- > GSU has already set school records with 1,963 yards and 21 touchdowns rushing. The Panthers are averaging a GSU-record 178.5 yards rushing per game, including 213.9 ypg in Sun Belt contests.
- > Punter Brandon Wright was named last week as one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter. He is the first Georgia State player to be a semifinalist for a major college football award.
- > Wright is third in FBS with an average of 48.5 yards per punt and third in net punting at 42.7.
- > QB Dan Ellington rushed for a career-high 113 yards at Appalachian State, the first GSU quarterback with a 100-yard game since Kelton Hill in 2011.
- > Ellington is third in the Sun Belt in passing (194.9 ypg) and total offense (254.2 ypg) while accounting for 15 touchdowns with just four interceptions.
- > Junior Penny Hart, a Preseason All-American, is GSU's leading receiver with 48 receptions for 660 yards and two touchdowns, along with 99.1 all-purpose yards per game. In 2017, Hart led the Sun Belt Conference in 2017 with a school-record 74 receptions for 1,121 yards and eight touchdowns.
- > Among all active FBS receivers, Hart ranks fourth in career receiving yards (2,941) and eighth in receptions (201).
- > With 2,941 receiving yards, Hart ranks fourth in Sun Belt Conference history. Next up is No. 3 Jerrel Jernigan of Troy (3,127).
- > With Hart at No. 4, Georgia State has two of the top four all-time receivers in Sun Belt

history. Former Panther Robert Davis (2013-16) ranks No. 2 with 3,391 receiving yards.

- > Also a dynamic weapon on special teams, Hart returned a punt 49 yards for a touchdown vs. ULM, the first punt return for touchdown in Georgia State history. He is averaging 19.9 yards per return and has set the GSU season record with 159 punt return yards...
- > One of just four FBS kickers who handles punting, placekicking and kickoffs, Wright also hit a 52-yard field goal last game at Appalachian State, the second-longest in school history.

THOMAS HONORED FOR CLASS-ROOM WORK: Defensive end Terry Thomas has been named to the Google Cloud Academic All-District® Football Team, selected by CoSIDA. The junior from McDonough, Ga., maintains a 3.49 GPA in biological science. He is enrolled in the Georgia State University Honors College.

> Thomas is Georgia State's 11th Academic Academic All-District selection in just nine seasons of football and seventh over the last four seasons:

Traylor recovered Wesley Fields' fumble with five minutes to play. Hart finished with eight catches for a school-record 191 yards.

> In 2016, in its last game at the Georgia Dome, Georgia State won its second straight in the series with a 30-24 win. Conner Manning passed for 318 yards and accounted for three touchdowns, and Glenn Smith scored touchdowns rushing and receiving. Manning hit eight of his first 10 passes to lead touchdown drives on the Panthers' first three possessions for a 20-0 lead.

> In 2015, Georgia State recorded a recordsetting and bowl-clinching 34-7 victory in Statesboro. The Panthers handed Georgia Southern their worst home loss ever as the GSU defense limited the Eagles to 135 yards rushing and a school-record 203 yards of total offense. After a 7-7 first half, the Panthers scored touchdowns on their first four possessions of the second half. Penny Hart had six catches for 119 yards, including a 63-yard touchdown. Glenn Smith rushed for 83 yards, and Kyler Neal ran for two touchdowns.

> GSU head coach Shawn Elliott is very familiar with Georgia Southern head coach Chad Lunsford. Lunsford spent two seasons (2001-02) as the tight ends coach at Appalachian State while Elliott was the offensive line coach.

> In two games against Georgia Southern, Penny Hart has totalled 14 receptions for 310 yards and two touchdowns.

RIVALRY SERIES: In-state and Sun Belt Conference rivals Georgia State and Georgia Southern compete in an annual all-sports challenge called the Rivalry Series.

Georgia State has captured all three Rivalry Series trophies, including a dominating 16.5-5.5 victory in 2017-18. The Panthers currently lead 4-2 in 2018-19.

GEORGIA STATE STADIUM

THE 2017 SEASON marked the inaugural year of "Pete" Petit (pronounced puh-TEET) Field at Georgia State Stadium, the former Turner Field and venue for the Atlanta Braves that was converted into the home of Panther football.

Georgia State Stadium features 25,000 seats, a FieldTurf playing surface, the Panthers' 7,500-square foot locker room, and a 5,600-square foot video board that is the eighth-largest in college football.

The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the baseball outfield.

Georgia State Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

Future phases of the redevelopment of this iconic property will include a new Georgia State baseball stadium, to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

snapper Seth-Patrick Holman, offensive lineman-tight end Lucas Johnson, running back DeMarcus Kirk, linebacker Warren McWilliams, linebacker Chase Middleton, guard Gabe Mobley, center Jamal Paxton, quarterback Jaquez Parks, linebacker Michael Shaw and linebacker Jalen Wade.

For Shaw, the season finale will be his 49th career game, tying him with four other players for the Georgia State record.

IN A RUSH: Georgia State has dramatically improved its running game this season:

- > GSU is averaging 178.5 yards rushing per game, more than 60 yards per game better than last season and ahead of the school record of 167.9, set in 2011 at the FCS level.
- > The Panthers' 21 rushing touchdowns are already a school record.
- > GSU is averaging 213.9 rushing yards in Sun Belt Conference games.
- > Over the last four games, the Panthers have rushed for 950 yards (237.5 ypg/6.1 ypc) and 10 TD.
- > The Panthers have recorded four of the top single-game rushing totals in school history this season, including a GSU-record 308 yards vs. ULM.
- > QB Dan Ellington leds the Panthers with 584 yards rushing, which is the fifth highest season total in GSU history. Tra Barnett's 551 yards in sixth best.

WRIGHT STUFF: Junior Brandon Wright, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, is third in the nation with an average of 48.5 yards per punt. Georgia State ranks third nationally with a net of 42.7.

- > Wright is the first GSU player to be a semifinalist for a nation award.
- > His 48.5-yard average is ahead of the Sun Belt Conference season record of 47.8, set by Idaho's Austin Rehkow in 2014.
- > Twenty-two of his 45 punts have travelled 50-plus yards, including six of 60-plus, and 20 have landed inside the 20.
- > He has twice been named to Ray's 8 by the Ray Guy Award, most recently after averaging 49.8 yards on five punts, including a 68-yarder out of his own end zone.
- > Wright's career punting average currently stands at 43.68, ahead of the school record of 42.84, held by current New Orleans Saints placekicker Wil Lutz.
- > Wright's career average ranks seventh among all active FBS punters.

- > He ranks second in GSU history to Matt Hubbard in career punts and punting yards, second to Wil Lutz with 20 field goals and fourth in career scoring with 114 points.
- > Last game against Appalachian State, Wright kicked a 52-yard field goal that is the second-longest in school history.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT:

Georgia State ranks among the national leaders with 19 scoring drives (14 TD/5 FG) of 10 plays or more, including four touchdown drives of at least 15 plays.

Conversely, the Panthers have eight touchdown drives of 90 seconds or less, including two one-play touchdown drives on long runs by Seth Paige (82 yards) and Tra Barnett (75).

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Seventeen true freshmen have seen action thus far, including running backs Seth Paige and Destin Coates, receivers Cornelius McCoy and Sam Pinckney, cornerbacks Quavian White and Tyler Gore, noseguard Akeem Smith, linebackers Blake Carroll and Jontrey Hunter, defensive end Tre Moore, safety Jacorey Crawford and special teams player Tucker Gregg. Five others have played in fewer than four games in running back Dawson Hill, tight end Herman McCray, outside linebacker T.J. Smith, safety Courtney Williams and offensive tackle Despelado Alexandre.

- > Freshmen have compiled a total of 57 starts in 11 games, including 28 by true freshmen and 29 by redshirt freshmen.
- > Five true freshmen (WR McCoy, RB Coates, CB White, S Crawford, WR Pinckney) and six redshirt freshmen (CB Jaylon Jones, OLB Jordan Strachan, S Chris Bacon, G Pat Bartlett, G-T Jalen Jackson, C Malik Sumter) have started games.
- > Due to injuries to starters Gabe Mobley and Jamal Paxton, the Panthers have started three redshirt freshmen on the offensive line with center Malik Sumter, RG Pat Bartlett and RT Jalen Jackson.
- > Eight of GSU's 13 offensive linemen are true (3) or redshirt (5) freshmen.

ALL THREE PHASES CONTRIBUTE TO RECORD-SETTING WIN: Georgia State set records and milestones on offense, defense and special teams in its 46-14 win over ULM.

- > The 46 points are Georgia State's secondmost vs. FBS opponent and third-most overall, and the 32-point margin is the Panthers' largest margin of victory vs. FBS opponent.
- > The Panthers rushed for a school-record 308 yards, including 145 by freshman Seth Paige, whose 82-yard TD is the longest run from scrimmage in GSU history.
- > QB Dan Ellington completed a school-record 83.3 percent (15-18) of his passes.
- > GSU set a school record with 38:12 of possession time.

- > The Panthers held ULM to 262 yards of total offense, the third-best defensive performance in school history.
- > GSU allowed just 43 total yards and one first down in the second half.
- > Penny Hart had the first punt return for a touchdown in Georgia State history with his 49-yard return in the fourth quarter.

BARNETT, PAIGE RUN INTO RECORD

BOOK: Running backs Tra Barnett and Seth Paige have etched record-breaking performances this season at Georgia State Stadium.

- > Barnett, a junior, rushed for 161 yards and two touchdowns on just 11 carries vs. Coastal Carolina. That is the second-highest singlegame rushing total in school history.
- > Barnett scored on runs of 42 and 75 yards, the latter the third-longest run in GSU history.
- > Paige, a true freshman, rushed for 145 yards and two touchdowns on just nine carries in the 46-14 win over ULM.
- > Paige's day was highlighted by an 82-yard touchdown that is the longest run and third-longest play from scrimmage in school history.

- > His 145 yards were the most for a Panther since Donald Russell in 2012 and now stand as the fifth-most ever.
- > Paige is just the second GSU freshman to top the 100-yard mark.

WEEKDAY GAMES: Georgia State played four non-Saturday games this season, including three Thursday contests. The Panthers opened with a Thurday night win over Kennesaw State at Georgia State Stadium. After falling at Memphis in a Friday night game, GSU played back-to-back Sun Belt Conference Thursday night games at Troy and at Arkansas State.

COMEBACK VICTORY: Georgia State scored a 24-20 comeback victory over Kennesaw State in his season opener as QB Dan Ellington hit Diondre Champaigne for an 8-yard touchdown pass with just 41 seconds left. Ellington drove the Panthers 73 yards on nine plays with no timeouts in the final two minutes, completing 5-of-8 passes for 55 yards to give the Panthers their first lead in the game.

Ellington also rallied GSU from a 14-0 deficit with two touchdowns passes in the final minute of the first half. First he connected with Penny Hart for a 3-yard touchdown 50 seconds left in the half, capping an 11-play, 68-yard drive.

After an interception gave GSU another possession, Ellington moved the Panthers 37 yards in 37 seconds, hitting Christian Owens with a 6-yard TD in the right corner of the end zone to tie the game.

The GSU defense made several key plays in the win. DeAndre Applin's interception and return to the KSU 37 set up the tying touchdown with three seconds left in the first half. In the second half, the defense held the Owls to two field goals after first downs at the GSU 19 and GSU 7, recovered a fumble at the GSU 15 and came up with a fourth down stop to give the Panthers the ball at the GSU 27 with 2:01 left to set up the winning score.

COUNSELOR MOBLEY: Senior offensive lineman Gabe Mobley is a second-year student in the highly-regarded Georgia State College of Law.

Mobley earned his undergraduate degree in history just three years and began law school in the fall of 2017.

On the field, Mobley is in his fourth year as a starter on the offensive line. After two years at center, he moved to right guard in 2017. He returned to the starting lineup against Louisiana after missing six games with a knee injury.

ON THE DEFENSIVE: The senior defensive trio of outside linebacker Michael Shaw, inside linebacker Chase Middleton and defensive end Marterious Allen are climbing the Panthers career charts.

Shaw is Georgia State's career leader in tackles for loss while ranking fourth in tackles.

PANTHER PROS: Despite Georgia State's brief history, five Panther alumni are active NFL players. A total of six former Panthers have played at least one game in the NFL.

- > A member of Georgia State's inaugural team in 2010, receiver Albert Wilson is in his fifth NFL season and first with the Miami Dolphins. He was an undrafted free agent in 2014, originally signing with Kansas City. Wilson was named AFC Offensive Player of the Week for Week 6.
- > Wil Lutz, GSU's placekicker from 2012-15, is now the kicker for the New Orleans Saints. Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens, he was picked up by the Saints just before the 2016 season. He was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for September.
- > Fifth-year offensive tackle Ulrick John moved this year to the New England Patriots, his fifth NFL team, but is on injured reserve. John was selected in the seventh round of the 2014 NFL Draft by Indianapolis.
- > After a record-setting career at Georgia State, wide receiver Robert Davis was selected by the Washington Redskins in the sixth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. He is on injured reserve for 2018.
- > Cornerback Chandon Sullivan, a senior on the 2017 Panthers, was promoted from the practice squad to the active roster for the Philadelphia Eagles and made his NFL debut Oct 28
- > Two other 2017 seniors-- defensive end Mackendy Cheridor (Atlanta Falcons) and cornerback B.J. Clay (Los Angeles Chargers)-were in NFL camps as undrafted free agents.
- > Two Panthers are active in the CFL. Defensive lineman Julien Laurent, a 2017 senior, was a first-round draft pick of the BC Lions. Quarterback Nick Arbuckle, GSU 2014-15, is the backup for the Calgary Stampeders, who will play for the Grey Cup.
- > GSU's first draft pick and first to appear in an NFL game was defensive tackle Christo Bilukidi in 2013. He played three seasons (2013-15) in the NFL with Oakland, Cincinnati and Baltimore.

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In 21 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 20 winning seasons and helped coach 17 teams to the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game.

Formerly the co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at South Carolina and a coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by President Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016.

And one year later, Elliott had not only guided Georgia State to its second bowl game with a trip to the AutoNation Cure Bowl, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky. That win gave the program a school-record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

Under Elliott's watch, the Panthers achieved benchmark performances on both sides of the ball. The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points per game allowed (24.75), and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4) and per attempt (4.13). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history while setting singlegame records for fewest rushing yards allowed (minus-2) and most sacks.

On offense, the Panthers established new marks for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Georgia State's individual efforts were also recognized as nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors, led by first-team selection Penny Hart. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Elliott took over a Georgia State program entering its eighth season of football but positioned for growth with the move into Georgia State Stadium, coupled with the university's continued rise in size and stature.

Before he even coached his first game at Georgia State, Elliott's impact on the program was immediately felt. On the recruiting trail, he and his staff quickly assembled an impressive 2017 recruiting class that was the most highly-regarded group of GSU signees to date. And in the classroom, his Panthers achieved an all-time high with a 3.03 grade-point average for the spring semester.

Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In

addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott served 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State. He was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

In 21 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been a part of 20 winning seasons and helped coach 17 teams to the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game, including 198.5 yards on the ground and 253.8 through the air.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State. Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients. Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10

NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from a car accident in 2000.

As a player, Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

- One of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award as the top punter in FBS. The first GSU player to be a semifinalist for a major college football award.
- Career punting average of 43.7 is now ahead of the school record of 42.84 by current New Orleans Saints kicker Wil Lutz and ranks seventh among active FBS punters.
- Ranks second in school history in career punts, punting yards and field goals (20).
- Fourth in GSU history in career scoring with 114 points.
- Was limited on placements and kickoffs earlier in the season due to injury.

2018 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Third in the nation with an average of 48.5 yards per punt, helping GSU rank third nationally in net punting at 42.7.
- Twice been named to Ray's 8 as a nominee for FBS punter of the week.
- One of just four kickers in FBS who handles all three phases: punting, placekicks and kickoffs.
- 22 of his 45 punts have travelled 50-plus yards, including six 60-plus punts, and 20 have gone inside the 20-yard line.
- In season-opening win over Kennesaw State, he punted four times for a 53.8 average, hit a 35-yard field and all three PATs and put four of his five kickoffs for touchbacks.
- Booted field goals of 42 and 35 yards while downing all three punts inside the 20 in win over ULM.
- Hit field goals from 32 and 28 yards vs. Troy.
- Averaged 49.8 yards on five punts vs. Louisiana, including a 68-yard blast from the end zone, despite a high snap. That is the fourth-longest punt in GSU history.
- Kicked a 52-yard field goal at Appalachian State that is the secondlongest FG in school history.

- Took over kickoff duties for the final four games and had 14 touchbacks on 20 kickoffs.
- Set school records with four field goals and 15 points by kicking in 33-30 win at Texas State. Had two 48-yarders--then his career longand also hit from 22 and 29 yards. Also had six touchbacks on eight kickoffs and punted three times for a 46.3-yard average, including a 66-yarder.

- Nailed a career-long 50-yard field goal vs. Appalachian State, equaling the second-longest field goal in school history.
- Booted two field goals, including a 46-yarder, and a 71-yard punt (third-longest in school history) that was downed at the 8-yard line in win at ULM.

- Averaged 46.6 yards on seven punts at Appalachian State, including one that went out of bounds at the 1-yard line.
- Made three clutch plays in win over Georgia Southern. Called upon as a placekicker for the first time, he booted an extra point and a 27-yard field goal. With time running down, he had a 49-yard punt to the 13yard line with 1:14 left.

GEORGIA STATE 24, KENNESAW STATE 20

Game 1: Aug. 30, 2018 • 7 p.m. (ESPN+) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State kicked off the 2018 season in dramatic fashion, defeating Kennesaw State 24-20 on Dan Ellington's 8-yard touchdown pass to Diondre Champaigne with 41 seconds left in front of 23,088 fans Thursday night at "Pete" Petit Field at Georgia State Stadium.

"I looked up there with two minutes to go and there were a lot of people that left that stadium and missed on heck of a finish," GSU head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Going into this contest I knew it'd be a fight, I knew it'd be everything it was. I knew it was going to be a dog fight.

"All I know is we stand here 1-0, and that's a lot better than where we were a year ago."

Ellington, the junior college transfer playing his first game for the Panthers, hit on 20-for-28 passes for 187 yards and three touchdowns while also running for 77 yards on 18 attempts. Christian Owens had six catches for 70 yards and a touchdown and Penny Hart caught five for 46 yards and a score

The Panthers (1-0) rallied from a 14-0 first-half deficit with two touchdowns in the final minute of the first half and then had to rally again in the fourth quarter after falling behind 20-14.

The GSU defense set up the winning touchdown with a fourth-down stop that gave the Panthers the ball at their own 27 with 2:01 left.

Ellington hit Hart twice to start the drive before hitting Owens for an 18-yard pass up the right sideline and down to the KSU 21. After a pass interference penalty gave GSU a first down at the 11, Ellington ran three yards on first down and then found Champaigne, another junior college transfer, on a fade to the back corner of the end zone to give the Panthers their first lead.

Kennesaw State (0-1) jumped a 14-0 lead before Georgia State got on the scoreboard. After forcing a punt down 14-0 late in the second quarter, Ellington hit Hart over the middle for 18 yards to the GSU 46 before finding Owens on the sideline for nine yards and a first down at the KSU 43. On second down, Ellington just barely avoided a sack before breaking a 19-yard run, including a nifty spin move, giving the Panthers a first down at the KSU 20.

On second-and-goal at the three, Hart took a shovel pass from Ellington on a jet sweep and raced around the right end for a touchdown, cutting the KSU lead to 14-7 with just 50 seconds remaining in the half.

For Hart, the Preseason All-American, he pulled in career touchdown catch number 18, moving him into sole possession of second place in GSU history. The junior from Roswell, Ga., has caught at least one pass in 28 straight games.

On KSU's first play after the touchdown, safety DeAndre Applin picked off Chandler Burks over the middle and returned it to the KSU 37. Ellington completed passes to Owens and Taz Bateman before a pass interference penalty put the ball at the 16. After a short pass over the middle to Bateman, the Panthers faced second-and-goal at the six with just eight seconds left on the clock. Ellington found Owens, the South Carolina transfer, in the corner of the end zone to tie the game at 14 heading into the half.

The Panthers' bend-but-don't-break defense forced two field goals after consecutive long drives by the Owls to keep the game within reach heading into the fourth quarter trailing 20-14.

Georgia State pulled to within three after a 35-yard field goal Brandon Wright set up by a KSU fumble caused by Terry Thomas and recovered by Jordan Strachan.

"I can't say enough about the way our football team finished," Elliott said. "To have an opportunity to go down there and take the lead and win that football game with that last-second pass, it was really a testament of how they fought and how they never give up."

NC STATE 41, GEORGIA STATE 7

Game 2: Sept. 8, 2018 • 12:30 p.m. (RSN) Carter-Finley Stadium • Raleigh, N.C.

Georgia State fell 41-7 at NC State at Carter-Finley Stadium.

GSU (1-1) quarterback Dan Ellington passed for 194 yards on 15 completions, and freshman Destin Coates rushed for 43 and a touchdown to lead the Panthers.

NC State (2-0) quarterback Ryan Finley was outstanding, going 30-for-38 for 370 yards and

two touchdowns. Georgia State held the Wolfpack to 115 yards rushing, but NC State managed three touchdowns on the ground.

The Panthers jumped in front with a touchdown on their first possession and trailed 20-7 at the half. Georgia State had opportunities to pull closer but failed to capitalize due to two missed field goals and a touchdown that was nullified by an offensive pass interference penalty.

"You go into the halftime down 13, but it could have easily been a doggone seven-point ballgame," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Then in the fourth quarter, the game got a little bit away from us. They've got a little more depth at some positions.

"We saw a lot good things, we saw a lot of bad things. We've got an important game next week against Memphis, so we've got to go regroup."

Junior Devin Gentry was the Panthers' leading receiver in the game with five receptions for 83 yards. Penny Hart added three catches for 53 yards, extending his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 29, every game he has played.

Ellington gained 41yards rushing but three sacks brought his net down to 30 yards

Defensively, one of the bright spots for Georgia State was true freshman cornerback Quavian White, who intercepted Finley at the goal line in the fourth quarter. Redshirt freshmen safeties Jaylon Jones and Chris Bacon each forced fumbles, while senior Chase Middleton finished with a game-high 12 tackles.

Georgia State marched down the field on its opening possession as Ellington drove the Panthers 75 yards on six plays for a touchdown. He connected with Devin Gentry for a 46-yard completion down the right sideline to the 8. Two plays later, freshman Destin Coates took a pitch from Ellington and scampered into the end zone for the 8-yard touchdown and a 7-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

The Wolfpack answered with a 57-yard touchdown drive, capped by Finley's 5-yard touchdown to Thayer Thomas that tied the game at 7-all with 9:32 to play in the first quarter.

NC State added a 25-yard field goal by Christopher Dunn on its next possession and then took a 17-7 lead with an 80-yard touchdown drive with 10:41 left in the second quarter.

The Panthers had an opportunity to cut into the lead but missed a 44-yard field with 46 seconds left in the first half. That proved to be a six-point swing because NC State managed to move in position for a 28-yard field goal on the final play of the half to take a 20-7 lead into the locker room.

MEMPHIS 59, GEORGIA STATE 22

Georgia State fell 59-22 at Memphis in a Friday night game at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Playing without four starters in the secondary, the Panthers struggled defensively as Memphis quarterback Brady White threw five touchdown passes and Darrell Henderson rushed for 233 yards and two scores.

Georgia State (1-2) quarterback Dan Ellington, from nearby Olive Branch, Miss., passed for 107 yards and scored his first rushing touchdown on a 1-yard run early in the second quarter. That capped a 12-play, 70-yard drive and pulled the Panthers within 21-10, but Memphis (2-1) responded with two touchdowns and a field goal to take a 38-10 halftime lead.

True freshmen running backs Destin Coates and Seth Paige combined for 103 yards on 19 carries, including Paige's 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. Backup quarterback Aaron Winchester added 37 yards rushing.

Redshirt freshman Jaylon Jones grabbed his first interception near the goal line and returned it for a 1-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Another freshman, Cornelius McCoy, was the Panthers' leading receiver with five catches for 43 yards, while Penny Hart had four receptions for 35 yards.

Starting safeties DeAndre Applin and Remy Lazarus both missed the game due to injuries, as did junior cornerback Cedric Stone, and senior Jerome Smith was injured early in the game. With the defense depleted by injuries, the Panthers played seven true freshmen and four redshirt freshmen for a significant number of snaps on that side of the ball.

"Three of the four playing in the secondary are freshmen, but it is what it is," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "They've got to grow up in a hurry.

"It's our job to get them better, and that's what we're going to do."

Barry Brown, filling in at placekicker for injured Brandon Wright, was good on his first career field attempt, booting a 40-yarder in the first quarter for the Panthers' first points.

WESTERN MICHIGAN 34, GEORGIA STATE 15

Game 4: Sept. 22, 2018 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State lost 34-15 to Western Michigan at Georgia State Stadium.

Dan Ellington led the way for GSU (1-3), going 19-for-29 for 285 yards while also throwing an interception. He added 35 yards and two touchdowns on the ground, his second and third of the season.

Western Michigan (2-2) was anchored by its rushing attack, led by Jamauri Bogan and LeVante Bellamy. Bogan rushed for 126 yards, including a 71-yard touchdown run, and Bellamy ran for 121 yards. Quarterback Jon Wassnik went 20-for-25, for 234 yards and 3 touchdowns.

The stifling defense of Western Michigan forced three fumbles and picked off Ellington once, while the offense racked up a combined 528 yards on a shorthanded Georgia State defense.

After holding Western Michigan to a field goal on its opening drive, the Panthers answered quickly. Ellington scrambled for nine yards setting up an 11-yard pass over the middle to tight end Camrin Knight, leading to a 36-yard field goal by Barry Brown, tying the game 3-3.

The Panthers defense held strong for much of the second quarter, until Wassnik found Brett Borske over the middle for a 17-yard touchdown to cap a nine-play, 61-yard drive, putting Western Michigan back up 10-3.

Down 13-3 with just under three minutes remaining in the half after another WMU field goal, Ellington floated a pass to true freshman Destin Coates, who ran the ball 50 yards to the WMU 10. Ellington took it in himself on the next play, cutting the lead to 13-9 after a missed extra point.

But from there, the Broncos would go on to put up 21 unanswered points, beginning with a touchdown pass to Keishawn Watson in the closing seconds of the first half and capped off by back-to-back third quarter scores on a 40-yard pass to Jayden Reed and run by Bogan.

The Panthers would put points on the board one more time in the third quarter, on a drive kicked off by a 23-yard pass from Ellington to Penny Hart, who finished the day leading the team with five catches for 91 yards. He hit Hart again to bring the ball down to the WMU 33. After a short run by Ellington, he hit true freshman Cornelius McCoy for 13 yards down to the WMU 16. A 6-yard rush by Ellington and 8-yard rush from Coates put the ball in position for Ellington to punch it in himself.

McCoy finished with five catches for 80 yards, and Coates caught three passes for 62 yards while only carrying the ball four times for the Panthers.

"As you can see it was certainly not the day we had expected," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "When you come out and you have a loss 34-15 to Western Michigan and probably in every phase and every aspect of the game we had multiple issues as far as sloppiness – coming from our kicking game into our offense and to our defense it was kind of a day of 'what ifs.'

"Defensively our strong suit, up until the last two weeks, has been to stop the run and have an ability to really shut down the running game," Elliott continued. "In the last two weeks there has been an inability to get a hat on the ball carrier, defend out gaps, to make adjustments and go out and execute. And then we can't go out and fundamentally execute an extra point, then there's cause for serious concern."

The Panthers continue to battle injuries, particularly in the defensive secondary, where Georgia State started two true freshmen in cornerback Quavian White and safety Jacorey Crawford, while redshirt freshman Jaylon Jones

made his first start at cornerback.

Two more true freshmen saw their first action for Georgia State in receiver Sam Pinckney and special teams player Tucker Gregg, bringing to 12 the number of true freshmen to play in the first four games.

Punter Brandon Wright continues to be a bright spot for the Panthers; he averaged 52.0 yards on his three kicks.

GEORGIA STATE 46, ULM 14

Game 5: Sept. 29, 2018 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

ATLANTA -- Georgia State defeated ULM 46-14 in a record-setting performance at as the Panthers recorded season highs for points and total offense (487 yards) while rushing for a school-record 308 yards in the their Sun Belt Conference opener.

Freshman Seth Paige led the way for GSU, rushing for 145 yards on just nine carries with two touchdowns, including an 82-yard touchdown run in the second quarter that is the longest run from scrimmage in school history. Paige, now just the second freshman in GSU history to rush for at least 100 yards in a game, ran for the most yards in a game by a GSU player since Donald Russell (201 vs. Rhode Island) in 2012 and the fourth-most overall.

Georgia State also set a new record for most team rushing yards with 308, with the help of eight different ball carries. The previous record was 301 yards, set in 2011 vs. Campbell.

GSU's 46 points are the program's second-most points vs. an FBS opponent, just one point fewer than the Panthers' scored in last year's win at ULM, and third-most overall.

"We talk about doing things for the first time around here, and that what's great about this, we can do things for the very first time and be the change," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Most rushing yards in school history, longest run from scrimmage in school history, first punt return for a touchdown in school history. This was a very very good day for us. A very rewarding day."

Quarterback Dan Ellington was 15-for-18 with a completion percentage of .833, another school record. He threw the ball for 179 yards with a touchdown and rushed for 64 yards on 16 carries and a touchdown.

Georgia State's defense also turned in a strong performance, holding quarterback Caleb Evans, the Sun Belt's passing leader entering the day, to 136 yards and zero touchdowns. They also took the ball away four times, including two interceptions and two fumbles.

Sophomore outside linebacker Victor Heyward had an interception and a fumble recovery to lead a GSU defense that held the Warhawks to 262 yards of total offense, the fourth-lowest figure in school history. ULM managed just 43 total yards and one first down in the second half.

"It feels really good to come up here and have played the way we played in all three phases of our football game," Elliott continued. "It was a ULM team that had some momentum, they are really well coached, they have great skill players, a quarterback in Caleb Evans who is capable of doing something big."

The firsts continued on special teams as Penny Hart returned a punt for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, the first punt return for a touchdown in Georgia State's nine-year history.

Hart, with seven catches in the game, also passed Albert Wilson (175), for second in GSU history for career catches. Hart now has 177 career receptions, trailing only Robert Davis (222).

Paige's record-setting 82-yard run had also broke a record previously held by Wilson, an 80-yard touchdown run in 2013.

Georgia State scored touchdowns on its first four possessions of the game. The Panthers took the opening kickoff and drove 75 yards for a touchdown. On third-and-five at from the GSU 43, Ellington found true freshman Sam Pinckney for a 55-yard completion down the left sideline to the ULM 2. Two plays later, Ellington took it in from the 1-yard line for a 7-0 lead.

ULM's first possession ended with Heyward's interception at the GSU 40, and the Panthers converted the turnover into a touchdown, this time a 23-yard scoring run by Tra Barnett, putting GSU up 14-0 midway through the first quarter.

After ULM got on the board on Evans' 21-yard touchdown run, the Panthers added two more touchdowns. First, tight end Roger Carter made a great one-handed catch, reaching behind to snag an underthrown pass and cross the goal line. After the defense forced a three-and-out, Paige's 82-yard touchdown came on the Panthers' next play and

put GSU up 27-7 with 12 minutes to go in the second quarter.

Georgia State fell 37-20 at Troy in a Thursday night Sun Belt Conference game at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

GSU quarterback Dan Ellington completed 20-of-36 passes for 272 yards and one touchdown

while rushing for 59 yards.

Penny Hart had his best game of the season with six catches for 128 yards, the 10th 100-yard game of his career. Running back Tra Barnett and receiver Christian Owens scored touchdowns for the Panthers, and Brandon Wright booted two field goals.

Troy used big plays to win its fifth straight game as starting quarterback Kaleb Barker had a 75-yard run to set up a score and then a 50-yard touchdown pass on the Trojans first two drives.

Barker finished with 136 yards passing and two touchdowns and 111 yards rushing before leaving the game, and B.J. Smith rushed for 140 yards and two touchdowns for the Trojans.

After Troy scored on its opening possession, Georgia State looked to respond, driving to the Troy 32, where the Panthers faced 4th-and-6. Ellington completed a 19-yard pass to freshman Cornelius McCoy for a first down, but Troy's Tyler Murray knocked the ball out with a big hit and the Trojans recovered at the 10.

"We kept fighting," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We took a lot of blows in the first half. The first two drives they had big-yardage plays and scored both drives. Then we take our first possession down to, what, the 12-yard line and we fumbled. That really took the wind out of our sails."

Midway through the second quarter, with the Panthers trailing 21-0, junior defensive end Terry Thomas and sophomore noseguard Dontae Wilson combined for a fourth-down stop inside the 1-yard line. One play earlier, senior linebacker Chase Middleton had a stop on third down.

"Our defense recovered a little bit late in the first half, and then we stopped them on four straight possessions," Elliott said. "We had that goal-line stand and I thought we'd come out in the second half and have a chance to get back in it, but we couldn't do anything offensively to start the half. We just ran out of time, but we certainly fought."

The Panthers finally got on the scoreboard late in the first half on Brandon Wright's 32-yard field goal with 14 seconds left in the half. Wright added another field goal, this one from 28 yards, to make the score 23-6 with six minutes to play in the third quarter.

On Troy's next drive, freshman cornerback Tyler Gore came up with an interception on ball that was bobbled by the receiver and scooped up by Gore just shy of the goal line.

The Panthers took over and Ellington immediately hit Hart for 51 yards down the left sideline. But the drive ended with a fumble at the Troy 39-yard line.

Georgia State put together a 10-play, 75-yard drive, capped by Barnett's 1-yard touchdown to make the score 30-12 with six minutes to play.

Ellington added a 21-yard touchdown pass to Owens, who also caught the two-point conversion with two minutes left.

Georgia State fell 51-35 at Arkansas State in a Sun Belt Conference Thursday night game at Centennial Bank Stadium.

GSU quarterback Dan Ellington passed for 250 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for 52 yards, but the Panthers (2-5, 1-2 Sun Belt) hurt themselves with two crucial fumbles, including one that was returned for a touchdown.

Junior Diondre Champaigne caught two touchdown passes, while sophomore Tamir Jones and freshman Cornelius McCoy also had touchdown receptions.

Jones also caught a 54-yard pass from Ellington and recorded a career-high 95 yards receiving on his three catches.

Junior running back Tra Barnett rushed for 61 yards on 13 carries, including a 12-yard touchdown run.

After Arkansas State drove for a touchdown on its opening possession, the Panthers answered with Ellington's 36-yard touchdown pass to Jones, whose first career touchdown tied the game at 7-all midway through the first quarter. But the Red Wolves' Warrren Wand returned the ensuing kickoff 91 yards to set up Hansen's 8-yard scoring run.

The Panthers' then fumbled on back-to-back possessions to allow Arkansas State to take a 34-7 lead at the half.

"Turnovers killed us in the first half. We gave up a [91-yard] kickoff return, a fumble return for a touchdown ... things like that, I don't care what level you play at, you can't do those things. It was a disappointing first half. We came out and fought in the second half and put up some points offensively, but all in all, certainly not a good effort.

"I like the way they kept fighting to the last doggone snap, but we've got to get better in a lot of areas. I want to see us come out and practice well. I want to think about what we've got to do in practice and our preparation to get better."

In the third quarter, Ellington connected with McCoy for a 37-yard touchdown, followed by Barnett's scoring run.

Then Champaigne caught his two touchdowns in the fourth quarter with a 20-yard pass from Ellington and then a 3-yard grab from backup quarterback Aaron Winchester.

With 54 yards receiving, Penny Hart raised his career total to 2,734 yards to move into the Top Five in Sun Belt Conference history for career receiving yards.

Arkansas State quarterback Justice Hansen, the Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year, accounted for three touchdowns through the air and two on the ground. He passed for 257 yards and rushed for 76. Marcel Murray added 115 yards rushing and one touchdown for the Red Wolves.

COASTAL CAR. 37, GEORGIA STATE 34

Game 8: Oct. 27, 2018 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State rallied from an early 17-0 deficit but came up just short at the end, dropping a 37-34 Homecoming thriller against Coastal Carolina at "Pete" Petit Field at Georgia State Stadium.

Tra Barnett led the way for the Panthers (2-6, 1-3 Sun Belt), rushing for a career-high 161 yards and two touchdowns, the second most rushing yards in a game in Georgia State history. Penny Hart caught six passes for 118 yards and a touchdown. It was Hart's 11th career 100-yard game, moving him into fourth place in Sun Belt Conference history in career receiving yards.

Dan Ellington went 14-for-25 for 231 yards and one passing touchdown as the Panthers piled up 511 yards on 59 plays, averaging 8.5 yards per play.

CJ Marble rushed for 128 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries for Coastal Carolina (5-3, 2-2 Sun Belt).

The Chanticleers took a 3-point lead on a 23-yard field goal with three minutes to play. Georgia State drove into Coastal Carolina territory, but on 4th-and-6 from the CCU 36, Ellington just missed connecting with Hart down the right sideline to end the game.

"You guys have watched Penny Hart play. He is everything you want in a football player," GSU head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It went off his fingertips today. And you've got to lift a young man like that up, because he's putting everything on his shoulders right now thinking that it was all him. And it's not even close.

"The way we come down and have a chance to win that football game with the last throw – you'll write Georgia State is 2-6, but there's a lot of things we take out of a tough game," Elliott continued. "It's certainly a disappointing defeat because when you look at the stats, we had 59 plays for 521 yards - you would've thought we had a pretty good day. But it turned out we came out on the wrong end and Coastal Carolina made the plays when they needed to, and we couldn't get them off the field."

After falling behind 17-0 early, Ellington found Hart on a slant over the middle for a touchdown, cutting the Chanticleers' lead to 17-7 with two minutes to play in the first quarter.

A field goal by Coastal Carolina put them up 20-7 before Seth Paige punched the ball in from the 1-yard line to cap a 15-play, 71-yard drive and cut the Chanticleers' lead to seven at the end of the first half.

Georgia State tied the game on Barnett's 75-yard touchdown run on the first play of the second half. The run was the third longest in Georgia State history.

After the Panthers' defense forced a punt, Georgia State took its first lead of the game, 27-20, on a 42-yard touchdown run by Ellington, who rushed for 70 yards on nine carries.

But on Coastal Carolina's next possession, Ky-Jon Tyler ran for a 28-yard touchdown to tie the game back up at 27-27.

Georgia State's next offensive drive was cut short by a fumble, but the defense took the ball right back on a fumble forced by Marterious Allen and recovered by Ed Curney. The big play on defense led to another one on offense, a 42-yard touchdown run by Barnett, his second of the game, to put the Panthers back in the lead 34-27 after three quarters.

The back-and-forth battle continued as Coastal Carolina tied the game 34-34 on a 3-yard touchdown run by Alex James with 9:46 remaining in the fourth quarter.

A 48-yard pass to Marable landed Coastal Carolina back in scoring position, but a strong defensive red zone stand by Georgia State held the Chanticleers to a field goal and a three point lead, 37-34, with 2:54 left in the fourth quarter.

"The disappointment alone is probably the number one lesson that we're going to learn from this because we see a lot of guys in that locker room that have extreme care for playing this game and playing for this team," Elliott said. "There's a lot of hurt in the locker room. There's a lot of hurt in me sitting right here.

"It's a tough game. Every single day there's a winner and there's a loser, that's just how it is. Unfortunately, we came out on the wrong end today"

With his 118 receiving yards today, Hart raised his career total to 2,852 yards, passing current NFL player J.D. McKissic from Arkansas State to move into fourth place in Sun Belt history. Along with Hart's former teammate Robert Davis, the current Washington Redskins receiver who was in attendance today and had 3,391 career receiving yards for the Panthers, Georgia State boasts two of the top four receivers in Sun Belt history.

Hart's 36-yard touchdown is No. 20 of his career, including 19 receiving touchdowns.

Barnett's 161-yard day, which came on just 11 carries, has been bettered only by Donald Russell's school-record of 201 yards vs. Rhode Island in 2012.

Ellington rushed for 60 yards, and freshman Seth Paige added 79 yards for a team output of 280 yards, the third-best total in school history. The Panthers' 511 yards of total offense also ranks in the top 10 in GSU annals.

TEXAS STATE 40, GEORGIA STATE 31

Game 9: Nov. 3, 2018 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+) Georgia State Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Despite a late scoring rally, Georgia State fell 40-31 to Texas State at Georgia State Stadium.

Tra Barnett rushed for 85 yards on 16 carries with two touchdowns for Georgia State (2-7, 1-4 Sun Belt). He has scored all seven of his touchdowns this season in the team's last five games. GSU quarterback Dan Ellington rushed for a careerhigh 89 yards along with 112 yards passing before leaving the game with an injury late in the third quarter.

Aaron Winchester, who finished the game for Ellington, went 10-for-18 with 112 yards passing and two touchdowns, one through the air and one on the ground.

Quarterback Willie Jones III turned in a strong performance for Texas State (3-6, 1-4 Sun Belt) with 325 yards on 21-for-26 passing and three touchdowns including one rushing score.

"Certainly wasn't the day we wanted," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "The game really got out of hand on the first and second series of the second half. We didn't really have an answer defensively. Overall offensively we were able to move the ball somewhat, but it definitely wasn't enough.

"A lot of change has to happen, from a personnel standpoint, from a scheme standpoint, from a lot of standpoints.

"You stay motivated because you want to become a better man, a better player and a better team," Elliott continued. "The next game is another opportunity to grow up and get better. There's another four or five days of practice and another competition to go out there and play."

Georgia State started well as Barnett capped off a nine play, 75-yard drive with a 29-yard touchdown run. Jones answered quickly for Texas State its first possession with a 48-yard touchdown run, but a blocked extra point by Javonte Lain kept the Panthers in the lead, 7-6. The Bobcats scored again on their next offensive possession, a 2-yard touchdown run by Anthony D. Taylor, to go up 13-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Penny Hart helped put Georgia State back in scoring position late in the second quarter with an explosive 48-yard punt return, setting up a 27-yard field goal by Brandon Wright to pull the Panthers back to within three, 13-10 heading into halftime.

But the Bobcats started the second half by scoring 20 unanswered points to ultimately put the game out of reach for the Panthers. Georgia State scored three times in the fourth quarter to tighten the deficit, starting with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Winchester to Devin Gentry. Barnett scored his second touchdown of the game on a four-yard run with just under five minutes remaining in the game before Winchester's touchdown run as time expired.

The Panthers finished with 221 yards rushing, giving them 501 yards on the ground over the last two games.

Tight end Roger Carter led the receiving corps with four catches for 47 yards, while Hart added four receptions for 31 yards.

Lain, the sophomore defensive end, blocked two kicks in the game, adding a second-quarter field goal attempt to his first-quarter blocked PAT.

Punter Brandon Wright continued his strong season, averaging 44.8 yards on four punts along with his 27-yard field goal.

LOUISIANA 36, GEORGIA STATE 22

Game 10: Nov. 10, 2018 • 5 p.m. ET (ESPN+) Cajun Field • Lafayette, La.

Playing without starting quarterback Dan Ellington, Georgia State fell to 36-22 at Louisiana.

Georgia State (2-8, 1-5 Sun Belt) trailed just 16-14 entering the fourth quarter before the Louisiana (5-5, 3-3 Sun Belt) scored 20 straight points to put the game out of reach.

"We couldn't slow their backs down," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We have a lot of fight in us. There's a lot of doggone heart out there and a lot of effort, but we've got to find some solutions. A couple of drives we'd like to have back and contain that running back a little bit."

Elliington, the Panthers' leading passer and rusher, sat out the game after spending much of the week in concussion protocol. Aaron Winchester went 10-of-21 for 121 yards through the air, while also rushing 14 times for 51 yards and a fourth quarter touchdown.

Tra Barnett led the Panthers on the ground with 82 yards on 15 touches, while Demarcus Kirk added 79 yards on nine rushes. Cornelius McCoy led Georgia State with a pair of catches for 60 yards.

Trailing 13-0, Georgia State got on the scoreboard late in the first half as Winchester directed a 10-play, 92-yard drive that lasted more than five minutes. Winchester hit McCoy for 45 yards and a first down at the Louisiana 40, then on 4 th-and-4, he again connected with the freshman McCoy for 15 yards to the 19.

The Panthers faced another fourth down with less than a minute to play in the half. It appeared GSU would settle for a field goal, but after a timeout, Winchester found Gentry in the corner of the end zone for the 13-yard touchdown to pull the Panthers within 13-7 just 14 seconds before the intermission

After allowing a Louisiana field goal in the third quarter, Georgia State answered with another long touchdown drive, keyed by Kirk. The senior running back had runs of 12 and 13 yards, and then finished the drive with a 21-yard touchdown run to pull the Panthers within 16-14 with 1:46 to play in the third quarter.

Kirk's 79 yards are his highest total since setting his career high of 85 yards, also against Louisiana in 2015. The Panthers finished with 252 yards rushing, giving them a total of 753 yards over the last three games.

"I'm pleased with the running game," Elliott said.
"You see some great runs out there, like DeMarcus
Kirk laying it on the line and doing the things
necessary to be successful. I'm really proud of him."

A late interception thrown by Winchester is the first interception thrown by either GSU quarterback in more than five games, a span of 181 consecutive pass attempts.

Raymond Calais led Louisiana with 13 rushes for 186 yards, while Elijah Mitchell added 136 yards rushing on 19 carries. The Ragin Cajuns finished the day with 355 rushing yards, but 223 of those yards came on six carries as the Panthers continue to struggle to contain big plays.

APP STATE 45, GEORGIA STATE 17

Game 11: Nov. 17, 2018 • 2:30 p.m. ET (ESPN+) Kidd Brewer Stadium • Boone, N.C.

Despite a career-high 113 yards rushing by quarterback Dan Ellington, Georgia State fell to Appalachian State 45-17 on Saturday afternoon at Kidd-Brewer Stadium.

Ellington is the first Georgia State (2-9, 1-6 Sun Belt) quarterback to rush for 100 yards since Kelton Hill in 2011. After missing last week's game due to an injury, Ellington finished 10-for-21 for 132 yards and a touchdown.

"Dan wants every inch of this football field," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "He goes out there and tries to make it happen on every play. I'm just proud to have that young man on our football team."

Appalachian State (8-2, 6-1 Sun Belt) was led by quarterback Zac Thomas who went 20-for-24 for 282 yards and three touchdowns through the air. He also rushed seven times for 27 yards and a touchdown.

Brandon Wright, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter, also showed off his kicking ability with a 52-yard field goal, just one yard shy of Wil Lutz's school-record boot of 53 yards vs. Alabama in 2013.

With 197 yards rushing today, the Panthers surpassed the Georgia State season record for rushing yards with one game to play. GSU now has 1,963 yards on the year, bettering the mark of 1,847 yards set in 2011.

In addition to Ellington's yards, true freshman Tucker Gregg provided a spark with 43 yards on just four carries. Senior DeMarcus Kirk scored on a 3-yard run.

Georgia State got off to a good start as Ellington directed a 10-play, 75-yard scoring drive on the Panthers' first possession, capping it with a 7-yard touchdown pass to Tamir Jones.

The Mountaineers answered with touchdowns on their first two possessions before the GSU defense stiffened and allowed just a field goal with 11 seconds left in the first half as App State took a 17-7 lead into the locker room. After App State drove for a touchdown to open the second half, the Mountaineers then returned an interception for a touchdown to go ahead 31-7.

"You can't doubt their effort," Elliott said. "We had our opportunties offensively in the first half to put it in and the defensive rose up, but we had back-to-back bad possessions to start the third quarter and it kind of steamrolled. It was uncharacteristic for us to throw that interception for a touchdown, but this team continues to fight."

Ellington's third quarter interception was his first since Game 4 vs. Western Michigan, ending a string of 149 passes without an interception, the second-longest streak in school history. The record is 202 by Drew Little in the 2010 inaugural season.

With his first catch of the game, Penny Hart reached the 200 career catch milestone. The junior ranks second in GSU history and seventh in Sun Belt annals with 201 career receptions.

"There's a lot of upside with this group and a lot of positive things to point to," Elliott said after returning to his alma mater as a head coach for the first time. "We've got to grow, we've to develop, we've got to coach better and we need to have some better play, but we need to understand we're all in this together. We'll keep our heads held high and move forward."
